Saint Jude Speakers Series Welcomes Robert Ellsberg This Thursday!

"If your brother is hungry, you feed him. You don't meet him at the door and say, 'Go be thou filled,' or 'Wait for a few weeks, and you'll get a welfare check.' You sit him down and feed him." -Dorothy Day

When Pope Francis visited the United States in 2015, he spoke very highly of the Americans that he felt truly embodied the spirit of service and justice that our country embraces as its hallmarks: Abraham Lincoln, Martin Luther King, Jr., Thomas Merton, and Dorothy Day. **Who was Dorothy Day?** Not only is she a Servant of God (a title given to those formally recognized in the process for canonization), she was a revolutionary, a pacifist who fought for social justice for those living in poverty, and the founder of the Catholic Worker Movement. A convert to Catholicism because of the power of the Eucharist, she truly embraced the Lord's call to serve Him in the poor and the marginalized. It is because of that tight embrace that she is a wonderful model of faith to us at Saint Jude Parish, who would do well to follow her example in our own outreach to the impoverished in our surrounding communities. Although she was no stranger to controversy (she did not suffer those in positions of authority lightly), Dorothy Day's relentless insistence that those in poverty are those to whom we are all called to serve if we truly wish to take up our crosses and follow Jesus earned her many fervent devotees and friends.

Saint Jude Parish is exceedingly proud to open its second season of the inspiring Saint Jude Speakers Series with one of those close friends, Mr. Robert Ellsberg, the Editor-In-Chief and Publisher of Orbis Books (a division of Maryknoll) on Thursday, September 30th at 7:00 PM on Zoom.

Mr. Ellsberg, who as a young man befriended and worked closely with Dorothy Day, became the editor of her letters and diaries and will share his insights with us about her life and the importance of her lifelong work with the poor and underserved of our country.

Mary Lou Williams Jazz Mass Concert at Sacred Heart

Saint Jude Parish, in collaboration with our neighbors of Saint Mary Magdalene Parish, will be presenting a beautiful performance of jazz legend and Pittsburgh native Mary Lou Williams’s composition Music for Peace (Mary Lou’s Mass). This special concert will be performed at Sacred Heart church on Sunday evening, **October 24th at 7:00PM.**

Though jazz composer and pianist Mary Lou Williams, who died in 1981, is not as well-known today as contemporaries such as Thelonious Monk, Bud Powell, and Dizzy Gillespie, her musical and spiritual legacy is lately the focus of renewed, and well-deserved, appreciation. A liturgical jazz pioneer and convert to Catholicism, Williams composed three Mass settings and devotional works such as “Black Christ of the Andes,” honoring St. Martin de Porres. Even before her conversion, Williams regularly gave food to those in need, and served as “a one-woman support system” to the troubled Bud Powell. Like her friend Dorothy Day, Williams chose voluntary poverty, devoting her time to helping the poor and sick. She visited sick musicians, cooking and doing laundry for them, and even began bringing musicians who struggled with heroin addiction in to her home. “Mary’s faith in herself was being strengthened by a larger community of fellow believers in God and in jazz,” her biographer, Deanna Witkowski says. In the final years of her life, Williams “had fully integrated her spirituality, music, and her teaching in her frequent performances of Mary Lou’s Mass, and her history of jazz demonstrations,” says Witkowski. “Her persistence in sharing the history of jazz stemmed from her conviction that jazz was ‘healing to the soul’ and needed to be experienced by as many people, in as many environments, as possible.”

Witkowski is herself a jazz composer, pianist, and interpreter of Williams’s work. At the Jazz Mass on October 24th, Ms. Witkowski will lead an instrumental jazz quartet and a twelve-voice choir comprised of singers from the East Liberty Presbyterian Choir, Mendelssohn Choir, and Heritage Gospel Chorale of Pittsburgh. A suggested donation of \$20 will be collected at the door. All are welcome!


Congratulations, Sacred Heart High School Class of 1971!

Saint Jude Adult Education Classes

Saint Jude Parish will begin hosting short classes for adults who want to grow in their knowledge of the Catholic faith. Each class will take place once a week for four weeks in a row:

1. Pope Francis And His Predecessors:

Similarities and Differences. Since Pope Francis took office, the news media have emphasized what they perceive as differences between his approach, and the approach of his recent predecessors, to current events and current issues. We will study these perceived differences to try and understand what the popes have consistently taught, and what if anything they have done differently. This class will meet each Wednesday from September 29 through October 20 at 7:00 pm in the Bishop Winter Conference Room at Sacred Heart (enter to the left of the DePaul School on Alder Street).

2. Bible Study: The Gospels as Historical

Accounts of Jesus' Birth. Just in time for Christmas, this class will focus on what the Gospels tell us about Jesus' birth, what they don't tell us, and how the Early Church Fathers and others have responded to objections to or possible inconsistencies within the Gospel accounts of Jesus's conception, birth, and first years of life. This class will meet each Monday from November 29 through December 20 at 7:00 pm in the Holy Angels Conference Room at Saint Raphael (old school building, which the parish can access on weekday evenings).

Baptism For Older Children

New Information for All St. Jude Parish Volunteers

PROTECTING GOD'S CHILDREN version 3.2. There seems to be some confusion among our volunteers regarding the new 3.2 version of Protecting God's Children. It is a requirement, not an option, that every volunteer in our parish completes Protecting God's Children version 3.2. Virtus attempted to email every volunteer in our database, but in some cases the emails "bounced back". This could have resulted from a change to your email address without notifying us to change it in the parish database, or it could have gone to your junk mailbox. Whatever the reason, every volunteer must complete the updated 3.2 version or will no longer be in compliance, and will be unable to volunteer. Directions for accessing the program on line follow:

- Go to www.virtusonline.org
- When on the Virtus homepage, enter your user name and password in the login box.
- Your original login credentials were migrated from Austin Computing to the Virtus platform when the Pittsburgh Diocese switched providers in the spring of 2021.
- Can't remember your original credentials? Click Need login information in red font.
- Still experiencing difficulties? Click Contact Information located across the top of the homepage, almost to the far right of the page.
- You can then select either Online Help for assistance or call the VIRTUS Help Desk at 1-888-847-8870
