Finance Council

The St. Joseph Finance Council met Thursday, Dec. 16, 2021, in the Saint Rita Conference Room. Fr. Hughes called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m. and led the group in prayer. The following were in attendance: Lay Director Doug Heller, Council Members Connie Jones, Jim Baumgard and Julie Fairchild and Financial Secretary Susan Reiser. Absent and excused were Lay Director Chris Stein, and members Tony Peschong, Steve Anderson and Chad Harms. Financial reports, including the balance sheet, the profit and loss statement and the budget vs. actual statement, were reviewed.

Second Collection

Discussion on the splitting of the summer second collection was held. It was the consensus of those in attendance that \$4,000 be placed in a special fund for a future cemetery project with the balance, \$9,086.14, be given to the Social Justice Committee. It was decided that a second collection would be taken the first weekend of the month for Social Justice work.

Personnel Manual

Fr. Hughes asked that a committee be formed to review the current St. Joseph Personnel manual and make updates as necessary. Connie Jones volunteered to chair this committee. At least one additional committee member will be asked to assist.

Parking Lot

Fr. Hughes suggested that the Finance Council begin thinking about a parking lot project in light of the city's plans to reconstruct 13th St. A decision needs to be made whether the project includes asphalt or cement.

Memorial and Estate Gifts

Fr. Hughes briefly described the difference between memorial and estate gifts given to St. Joseph. Use of memorial gifts are usually at the discretion of the priest and family and are gathered at the time of a person's death. Estate gifts, on the other hand, become an asset of the parish to which the Finance Council is responsible for its use, usually with family input.

Mass Times

Fr. Hughes asked Finance Council members to evaluate the current mass schedule. After review of the current winter and summer schedule, it was decided that the mass times should remain as is.

School Feasibility Study

Fr. Hughes said that after the school feasibility study has been completed, it has been determined that there is not enough support at this time to proceed with a new Catholic school. Fr. Hughes will be releasing more detailed information in the weeks ahead.

New Sign

Fr. Hughes reported that our current outdoor sign is not working. After checking with Roling Signs, it seems the software and sign is outdated. After discussion and review of proposals, those in attendance agreed to purchase a new 63.5 by 85 inch sign with full color at a cost of \$27,879. Because this is over the \$20,000 purchase limit, a resolution will need to be prepared and approved by the Diocese prior to purchase.

Technology Position

Fr. Hughes presented information regarding the possible hiring of a technology company to oversee technology needs at St. Joseph including the web page and computer security. Fr. plans to consult with additional Finance Council members before a decision is made.

Roof Damage

Fr. Hughes reported that the wind storm Tuesday evening, Dec. 14 damaged the church roof. The insurance company has been notified. Staff will call the roofing company for repair.

Baumgard moved with a second by Jones to adjourn the meeting at 8:15 p.m.


Together In Faith


St. Joseph Social Justice Committee

The St. Joseph Social Justice Committee met Wednesday, November 3, 2021. The meeting was called to order at approximately 8:10 a.m. by Father Brian Hughes. Present were Fr. Brian Hughes, Fr. Tom Flanagan, Merlin Wuebker, Bernie Kramer, Connie Stein, Bob Moore, Dennis Lippon, Kathy Christensen, Lois Koelder and Connie Bjornstad. Fr. Brian led the opening prayer.

The agenda was reviewed and hearing no additions, the agenda was adopted as printed with Fr. Brian changing the order of the discussion items.

Fr. Brian advised the committee that there has been an increase of individuals coming to the church requesting assistance for rent, utility bills, gas for cars and groceries. There is also an increased number of visitors to the St. Joseph clothing room. Also, discussed were the November food pantry and the handling of

cash donations received for this project.



At this time, Fr. Brian departed for another meeting.

Koelder assumed the duties of Chair.

Minutes – A motion was made by Bernie Kramer and was seconded by Connie Stein to approve the minutes of the September 1, 2021 meeting. Hearing no further discussion, the motion was put to vote with all present voting aye. Motion carried.

Financials – Koelder gave the report on the current financials ending October 31, 2021 which included discussion on budget items for the remaining fiscal year. A motion was made by Bob Moore and seconded by Merlin Wuebker to approve the financial statements as of October 31, 2021. Hearing no further discussion, the motion was put to vote with all present voting aye. Motion carried.

Old Business

Naming of Officers – This item was acted upon earlier at the beginning of the meeting.

Payments approved at the September 1, 2021, Meeting – Payments passed at the September 1, 2021 meeting were reviewed along with a request for a payment for Focus Campus Ministries from the July 14, 2021 meeting. It was noted that two September items passed, Catholic Relief Services for use in Haiti and the Okoboji Youth Football donation along with the July item for Focus Campus Ministries have not yet been paid. Koelder will request payment from the Business Office for the payments to be made for Catholic Relief Services and for Focus Campus Ministries. Because the youth football season is now completed, Fr. Tom made a motion to amend the payment to include the Okoboji Youth Basketball program with the amount donated not to exceed \$300. The motion was seconded by Connie Stein. Calling for further discussion and hearing none, the motion was put to the vote with all present voting aye. Motion carried.

Proposed donations for Fiscal Year 2021-22 – The proposed donations for this fiscal year were discussed with no formal action taken. A motion was made by Fr. Tom and seconded by Lippon to amend the Policies and Procedures to allow for email meetings to pass emergency financial donations. After further discussion, the motion was put to vote with all present voting aye. Motion carried.

4th Weekend of the Month Collection – Koelder advised the board that she had discussed reinstating the 4th Weekend of the Month Collection with Fr. Hughes. Connie Stein moved and was seconded by Kathy Christensen to formally request Fr. Hughes to reinstate the 4th Weekend of the Month Collection which would be designated for Social Justice needs. Following discussion, the motion was put to vote with all present voting aye. Motion carried.

New Business

Request from Fr. Flanagan for reimbursement for postage of \$67 – Koelder advised the Committee that this had been paid to Fr. Tom. Discussion was had on the cost of mailing rosaries to Africa, India and other countries who have requested them. It was the consensus of the committee to continue to support this worthwhile project per the approval granted at a previous meeting.

Thanksgiving Dinner Sponsorship – Discussion was had on the annual St. Joseph Thanksgiving dinner and the Social Justice Committee's role in the project. Bob Moore moved and was

seconded by Kathy Christensen to continue the Social Justice Committee sponsorship of the annual St. Joseph Thanksgiving dinner. Hearing no further discussion, the motion was put to vote with all present voting aye. Motion carried.

Adoption of Mission – This item was tabled. Preapproval of Food Cards Purchased – This item was discussed earlier by Fr. Brian and it was noted that Fr. Brian already has pre-approval to purchase food and gas cards as needed. No further action was needed on this item.
