## Revised Holy Week Schedule

As a newly constituted parish, we are all aware of the realities surrounding us, the horrible plight of the pandemic and the extreme measures to mitigate its spread, some long-standing parish traditions, and meaningful liturgical practices.

The celebration of Holy Week will someday bring us together as one parish, celebrating one liturgy with both communities together on Holy Thursday and again on Good Friday. But for now, I feel pastorally (speaking as your local shepherd); we may not yet be ready to celebrate one unifying liturgical service on those two holy days that we all love. We are still uncomfortable with the spatial realities, the fatigue of COVID, and dealing with the “loss” of our identity and the pressures of the world in general. I am concerned for everyone.

So, for this Holy Week at least, I have made a pastoral decision, after much prayerful reflection and consultation to have two liturgical celebrations on Holy Thursday and Good Friday to allow us to “ease” into our call to become one meaningful parish. The revised schedule is as follow:

### Holy Thursday

- Saint Raphael: 6:00pm followed by adoration until 10:00pm
- Sacred Heart: 7:00pm followed by adoration until 10:00pm

### Good Friday

- Saint Raphael and Sacred Heart: 1:30pm
- Stations of the Cross at Saint Raphael at 7:00pm

**Holy Saturday – The Solemn Easter Vigil at 8:00 PM at Sacred Heart**

## PSP 2021

In order to fulfill our Parish’s obligation to the work of the Diocese, we hope that you will complete the enclosed pledge/contribution card received and return it back to us, as soon as possible, using the envelope provided. After you sign and return the initial pledge card, we ask that you use the PSP envelopes (or your *Faith Direct* subscription) for all subsequent pledge payments. We also ask that you write a **separate check for all PSP pledge payments** (made payable to “Saint Jude Parish”).

We are very aware, and extremely grateful, that many of you continue to make contributions during these hard times. Your generosity and support of our parish and its mission are immeasurable. At the same time, I have been asked by the members of the Parish Finance Council to appeal to **each parishioner to consider increasing his/her 2021 pledge amount by 3%**. If you are not able to contribute that amount, we ask that you give to the best of your ability. If, at any time during the course of the year you are able to contribute an “extra” amount to the PSP, that is always much appreciated. **For 2021, the amount we are required to raise as a parish is \$159,787.** We ask you for your prayers for the success of our PSP campaign and for the financial stability of our parish. Please be assured that you are always in my thoughts and prayers.

## Vaccine Clinic



With great success, Integrated Health 21 organized a vaccine clinic at Saint Jude Parish to facilitate COVID-19 vaccine administration. The Moderna COVID-19 Vaccine was given to Saint Jude parishioners, family members and all our neighbors who qualify, last **Saturday, March 20, 2021 9:30 AM-3PM at Saint Raphael.**

They offered it to the 65+ group and to Persons age 18-64 with high-risk conditions, as defined by the Pennsylvania Department of Health.

Sacred Heart parishioners had a long history of providing substantial tuition assistance to families in the parish that qualified so everyone in the parish could afford to send their children to Sacred Heart Elementary School. We are pleased to announce that the Scholarship Fund is now available to any family in Saint Jude Parish that enrolls their children in our own regional school. Fortunately, this Fund was managed extremely well over the years so we are blessed to be able to continue to offer assistance that can make a difference in tuition payments if the family qualifies. The application process is simple. Please apply by writing directly to Father Mele. He will work closely with a parishioner and former member of the Finance Council who will then determine what amount can be awarded to a given family. If your children are enrolled in SHES and you are a parishioner, just write to the pastor, describe your current need and a basic amount of how much assistance you may need. Complete financial confidentiality will be guaranteed. Saint Jude Parish is proud to be the host parish for SHES. We are happy our regional school is thriving and is forging ahead by creating a positive partnership between a host parish and regional elementary school, which is one of a kind in the diocese. We strongly recommend all our families that choose Catholic elementary education, to enroll at SHES and apply for tuition assistance over and beyond what they receive already through diocesan grants.

## Saint Jude Young Adults Helping All of Us

We are extremely blessed to have an active and effective Young Adults Ministry in our parish. These young people help in so many ways to reach out to young and old alike.

Recently Father Joe asked them to study and evaluate for him two special projects he would love to see become operative in our parish sometime in the next couple of years.

The first ministry goes back to over 50 years ago when it was part of many parishes; especially in CCD programs. The ministry was known as FISHERS. These were parishioners that were trained to reach out to parishioners that had become lax or non-practicing Catholics. The FISHERS contacted these families or individuals in non-threatening and non-judgmental ways simply to see if that family or individual needed anything. FISHERS were ambassadors of the parish family. They were extremely well received in CCD programs because often times children were absent because parents didn't have transportation or were working too hard and did not have time to bring their children to religious instruction. The Young Adults are examining ways to see how to adapt this important ministry to the needs of people today.

The second ministry was one carried out by many seminarians, years ago when they were assigned to summer assignments in parishes. The seminarians would update the parish spiritual census by visiting households in the parish territory on as many streets as possible. This was an enriching experience for the seminarians but even more so for people in the parish who had drifted away for one reason or another. Those brief visits were occasions of many people reconsidering their Catholic life and becoming active again. The census was updated in ways even more than sacramental data for the records. We hope the Young Adults of Saint Jude's will help figure out what a spiritual census could look like today.

