



Obligation to Attend Mass Reinstated

Bishop David A. Zubik is overjoyed to join all the Catholic bishops of Pennsylvania in reinstating the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days, starting August 15, the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary.




Since public health restrictions have relaxed, "More and more people are returning to our churches to celebrate the sacraments and for other events that reflect who we are as the Body of Christ," Bishop Zubik said. "I thank God for their faith and for this opportunity to worship Him together, and to receive His healing grace in the Eucharist."

As always, people who are ill, who suspect that they may have been exposed to a contagious disease, have caregiver obligations or have serious anxiety about being in a large group at this time are not required to attend Mass. People who are ill or who may carry a contagious illness are strongly encouraged to stay home.

"Those who are legitimately excused from Mass on Sundays and Holy Days are encouraged to spend time in prayer, meditating on the Death and Resurrection of the Lord, reading the Sacred Scriptures, and uniting themselves to Christ in his worship of the Father of us all. Those who are legitimately excused are also encouraged to view a broadcast of the Mass which is intended for those who cannot participate in person."

Natural Family Planning Week July 25-31, 2021

Natural Family Planning Week!

Natural Family Planning (NFP) is the general title for the scientific, natural, and moral methods of family planning that can help married couples either achieve or postpone pregnancy. NFP methods are based on the observation of the naturally occurring signs and symptoms of the fertile and infertile phases of a woman's menstrual cycle. No drugs, devices, or surgical procedures are used to avoid pregnancy.

Since the methods of NFP respect the lovegiving (unitive) and life-giving (procreative) nature of the conjugal act, they support God's design for married love! NFP represents a holistic approach to family planning. Both husband and wife are instructed to understand their combined fertility and to identify their family planning intention (whether to attempt to have a baby or not). The successful use of NFP to postpone or avoid pregnancy relies upon a couple following what they know about the method and matching their intimate behavior to their family planning intentions (whether they are attempting to achieve or postpone a pregnancy). -From "What is NFP?" at https://www.usccb.org/ topics/natural-family-planning/nfp-basicinformation.
