

Together Let Us Pray for Peace

On Sunday of this week the Holy Father asked Catholics in all parts of the world to spend some time this week in prayer for peace in Eastern Europe. Here at St. Joseph's and at St. Mary's we offered the morning Masses for that intention.

The situation between The Russian Federation and Ukraine has become very tense and world politicians are working hard to diffuse the rising conflict. The history of that region of the world is complicated and as US citizens it is incumbent upon all of us to study the situation with some care. I do not want to oversimplify things but it appears that as Democratic principles have been enshrined in Ukraine its people are looking to western Europe and beyond for moral, economic and cultural support. Growing ties with the west have made some in the Russian government and President Putin of Russia uncomfortable. Putin has demanded that the NATO alliance. of which our nation is a part, not move to allow Ukraine to join NATO. The 30 nation NATO alliance believes that



every nation should be free to chart the course of their own political future. The threat of war is real and the countries of Eastern Europe could easily become a battleground with violence that has not been seen since the end of World War II. This is a frightening moment for millions of Europeans. There is a lot at stake for a whole group of countries that stretch from Estonia in the north to Bulgaria in the south. Already Russian Federathe tion has taken control of the Crimea region of Ukraine and has virtually complete control of the Republic of Georgia along the Black Sea.

These countries and regions seem far away and out-of-reach but if war breaks out it will have a deep impact upon the entire region and that tension will reach our shores as we try and protect the interests and democratic principles of our European allies. Pope Francis is urgently begging all Catholics to pray for peace and encouraged political leaders to search for peaceful resolutions to these tensions before any armed conflict can erupt. Please join Pope Francis in the days and weeks ahead to ask the Holy Spirit to move the hearts of all to peace.


Opening Prayer from the Mass for the Preservation of Peace







Together In Faith

We are moving right along into the month of February. A month filled with thoughts of love and friendship as we celebrate Valentines Day. That is not how we start out though.

In our faith, February begins with the Presentation of the Lord. This feast on the 2nd, celebrates the time when Mary and Joseph presented their Son to be consecrated to God, forty days after his birth. As their first-born male, it was Jewish tradition to acknowledge that He belongs to God. It was also tradition to give an offering and they offered two turtle doves. At the same time Simeon and Anna were in the temple. Both were elderly prophets and had been promised by God that they would get to see the Savior. Promise fulfilled. There was




the public acknowledgement of the specialness of Jesus. Simeon called Jesus the "light of revelation" so this is also the celebration of light or "Candlemas day" A day when blessed candles are available to people to use in their homes this coming year. This celebration dates way back to the fourth century.

It is nice to think about this instead of just Groundhog Day on the 2nd which is kind of a silly folklore about the weather but fun none the less. Following the 2nd is another tradition of our faith and that is the Feast of St. Blaise. St. Blaise was a physician turned Bishop who saved a boy from choking on a fishbone. He was well thought of but would not renounce his faith so was put to death. He is invoked for diseases of the throat. He is one of our fourteen Holy Helpers and parishes still practice the Blessing of Throats by using two crossed candles and saying a specific blessing. All of my life I have had this blessing and this year will be no exception. Fr. Hughes and/or Deacon Darwin will offer this blessing to our students on Wednesday, Feb. 2nd during classes. Again, traditions play a large role in our faith.

By mid-February, we will be getting close to Valentines Day so a couple weeks prior to that our students will be using their best skills to craft Valentines for our nursing home residents and home bound. This is a day they enjoy and one that our elderly appreciate. I have lots of craft supplies for this event.

Ash Wednesday is also approaching so we will celebrate our faith and all the fine things we have by celebrating Mardi Gras with our evening students on Feb. 16th. This is also known as Fat Tuesday and is traditionally held the Tuesday right before Ash Wednes-



day. I do not have that luxury so mine is a little earlier. Due to weather and CO-VID issues it has been three years since we have been able to celebrate this. We will begin a little early that evening and offer supper to our students along with traditional beads, masks, games and a few contests and door prizes. 

Hearing no further discussion, the motion was put to vote, with all present voting aye. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Moore and seconded by Bjornstad to approve the financial statements as of December 31, 2021. Hearing no further discussion, the motion was voted on, with all present voting aye. Motion carried.

Old Business

4th Weekend of the Month Collections – Discussion was held on second collections for Social Justice causes. Fr. Hughes asked the committee to select the weekend of the month that they felt was appropriate. Consensus of the committee was to hold the second collection on 4th weekend of the month as it had been in the past. Fr. Hughes will advise Susan Reiser so appropriate announcements can be made.
