

Each time I look upon our congregations summer and see our many guests I am deeply moved by the many families who have made Mass attendance a

priority for their families. Away from home and out of their usual routine, hundreds of families come to join us in our prayer. This act of family worship is not just impressive, it is spiritually uplifting for all of us who gaze upon the habit of faith of so many families. Many

summer weekends we have nearly 1500 folks attending our four Masses and sometimes we must crowd folks in. If we look at those many families as fellow pilgrims who are journeying with us toward the Kingdom

God, we can see their presence with us in a whole new way. Our Catholic Church family is a wide and deep community of faith and the devotion and the faith-based discipline of our guests can strengthen the bonds that untie us a Church. God is glorified in our full Masses.




Thank you to those who have stepped forward to teach this year. We will recognize them on Catechetical Sunday on
