Darwin Messerly, 52, of Boone, has joined the staff as a Deacon.


Born and raised in Fort Dodge, he is a 1987 graduate of St. Edmunds School. After


## Together In Faith



Again this year we will offer a delivery service. Persons residing within the Milford city limits can order a Harvest Dinner meal to be delivered to their home.






