




As St. Paul's letter to the Corinthians illustrates (our second reading on Pentecost Sunday): For in one Spirit we were all baptized

Kids were not in 20 different activities because they simply were not offered. Family vacations were generally taken in the car somewhere during the summer months. There were beach days and drive in movies and grilling and neighborhood games just to name a few things. I miss my childhood days and used to do as many of those things with my kids as I could. Not sure if they have been to a drive-in movie though.

Now many families lives are filled with two working parents, many softball or baseball games, then school football and other practices begin early in August and before you know it you tried to squeeze in some family summer activities but time is short and then gone all together. I would much rather see families not have to fight to have family time.

My family business of a golf course will keep me occupied for the summer, but I still am here too. I have already been working on plans for the next year. I will need volunteers and especially Catechists for the upcoming year. Presently it will be for 3rd and 5th in the afternoon and one class opening in the evening. 


