
Epiphany brings God among us

This weekend we are celebrating the Epiphany. For us, this feast commemorates the visit of the wise men to Baby Jesus. In Matthew's Gospel we read that some kings followed a star in the East in order to find a baby in the manger. The word "epiphany" is drawn from the Greek and means "manifestation" or "revelation" because this holiday also celebrates the manifestation of God in Jesus in our world. Therefore, this feast shows us today, how close Christ is to us, even as a child.

When I was a child, my parents celebrated this feast by putting a bean in the dough and cooking it inside a cake that we called the Three Kings Cake. The one who found the bean received the title of King, or Queen

for the day. What was the prize? Well, special treatments like no chores for the day. Either way I was very happy because it was a chance to love my siblings even more. Be ready for the opening of the Newly Established Saint Jude Parish

The honor of your presence is requested either in person or by way of live streaming at the opening of the Newly Established Saint Jude Parish on the weekend of January 9 and 10, 2021.

The Events are tentatively planned as follows:

- JR, our choir director, is gathering a small choir at the Principal Masses to enhance the liturgical music. This choir might include a few of our own parishioners as well as bringing in a few guest members as we did on the Feast of Christ the King and Christmas.
- All Masses that weekend will celebrate the Baptism of the Lord while at the same time honor in some appropriate way our new Patron, Saint Jude. The two Principal Masses will be the 4:00 PM Mass at Saint Raphael Church and the 11:30 AM Mass at Sacred Heart Church. The 11:30 AM Mass on January 10 at Sacred Heart Church will be a concelebrated Mass with both deacons assisting (social distanced and wearing Mask, of course). My rationale for making that decision is based on the larger church having the capacity to safely accommodate a larger congregation if that should happen under the circumstances. The Council accepted that decision. I am grateful for their support and wisdom.
- The Council also supported asking every parishioner to make a Solemn Nine Day Novena in honor of Saint Jude beginning on January 1 and leading up to the Opening Celebrations. They made several suggestions how the Novena would be conducted and how people would have access to the prayers as well as an explanation of what a Novena means for individuals that may not be familiar with a novena.
- Council members want to have a special holy card of Saint Jude for all the parishioners that would like one with a <u>commemorative inscription</u> on the back pertaining to the Establishment of Saint Jude Parish and the date.
- The Council also wants something to be available with a brief message that includes the Mission Statement of Saint Jude Parish as it currently reads in its draft form.
- Finally, the Councilors asked if the children of SHES and our Religious Ed could be involved in some way by submitting children's art.

• The Council enthusiastically supported the project of reaching out to all the neighborhoods of our new par-

ish and inviting people we do not know yet to celebrate with us. Since we cannot host a celebratory banquet as we would have if it were not for COVID, we will keep it for a later date when weather will be better and the pandemic on the down side.

• Finally, the Council will produce a video announcing the new parish and briefly expressing their enthusiasm that all our parishioners and neighbors join us in some way to celebrate this exciting beginning.

I promise, O blessed St. Jude, to be ever mindful of this great favor,


to always honor you as my special and powerful patron, and to gratefully encourage devotion to you. An
