## Many, Many Thanks

Our gigantic Ukrainian food project has been successfully completed and the 168,000 meals are on their way to Eastern Europe. The food has been taken to the Convoy of Hope's state-side distribution center where it will be prepared for shipment overseas. The packages will be shipped to Poland and then taken to refugee centers along the Polish Ukrainian border. It will take several weeks for the food to make the transatlantic crossing so we have been told that our food will be shared with the refugees in about four weeks.

I want to say a special word of thanks to our tireless team who worked very hard to coordinate this incredible event. Our staff members, Teresa Goehring, Derek Probst, and Deacon Darwin Messerly were the heart and soul of this project. We are deeply grateful for their dedication to this outreach effort. They were assisted by a number of young people from both parishes and we want to thank them for their support from the beginning. Jill Harms and Blink Marketing were on board early-on to help us fo-

who have fled their homes."

The community response to the idea of helping the victims of this war has been truly impressive; our generous finan-



## Together In Faith

We will be off and running this month as Religious Education classes begin on Sept. 7th K-5 meets at 3:30-5 p.m. and 6-12 meets from 7-8pm. Prior to that, on the last day of August, Catechists from Milford and Spirit Lake will gather at St. Joseph for an in-service presentation and supper beginning at 6pm.

For the Confirmation students attending St. Joseph, there will be a parent/student meeting on the first evening. More details will be forthcoming from Teresa Goehring as we get nearer. On Sunday, Sept. 17, our church recognizes Catechists, those who have agreed to formally teach the faith to our young people. This recognition will take place at all Masses that weekend. Second grade parents will meet after class, at 5 p.m. on Wednesday, Sept. 21 to fill out some paperwork and go over the upcoming Sacrament year. If your child was not Baptized at St. Joseph or St. Mary in Spirit Lake, you will need a copy of the Baptism for our records here. If you do not have that, you can request it from the parish where your child was Baptized and they will send it.

If you have not already done so, we will register children on the first day of classes. I do need a signed registration form, and the fees will be collected at that time. Compared to most parishes, our fee is low and it gives us some funds to work with to provide snacks and special things for our students. If you are new to the parish or have a school aged child that may have missed the Sacraments, we would love to have you. Just connect with me and we will get things moving.

All but one of my Catechists are returning for this year. I do have one opening for a 3rd grade Catechist. That grade meets at 3:30-5 p.m. on Wednesdays and it is a small group of children. Please let me know as soon as you can if you are interested. You must be a practicing Catholic and take VIRTUS training for child protection.

This is Clay County Fair month, a big deal in the area. Hope you can all get to the fair and have a good time.

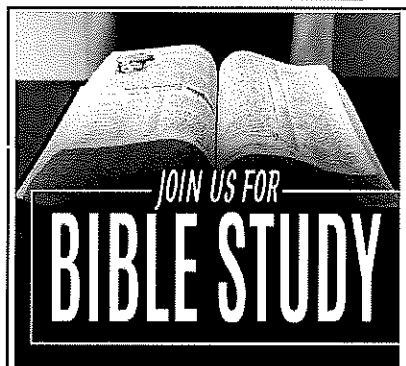

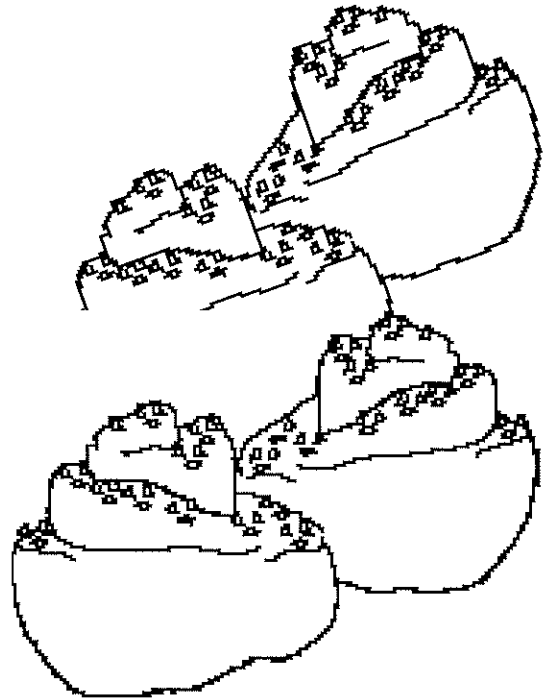

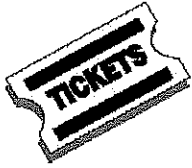
