School has begun and so do the new school routines. We too, will embark on the religious education routine starting this weekend with registration. Forms are printed for those families who have had children registered before. I ask that you check them over and update them as necessary. For the fees, we take cash or credit/debit cards. If you are new to the parish or have a kindergartener, I will have blank forms ready. It is nice to make the face-to-face contact with the parents. As the year gets busy we do not always have that benefit. I will also have handbooks ready with the calendar and rules for children in our program.

Thank you to those who have stepped forward to teach this year. We will recognize them on Catechetical Sunday on Sept. 19th. Our classes begin on Wednesday Sept. 8th with K-5 after school and 6-12 beginning at 7 pm. If you know of a family with a new child to be enrolled, please pass the word to them about our classes. I am seeking a few older people who might be willing to share an hour or so of their time on Wednesday afternoons for watching a couple of little people so their mom can teach. I will have a playroom set up for them. Having 3-4 people to do this on a rotating basis would be very helpful.

If this works out, we may extend this care for an evening Bible school in the future. Some people are not comfortable teaching but might be comfortable watching other people's kids for a short time. We hope some of you will be willing to help with this.

If your family has any needs in the way of missed Sacraments for your children or has another need do not be afraid to ask. We are here to help you be Catholic. There is the RCIA program for those who want to learn more about the Catholic church or want to become Catholic as adults. This will begin in the early fall. Please call Susan or me to register. This program meets once a week on Tuesday evening as Wednesdays are already full. I am looking forward to getting the year underway.
