

> share in the music lifting up our prayers, to graciousreceive ly Communion without judgment, and in turn to generously share our resources of presence. of caring, of graciously



For those who belong to our parish, those who return every summer and those who simply happen across our parish and the Eucharist, may the Christian character of our parish always reflect a



We have always been required by the IRS to not accept contributions after Dec. 31 but we have given parishioners the benefit of the doubt.





Connie S. moved and Connie B. seconded that we send a \$300 gift card to a significant volunteer within the parish. All ayes.




