



This is why I am so thrilled to be here, because I see unlimited opportunity to 'feed my habit' so to speak, in all of the ways mentioned above. But I will warn you, if I get to know you, I might just get you hooked as well.



Black History Month

Saint Jude's Social Justice Committee is honoring prominent Black Catholics, including St. Josephine Bakhita, St. Benedict the Moor, and Pierre Toussaint, with poster displays in our Churches during the month of February. Learn about the stories of these Black Catholic saints, and be inspired by their heroic examples of holiness to the world. Look for the posters near the altar in St. Raphael and in the vestibule of Sacred Heart.

The posters also trace the history of Black Catholics in America. They share statistics from a 2021 Pew Research Study about Black faith in the U.S. Black Catholics currently comprise 4% of the U.S. Catholic population. Only 54 percent of Black adults who were raised Catholic continue to identify as Catholic. This compares to 81% who are currently Protestant, and 61 percent of white Americans who remain Catholics into adulthood.

One of the posters quotes Fr. Bryan Massingale who speaks to the heart of this disconnect: "What kind of Church are we if racial justice is considered irrelevant or nonessential to being a disciple of Jesus? And how can the Catholic Church be what is says it is - "Catholic" and universal - if almost half of its Black members abandon The Church despite their high measures of religious commitment?"

Let us take this opportunity to reflect on the ways that we be a more welcoming and inclusive parish.

Global Synod Meetings - February 21

As you have been reading here, Pope Francis has asked all Catholics throughout the world to be a part of the World Wide Synod, which will be held in Rome in October of 2023. The word "Synod" means "journeying together," and Pope Francis is asking all of us to try to listen to the Holy Spirit - to discern how the Church today should continue the mission that Jesus gave to us, the People of God. He wants all of us to share what the Holy Spirit may be

laying on our hearts about the Church now and its place in this world today. Pope Francis wants to hear from those who may feel marginalized or hurt by their Catholic experience, as well as from those who have found joy and mercy in the Church, and are looking for the ways to bring others to know the Lord Jesus in His Church. In these weeks of winter, every Parish in our Diocese will be holding "Synod sessions" to share, and listen to one another as to what the Holy Spirit is saying. We will be having two sessions here St. Jude Parish on Monday, February 21 at 1:00pm in St. Raphael Church and again that evening at 7:00pm in

Sacred Heart Auditorium. You can give us a call at the Parish Office and let us know you will be with us—that would help us with the preparation. But you are also welcome just to come to the sessions.
