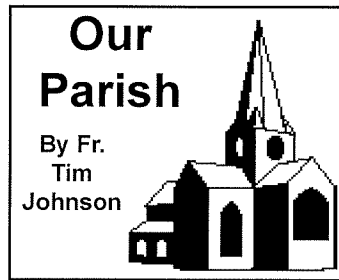

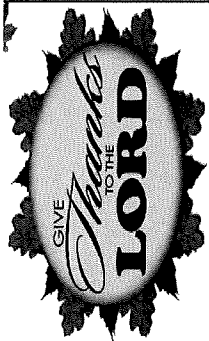

Voices who inspire hope within our struggles, achievements, doubts and courage—essentially conveying the message of hope God gave each human life: "and know that I am with you always until the end of time."

In this month of Remembrance I share a brief excerpt from "My Grandfather's Blessings" by Dr. Rachel Naomi Remen. She describes an intimate moment, as a child, with her grandfather. One afternoon when he was very sick, my grandfather spoke to me about death and told me he was dying. "What does this mean, Grandpa?" I asked, worried and anxious. "I will be going somewhere else, my grandchild. Closer to God." I was struck dumb. "Will I be able to visit you there?" I said, filled with distress. "No," he told me, "but I will watch over you and I will bless those who bless you." Almost fifty-five years have passed, and my life has been blessed by a great many people since then.

Aging has a way of giving us pause to remember, to listen to the lives of those who have died—to the wisdom of the saints—attempting to believe in something greater within and before us, a hope that cannot be extinguished. As Election Day passes, the chill sets in, and daylight decreases, the poetic words of Emily Dickinson seem apropos:

"Hope is the thing with feathers

That perches in the soul

And sings the tune without the words

And never stops at all."

Upon our beloved dead whose voices resonate in our hearts a message of hope we can and will explore within ourselves as God intends within the grace of his ongoing creation: "Eternal rest grant unto them O Lord. May they Rest In Peace."

Gracious God, help me remember, living or deceased, the people to whom I owe so much. Amen.

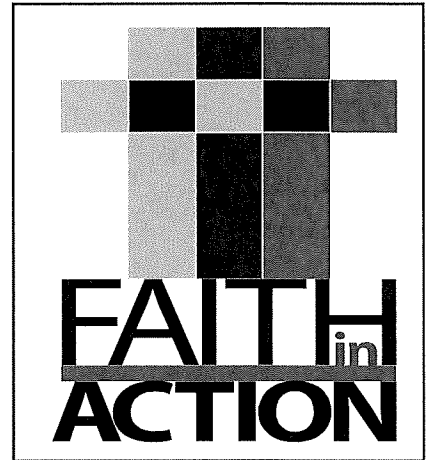

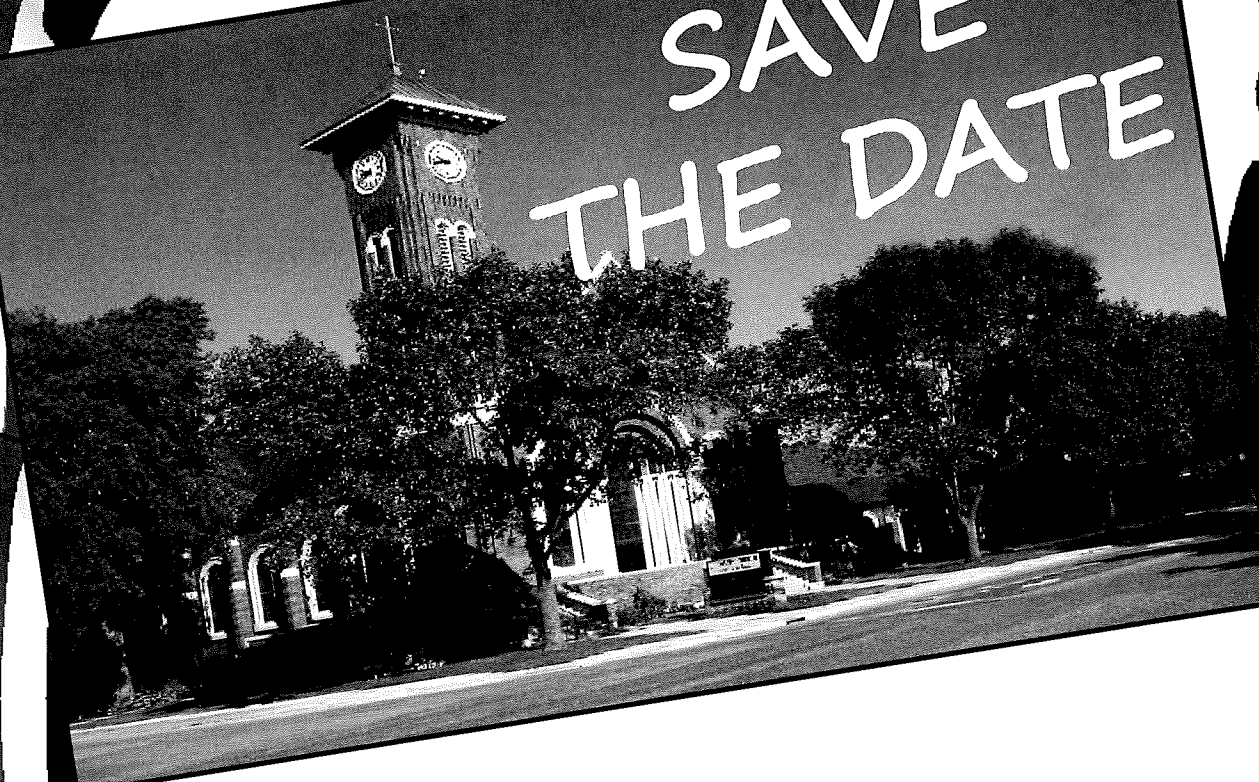

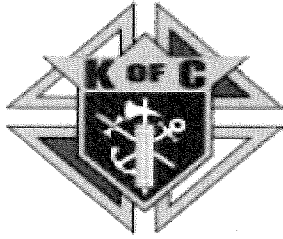

We are committed to ushering 4:30 p.m. mass on Saturdays and the 8:00 a.m. mass on Sundays. Wearing your blue KC shirts is optional.

Lecturer's message: Mick Baack lead us in prayer and scripture reading along with questions and discussion.

Chaplain's message: Fr. Tim thanked the council for their commitment to ushering the two weekend masses indicating how that ministry positively affects all along with the music, servers, lectors and Eucharistic ministers involvement.

Financial Secretary Report: GK Brad said there are 121 active members, recruiting goal is 6. Bills include a disaster relief donation of \$1,000.00, a Birthright donation of \$500.00 and a Farner Bocken bill \$303.00. Motion bills was made by Dale Hanna with a second by Duane Schnetter. All ayes. Carried.

Treasurer's Report: GK Brad presented the treasurer's report. The checking account balance was \$14,913.74 with debits of \$2,556.07 and credits of \$2,231.39 The ending balance is \$14,589.06. There is petty cash of \$24.00. Jack Yore won \$10.00 in the 8/26/2020 drawing.

Old Business:
