Dear Parishioners of Saint Raphael and Sacred Heart Parishes,

The Fourth Sunday of Lent is traditionally called Laetare Sunday. This is the Sunday in Lent when the priest wears a rose-colored chasuble and stole. Laetare Sunday has always been a day of celebration, within the austere period of Lent. This Sunday got its name from the first few words of the entrance antiphon for the Mass of the day. The Latin "Laetare Jerusalem" (Rejoice O Jerusalem") is from Isaiah 66:10. This Sunday is meant to be a day of relaxation from the normal rigors of Lent; a day of hope with Easter at last within sight!

I would imagine that all of us would do well to take the tradition of Laetare Sunday and have some relief from all worry and stress of the world's situation. I encourage everyone reading our bulletin online today to make Laetare a real celebration. Watch Mass as a family at home by clicking one the links listed on our website. See if everyone, including dad can find something rose-colored to wear while Mass is being offered. Plan something fun after Mass and enjoy every minute of it! Parents could tell your children your

Spiritual Life and the Celebration of the Sacraments in this time of Corona Virus Emergency

The Guidelines from the Health Department direct that there be no large group gatherings at this time. Gatherings of no more than ten persons are permitted.

Baptism may be celebrated provided the group gathered is the immediate family only. Families may consider postponing baptism for a few months. To arrange for an infant baptism, call 412-661-3100.

Reconciliation [Confession] is available at the usual times:

- (a) Sacred Heart on Saturdays from 3:30 to 4:30 pm
- @ St. Raphael on Saturdays from 3:15 to 3:45 pm
- @ St. Raphael on Wednesdays from 6:00 to 7:00 pm
- or by appointment

To keep "social distance" at the St. Raphael confessional, the penitent is asked to keep the "confessional window" closed. [no face-to-face]

To keep "social distance" at the Sacred Heart confessional, the penitent is asked to close the door, then either kneel or stand. [no face-to-face].

Holy Mass and Holy Communion

At this time, there is no public celebration of the Eucharist. Since there is no celebration of Mass on Sunday or weekdays, the faithful are not able to receive Holy Communion in church.

The faithful are encouraged to take time out to pray. The Scripture readings for each day may be found at www.usccb.org.

Each individual can make a "spiritual communion." This is a prayer for use for a "spiritual communion."

My Jesus, I believe that you are present in the most holy Eucharist. I love you above all things, and I desire to receive you into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive you sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace you as if you were already there and unite myself wholly to you. Never permit me to be separated from you. Amen.

Funerals

The celebration of a funeral Mass is permitted provided that only the immediate family attend. Families may wish a grave-side service and gather for the Mass in the months ahead. Arrangements are made with the funeral home and Sister Mary Elizabeth.

Private Prayer and Adoration

Saint Raphael Church and Sacred Heart Church are open for private prayer each day from 7:00 am to 7:00 pm.

A visit to church is an opportunity to adore Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle. [For the time being, Solemn Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and Benediction will not take place.]

We're asking all parishioners of our Grouping, wherever we are, to pause at 12:00 Noon each day during Lent and offer the prayer to the right in silence. 
Mass Streaming

Pope Francis on Coronavirus crisis



In an exclusive interview on March 18, Paolo Rodari, journalist from La Repubblica (The Republic) in Rome, asked Pope Francis how one can live these days so that they are not wasted? Here is an excerpt of his answer: "We must rediscover the concreteness of little things, small gestures of attention we can offer those close to us, our family, our friends. We must understand that in small things lies our treasure. These gestures of tenderness, affection, compassion, are minimal and tend to be lost in the anonymity of everyday life, but they are nonetheless decisive, important. For example, a hot meal, a caress, a hug, a phone call... They are familiar gestures of attention to the details of everyday life that make life meaningful and that create communion and communication amongst us".



The Fifth Station: Simon Helps Jesus Carry the Cross


Jesus, shows us how to help others who are in trouble.