## AMEN TO ACTION

### November 26, 2021 - Friday after Thanksgiving

Many of our parishioners remember that in 2019, nearly 4000 people gathered at the David L. Lawrence Convention Center to pack over 1 million meals for the hungry. This year Amen to Action will be held at 10 different churches, each host community overseeing the packing of 100,000 meals. Saint Jude Parish is honored to host the last of the packing assemblies. Our Amen to Action event will be conducted on the traditional morning of Amen to Action which is the Friday after Thanksgiving. Bishop Zubik will join us at this "wrap-up" session for Amen to Action 2021, This is exciting news. Everyone who attended Amen to Action in the past remembers how the Bishop not only leads the brief ecumenical worship service to open the morning but also remains and packs meals with the volunteers, visiting almost every packing station. Please mark your calendar now and plan to have your family and friends come out to join Bishop Zubik and help us prepare 100,000 meals to feed the hungry.

This huge event will require many volunteers as well as financial sponsors. We are sure all our parishioners will help in every way we can. We are pleased to announce that Bernie Kozlowski has volunteered to serve as the Amen to Action Parish Coordinator for the November 26 event. He will work closely with Lee Kricher, President of Pittsburgh Leadership Foundation and the Amen to Action Committee, made up of ecumenical leaders and other local site coordinators. Thanks, Bernie for taking on this monumental task. You have always been there for our parish in every way we have ever needed you. We pledge our support to you as you lead the way for this wonderful and exciting event.



Feeding the hungry through Amen to Action was born out of a desire by Reid Carpenter and Bishop Zubik to manifest unity within the Body of Christ. The movement has a powerful dimension of ecumenism to it. Saint Jude Parish will soon reach out to all our local Christians congregations inviting them to join us in packing over 100,000 meals for the poor. An additional blessing at Saint Jude's is the deep friendship we enjoy with our Jewish neighbors at Rodef Shalom Congregation. We are planning to invite our good friends at Rodef to join us if they are able before their Sabbath begins that day.

Please watch for more specifics about Amen to Action. We hope everyone in our parish and our many friends will be together for this incredible project.

## Saint Jude Parish Speakers Series

We are very pleased that the Speakers Series is off to an excellent start. This series is committed to bring speakers to our parish community who are experts in their fields to share with us contemporary topics that relate to the Catholic faith and are being discussed throughout our society. We all want and need to be informed about these important matters. They are not only interesting subjects but are also concerns that already touch and affect our lives and the world around us. As Catholics, we are called to be as well informed about these themes so we can discuss them within our families but also with many others in a way that represents the best of our Catholicism.

We are all the Church. These are exciting times to be a Catholic. Often it is said today that the culture is hostile towards our beliefs. That assumption is usually a half-truth. Many people who are not Catholic reject not what the Church teaches or believes; they reject what is misrepresented to them about what we hold true. That happens when we lack confidence to dialogue with others because we are unsure ourselves what the Church truly says about certain contemporary issues.

The Speakers Series attempts to help us all have an open place to hear more about important matters that relate to both our Church and to the society around us. This forum is intended to provide us an opportunity to ask questions and even to engage in lively discussion with Catholic experts, knowledgeable on the matters being presented. We are hopeful that the Speakers Series will grow in popularity at Saint Jude's and that you personally will become a regular participant.

The next Speaker is **Dr Paula M. Kane** on **March 25th at 7:00PM**. Dr Kane holds the John and Lucine O'Brien Marous Chair in Catholic Studies in the Department of Religious Studies at the University of Pittsburgh, with a joint appointment in the Department of History. She researches and teaches American religious history with a specialization in modern Catholicism, religion and the arts, and religion and the media. Paula's latest book is *Sister Thorn and Catholic Mysticism in Modern America*, a study of an Irish American nun from Manhattan who reported receiving the stigmata in 1921 and whose followers attempted to make her the first American Saint. Paula's topic on Thursday evening March 25th will be "**Culture Creators or Culture Warriors? Catholics and Contemporary Society.**"



## The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS)

**The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS)** is a faith formation experience for children ages 3 to 12 years old. It is based on the belief that young children can and do experience God. Founded on the educational principles of Maria Montessori, CGS is rooted in scripture and liturgy. Central to the Catechesis is the atrium, a special environment created to nurture the child's spirituality with beautiful materials that focus the child's attention on key scripture passages and liturgical moments. Children enter into a love relationship with Jesus, the Good Shepherd, through gospel proclamation (life of Jesus, parables), prayer, song, silence, and liturgical celebrations. Hands-on materials (made by catechists and parish members) allow children to reflect on God's love and many gifts.

Our parish is starting both a toddler Atrium (ages 2-3) and Level I (ages 3-6). A course to train Level I catechists will be offered starting in May. Help is needed to make some beautiful wooden materials. Do you have woodworking tools and skills? Use your talents to help our children encounter Jesus! The following items are also needed: floor lamps, coffee table, children's tables, someone to refresh and paint wooden chairs. Each pledge makes a difference! All parishes participate, and together our gifts provide much needed services. Thank you for your prayerful consideration and generous response.






