We are welcoming new staff members this month including Erin Lorch and Jacques Bouli and announcing a staff change.


In late April we hired Lorch to replace longtime Director of Religious Education Sharon







House to speak at the next meeting. The motion was put to a vote with all present voting aye.


Other
