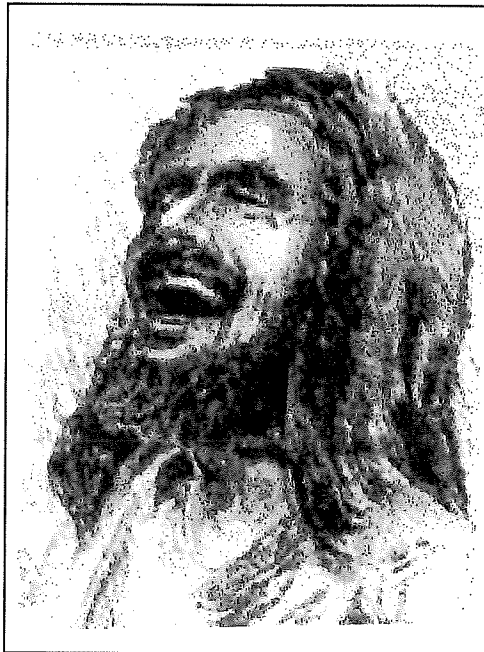
"Like a welcome summer rain, humor may suddenly cleanse and cool the earth, the air and you." (Langston Hughes, poet)

Though my memory deceives me at times I still remember the phone call in mid morning twenty some years ago. An elderly woman's voice on the other line requesting to see me about something she apparently felt was important. Since she lived down the block from our rectory at Immaculate Conception parish in Sioux City, Sr. Cora arrived within ten minutes or less. (Retired from active ministry, Sr. Cora still desired to stay in the neighborhood of the parish helping out in any manner she could.) She was holding a framed picture at her side when she began to explain that which was causing her distress. Apparently she kept an image of Jesus on her wall that came into conflict with the other sisters' beliefs. Not an 'earth shattering' disagreement but one causing

her some stress and some lingering doubts



within her sincere faith. Sr. Cora then showed me the framed picture: a pencil sketch of Jesus laughing. Because they believed such an image was disrespectful of our Savior's integrity, the other sisters asked her to rethink hanging

up in public view such a drawing. Sr. Cora felt the image gave her a closer identity with Christ Jesus, allowing her faith to be more personal and alive with a God who could identify with all our human emotions and characteristics. Understanding her perspective and yet the faith and goodwill of the other sisters within the convent, I reflected upon my own faith and understanding of God's grace threaded throughout our days and our various human emotions. Sr. Cora's gentle spirit remained adamant about the dignity of the depiction of Jesus laughing while maintaining a respect for her fellow sisters in the convent who disagreed with her perspective.

Walking up to twenty miles a day, sometimes alone and often with fellow disciples

or curious villagers, Jesus retained human qualities. As he talked assuredly about faith and his relationship with his Father in heaven, Jesus could share a smile or a laugh about something within nature they encountered, a humorous perspective about one of life's moments. In other words, while retaining his divinity, he could be fully human sharing the emotion of laughter as easily as that of sadness such as the tears shed at the sight of his friend Lazarus lying in a state of death. Is it possible the scripture passage used often at funeral liturgies is describing the emotion of humor as an instrument of healing as we faced down the difficulties and burdens of life. Then Jesus said, "Come to me, all of you who are weary and carry

heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. . . . and the burden I give you is light." (MT 11:28,30) Though we dare not sidestep the seriousness of life, we must balance it with "light" in the form of humor, of a gentle smile, and acceptance of our imperfections and follies. Such is healing.

With the recent death of Tim Conway whose humor poked fun of our human characteristics within a spirit of decency, I think of his words as he approached 'old age:' "I spend a lot of time thinking of the Hereafter - each time I enter a room I wonder what I'm here after." He had the gift of humor drawing a smile out of us, in light of our inadequacies, our 'pica dillies', and our very human stumblings. Such is the 'light' or lightness Christ Jesus desires for each of us within

those all too serious moments of life where personal doubts and anguish begin to take hold. As a humble professional and simple Christian he would remind himself of his burgeoning frailty with the advancement of age: "My career is pretty much over. I'm out in the Valley eating soft-boiled eggs." Sr. Cora gave me that sketch of Jesus laughing, wanting someone to enjoy such an image while avoiding any friction within her own household. She gave me much more: a living faith and relationship with God whose Son purposely experienced all our human emotions, abilities and follies—trying to point us toward the light. It was discussed and agreed that from now on no motions to give money to any group be done unless that group is not present or represented at the meeting. These motions should be made after the group is not present.

