

Greetings! Happy Advent! The third candle on the Advent Wreath is lit, and we are called to reflect on JOY.

Happiness is an emotion while joy is a disposition. We, as faithful Catholics, receive JOY as a gift, and yet, we also need to choose joy. When my grandma passed away, I inherited all of her books. I was intrigued by the ones written by Henri Nouwen, a very faithful Catholic priest. They were some of her favorites so I thought I would find a way to be connected to her through the wisdom written in these books. Nouwen is one of those people in my life who has taught me so much about how to live a life filled with joy from reading his books. Something that he wrote that may also stand out to you is the following: "Joy is the experience of knowing that you are unconditionally loved and that nothing-sickness, failure, emotional distress, oppression, war, or even death—can take that love away... . . . Joy does not simply happen to us. We have to choose joy and keep choosing it every day" (Nouwen).

When I lost my grandma suddenly, it rattled my family and I greatly. We weren't prepared to lose our family's matriarch. I deeply desired JOY during a time where I felt such deep sadness and confusion. Being the book lover (and religious one) in the family, I inherited my grandma's books. It was through Nouwen's great wisdom on life and God's plan for us that I began to grow in my understanding of joy. Through a very roundabout way. I learned so much more about my Grandma Joy and the joy she had in this life. I am so thankful for the love of my grandma and the legacy of faith that she paved for me.

We had our K-8 Christmas Prayer Service this past Wednesday. Thank you to all of the students, catechists, volunteers, and pizza makers! What a prayerful and joyful night it was!

I hope and pray that all of you experience the joy of Christmas as we continue to prepare this Advent.
