
# Be Witnesses for Christ in Everything We Do. Form Community. Share the Good News of Christ.

This spring's balmy weather has been slow in coming and now it looks like summer's heat may come early. Here in Northwest Iowa, we talk a lot about the weather. How much snow are we going to get? We have had not enough rain. We have had too much rain! The winds were terrible yesterday. Talk about the weather is almost always very close to any lowa's conversation. Here on the north central plains of North America, we live close to the land and the weather that whirls around us drives much of the way that we respond to life. We are blessed by the beauty of four dynamic seasons and the power and the grandeur of God's creation can been seen very close at hand.

The very first paragraphs of the Catechism of the Catholic Church state: "In the order and beauty of creation, one can come to a knowledge of God as the origin and end of the universe." (CCC#32) The Catechism goes on to quote St. Augustine, who said: "Question the beauty of the earth, question the beauty of the sea, question the beauty of the air dis-



tending and diffusing itself, question the beauty of the sky....their beauty is a profession of faith. Who made them if not the Beautiful One who is not subject to change?" (CCC #32) We can begin to come to the knowledge and love of God when we contemplate the beauty and magnificent power of creation.

Our pioneer ancestors came to this vast prairie and carved out a place for us. Those brave souls often encountered the hard and brutal edges of natures forces. Cold winters and scorching summers. Dry seasons and drenching rains. We live in a time when many of us are insulated from the harshest conditions that nature can provide. And yet the breathtaking power God's creation can teach us great lessons.

As the seasons change and draw us from one year to another, I encourage

you to all take a bit of time to first experience the beauty of the world around you and to allow that beauty to move you to a deeper appreciation of the presence of God in His creation. Again, the Catechism of the Church guides us in a beautiful way: "God himself created the visible world in all its richness, diversity and order. ... The Sacred Scriptures teach us the truths revealed by God for our salvation, permitting us to recognize the inner nature, the value and the ordering of the whole of creation to the praise of God." (CCC#337) Taking a bit of quiet time to be moved by the changing of the seasons can open us up to God. May the reflection of God's magnificence in the wonders of creation draw us to praise and glorify our Loving Creator. Have a wonderful Spring!

### **Finance Council**

The St. Joseph Finance Council met Wednesday, May 17, 2023, in the Saint Rita Conference Room. Fr. Hughes called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m. and led the group in prayer. The following were in attendance: Fr. Hughes, Lay Director Chris Stein, Council Members Connie Jones, Steve Anderson, Chad Harms, Tony Peschong, Julie Fairchild and Financial Secretary/Business Manager Susan Reiser. Absent and excused was Lay Director Doug Heller.

Minutes from the Jan. 17, 2023 meeting were approved with a motion by Harms and a second by Anderson. All ayes. Carried.

Financial reports, including the balance sheet, the profit and loss statement and the budget vs. actual statement, were reviewed. The financial reports were approved with a motion by Peschong and a second by Jones. All ayes. Carried. Finance Council members asked staff to review the maturity and rate of current certificates of deposit.

### 2023-24 Budget

The 2023-24 budget was presented and reviewed by Finance Council members. New employees were discussed. Recommendations were made to staff to adjust some calculations, the Finance Council will meet in June to finalize the budget. Budgets are required to be completed and submitted to the diocese prior to July 1.

### **Capitol Campaign**

Fr. Hughes related specific information regarding the five-phase long range plan to update the electrical wiring in the church, resurface the parking lot, reroof the church, install a keyless security entry system and update sound and technology equipment.

To date, company representatives have provided cost options and bid information. Discussion was held on the process of obtaining diocesan resolutions and how to begin a capitol campaign.

### Salary Adjustments

The current salaries of employees was discussed. Information was presented on possible cost of living increases. Reiser left the meeting at 6:56 p.m.

Stein moved with a second by Jones to adjourn the meeting at 7:15 p.m. All ayes. Carried.
