
One Pastor Two Parishes

As many of you know, early July will bring some changes to the parishes of Dickinson County. This July will be bringing changes to many parishes in northwest Iowa. Our demographics are changing and communities and parishes

are shifting. While Dickinson County is a growing place, we must also adapt so that our Bishop can address all of the counties of Northwest Iowa. There have been many questions and lots of speculation about how things will look

in the months and years to come. I hope that as time goes on, we will together explore new ways of celebrating and building our faith lives here in Dickinson County. It might be helpful for me to dispel some of the inevitable rumors and doubts.

While I am to be the pastor of both St. Mary's and St. Joseph's I will depend greatly on the staff that we have in place in both parish-



es. There may be some shifting and realignment of duties but we will need the wisdom and insights of the good folks who



have been serving us in both parishes. It will be important for the leader-ship committees of both parishes to sit down and examine how we can work together to build up the Dickinson County Catholic Community. 15 years before I arrived in my most recent assign-

ment in Boone County there had been four priests working there in three parishes. When I arrived there three years ago I was the pastor of three parishes and the sole priest in the county. We worked hard together to share programs and social outreach, coordinate schedules and share

staff. In three years' time, with the hard work of a wonderful staff. able we were to make areat progress that strengthened and deepened the faith of all. We can do the same good work here. Communication and trust will be important. We must not be ter-

ritorial or defensive. God lives among His people and we must do all that we can to uncover his glorified face living among us.

I have no intention to diminish the unique qualities of both our two parishes. Our dif-

ferences and our traditions can actually strengthen the bonds of charity and joy that unite us in our Catholic faith. While we will have the chance to share joint programs and ministries, I have not come here to meld these two parishes into one mega-parish. We will maintain many of our traditions and customs in each parish. We will not be melding bank accounts or property ownership but we will be jointly supporting some shared expenses like shared staff, clergy salaries and health care. We have been sharing programs and staff here for many years and we hope to continue and deepen those shared traditions. We have decided to drop St. Joseph's summer only 6:00PM Saturday evening Mass for lack of attendance. The remainder of the summer schedule observed in both parishes will remain as in the past. Once fall arrives, we hope to be able to return to our regular Sunday Mass schedule and spend the fall months doing a careful study of our post-Covid (we pray) Mass attendance. Maintaining the summer Mass schedule with one pastor will be made possible with the kind assistance of Fr. Tom Flanagan, our former St. Joseph's pastor who continues to live with us here. We hope that Fr. Tom will be living in the Spirit Lake rectory while I will live here in Milford. We will have some other weekend help during the summer weeks after early July. Fr. Tom and I hope to settle into a regular rhythm of rotation between both parishes once the moves are complete on the 7th of July.

New things can often be difficult. Sometimes new clothes are scratchy and new shoes can cause blisters so some discomfort is to be expected but this transition is about our faith, out belief that God lives here among us and that the Risen Jesus can be seen in our neighbors. This is not a time of worry and certainly not a time to criticize or gossip. This is a time of planning and adventure ... a time to build bridges and dream new dreams. Let us help each other to set a future for our children and grandchildren that is as brave and dedicated as the wonderful parishes that we inherited from those who came before us.

As I take over the two Parishes of this county, I am conscious of the great priests that came to labor here before me. In St. Joseph Parish Hall, there is a long photo gallery of the priests who have served this parish in the past. Some of the recent pastors have been great friends of mine, some I know only by name and there are a number who stare out at me that I do not know and have not heard of. The very first picture is of Father John Joseph Smith and early pioneer priest of Northwest Iowa. He baptized both my grandparents at Assumption Church in Emmetsburg in 1880. His parish stretched from Emmetsburg well into Minnesota in the north and west into South Dakota. In 1872 he served as the pastor of 11 parishes and dozens of mission stations that stretched from east of Algona to Rock Valley. Among his many parishes were both Milford and Spirit Lake in Dickinson County. He covered his broad territory on horseback and worked tirelessly to bring the faith to Catholics living in a huge territory. He often slept out in the open and traveled along narrow ruts and trails. Fr. Smith's brave leadership and undaunted courage are a great model for me. I do not plan to travel on horseback and I will not be cooking my dinner along the road but I will be trusting in the same Lord that guided Fr. Smith in his work. I look forward to the next years here, I also look back to what has come before us. We must not be tentative or naïve about the challenges that are ahead. We must be creative and dedicated but above all we must be a people of faith who celebrate our Catholic traditions both in Church and in our homes. Our Catholic faith is a living breathing thing. We must never waver from the task of building up the body of Christ at every turn along the wonderous path of grace.

Building and Grounds Committee Meeting

The St. Joseph Building and Grounds Committee met Mon., March 18, 2021, 2 p.m. in the St. Rita Conference Room. In attendance were Pam Fisher, Jim Sporrer, Dea Reiser, Chris Stein, Irene McCoy, Bill Aumer, Fr. Brian Hughes and Susan Reiser. Member Deb Travis was absent and excused.

Fr. Hughes reviewed several areas of the facility that needs attention:

- ✓ Downspouts to the north. Water runs into the parking lot and freezes.
- ✓ 3 garbage bin area. Do we need fencing there to curb garbage dumping by others?
- Fence to the west to stop persons from driving across our parking lot, over our curb and gutter and into their property. A bid for a black fence, like the one on the north side of the playground, was discussed. Dean Reiser suggested trying a rock fence first to see if it would discourage the drivers.
- Doors on the church. Fr. Hughes said he would like to investigate the cost of new doors for the front of church to be more in line with the original architecture of the church.
- Stained glass windows. Fr. Hughes would like staff to check for the amount of the insured cost of the present stained glass windows.
- Confessional. Fr. Hughes believes an attractive counter with drawers would clean-up the Reconciliation Chapel.
- Pews: Three pews were recently moved back in church on the north side. Three additional pews and a privacy rail are missing. If anyone knows the whereabouts of these items, please call the parish center.
- Rectory Roof. It has been noted that the rectory roof needs to be replaced. Dean Reiser will ask for a bid on a good quality asphalt shingle and report back.
- Church Roof Damage: Shortly after the last snow/ice store, it was noted that some tiles are missing from the church roof to the north of the steeple. Staff will contact the insurance company and repair company.
- Flashing and Facia on Bell Tower. Fr. Hughes reported that some paint is missing and one light on the cross is burnt out. The cross also needs to be reguilded. Fr. will get bids from the appropriate companies and report back.
- Emerald ash boar Staff will check with the tree company to see if and when this treat ment should be completed.
- Locking system. Fr. Hughes would like to rekey the entire facility to limit the number of keys staff are required to carry and to tighten up security for extra keys that have been given out in the past.

After the facility tour by the Building and Grounds, the following was found:

- ▼ The ceiling on the southeast corner of the church needs repair.
- ▼ The overhang north of the dumpsters is coming loose from the I-beam.
- ✓ . There is a crack on the north side of the altar which will be monitored.

The meeting adjourned at 3:30 p.m.