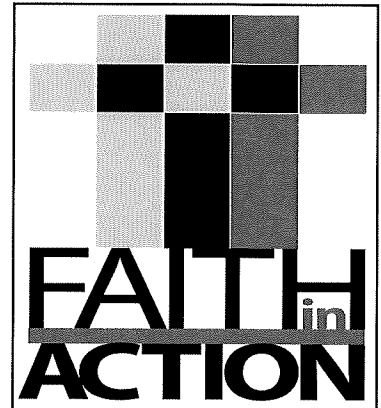

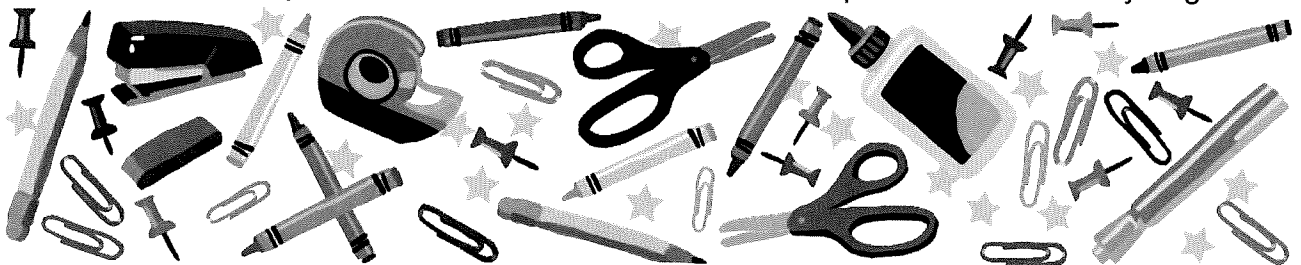

p.m. for K-6 and 7 p.m. for 7-12 grades. Family Formation will be offered as an alternative for families who would prefer to teach their own children at home using approved parish materials. This program requires a once a month meeting at church, weekly lessons at home, regular church attendance and dedication. I will have more information on this program during the early registration weekend.

This month I am looking for people willing to teach our children. I have openings in the afternoon and evening. A religious education program is wonderful to have, but it takes volunteers willing to give some of their time weekly for it. In addition I am looking for anyone who would like to take a turn with our youngest learners for Children's Liturgy on Sunday mornings during the 10 a.m. Mass. This 20 minute lesson is fully prepared and ready for the volunteer. We use a rotating system so you are only on once every 4-5 weeks. Please consider helping where you can. A Catechist in-service will take place on Wednesday August 28.

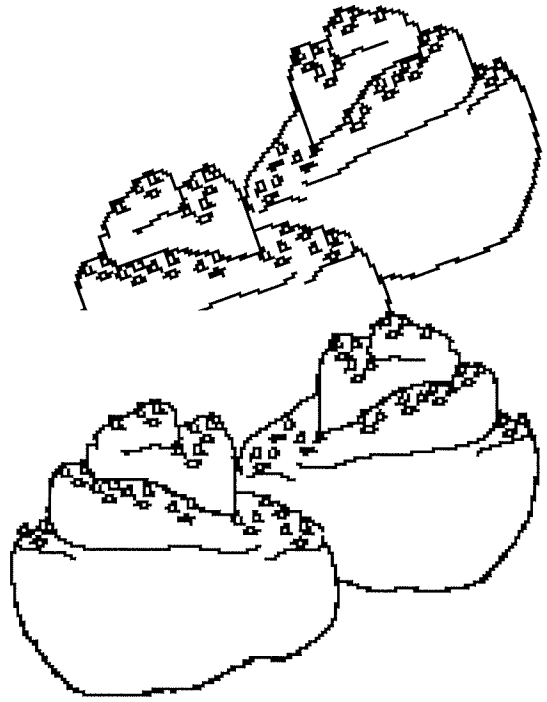

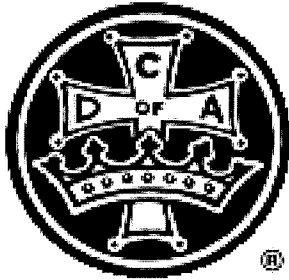

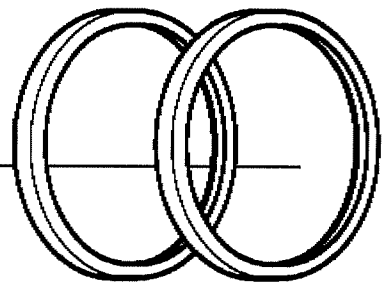
