- New people are joining our parish every week from all our neighborhoods. That increase steadily continues. I'm grateful for all those who have joined recently.
- At least half of the new parishioners have expressed a desire to get involved more deeply in the life of the parish. To keep up the momentum and so we do not disappoint anyone, we need to make sure that we have adequate staff and structures in place to get parishioners plugged in and engaged in meaningful ways.
- I've noticed in meeting many of the people joining the parish that they're attracted to our parish family because of the depth of spirituality. They're coming here for the right reasons. **My dear parishioners, you may not realize this, but your devotion and charity touch many other people.** Your spiritual lives and your hospitality make people feel welcome. You inspire them to want to become holy.
- God has blessed us with consistent and generous weekly contributions, a significant number of special contributions (Christmas, end-of-year donations), and outside sources of income (rentals and gifts). This indicates people understand our mission and want to help.

Once again, it couldn't happen without God's goodness and your goodness. Thank you.

## An Update on Winter Utilities and Repairs

As a means of transparency, Father Joe wants to present to you the following report.

### Utility Bills

Like every household, winter utility bills are astronomical this year. It really is unbelievable how much our parish is paying each month for utilities. Here is what we have paid out already:

- Water payments for November and December: \$9,178.97
- Gas payments for November and December: \$30,204.29
- Electricity for October, November and December: \$12,967.63
- An average weekly collection for Saint Jude Parish: \$19,026


You can see how many weekly collections are absorbed just by utilities. Again, we understand every family is experiencing the same burdens but still wanted our parishioners to have this overview.

### Repairs

In terms of necessary repairs, the following are the projects recently completed. As we promised, the Summer Festival proceeds and some of the excess PSP donations were used to cover the invoices that were charged for these necessary projects:

1. LEDS were installed in the nave of Sacred Heart Church and above the canopy over the main altar. Some hardware equipment had to be replaced for these lighting upgrades to be installed.
2. LEDS were installed at Saint Raphael Church as well. This required special equipment to replace the mounting fixtures so the lighting could illuminate the entire back altar area of the sanctuary. Hopefully everyone there notices the huge improvement. It was extremely expensive to carry out this project but your generosity at the time of the 2021 PSP and the hard work at the time of the festival made it possible.
3. Saint Raphael Church was experiencing some loud and disturbing crackling sounds from the PA system. This annoyance started to happen more frequently, so we knew we had to conduct an analysis of why this was occurring. The research provided us with answers to the source of the problems. CZ Sound Company told us we were employing too many “channels” at the same time. They recommended that we basically start over and replace the channels we use in church for the system. This will eliminate the crackling noise. Many parishioners have commented on how good it is to no longer endure that loud interference during the Liturgy. Thank you JR for overseeing this huge problem and its solution.
4. Another project requiring a lot of time and study has been the repair of the organ chambers and flat roofs at Saint Raphael. This required extensive repair of leaks, damaged organ pipes and even chests. We were informed that we needed to re-leather the organ to fix ciphers that caused the pipes not to stop “speaking” (when a note gets stuck and won’t stop so it eventually causes a loud, annoying sound.) We were disappointed that the original company that installed the ciphers would replace them at no cost but unfortunately that company is no longer in business. We are happy though that this repair job is completed satisfactorily, and the organ should operate properly from now on.
5. The organ at Sacred Heart required repairs of the roof about the actual instrument. There was extensive damage over the years to the roof causing damage to the walls, ceiling, pipes, and chests.

All these improvements were done at substantial costs but certainly needed to be done. We are glad that J.R. Daniels was on top of this work. He loves the organs in both of our churches and is diligent in making sure all issues are being handled. If we let things go any longer it would only cost even more money in the end. These projects all needed to be done. The total cost for these repairs amounted to almost \$20,000.



## Next Phase Towards Perpetual Adoration

Thank you to all who have signed up to be an adorer on Wednesdays at Saint Raphael. Your presence is so beautiful. We plan to expand our Eucharistic Adoration times during Lent. We'll provide more details in future bulletins. Please plan to join us, and make this a Lent like no other.

Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament brings many blessings to an individual and a parish. There is no better way to spend an hour than with Jesus in the Eucharist. It brings personal peace and spiritual strength, a greater love for Jesus and each other, and an awareness of the gifts received from the Holy Spirit.

Some of the benefits parishes see include:

1. An increase in Mass attendance and reception of the sacraments
2. Fallen-away Catholics return
3. An increase in the number of conversions
4. An increase of religious and priestly vocations (Once the Missionaries of Charity installed daily adoration, their vocations doubled)
5. A renewal of Catholic family life



## Sharing the Light Speaker Series Presents

**Dr. Samuel Hazo**

**February 24th, 7:00 PM**



Dr Samuel J. Hazo is a poet, novelist, playwright and essayist who exemplifies in his recitations the power of poetry as the spoken word to enliven and enrich our lives.

A lifelong resident of Pittsburgh, Dr Hazo holds the title of Distinguished Professor of English, Emeritus from Duquesne University, where he taught for 43 years.

In 1966 he founded and directed the International Poetry Forum, which in 43 years welcomed more than 800 of the worlds most acclaimed poets and performers to Pittsburgh, making the "Steel City" a cultural and artistic center.

He has authored more than 60 books of poetry, fiction, plays, essays, memoirs, translations and criticisms which have been widely translated.

Dr. Hazo was named the first Poet Laureate of the State of Pennsylvania in 1993 by Governor Robert Casey, an honor he held for 10 years.

Dr. Hazo will recite his poetry in person at **Sacred Heart Church at 7:00 pm, February 24th**. Social distancing will be maintained and masks are required. The performance will also be live streamed.
