

According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church, "Hope is the theological virtue by which we desire the kingdom of heaven and eternal life as our happiness, placing our trust in Christ's promises and relying not on our own strength, but on the help of the grace of the Holy Spirit."



The seven brothers of the first reading faced persecution courageously because of the hope they had in God's promise of eternal life. You are not facing a martyr's death as the brothers did, but do you face your own personal temptations, struggles, and hardships with the same hope of seeing God face to face? Is your hope firmly anchored in God? "Let us hold on firmly to the hope we profess, because we can trust God to keep his promise." (Heb. 10:23- Good News Translation)

The second reading has St. Paul addressing the Thessalonians, encouraging them to endure while hoping in the fulfillment of Christ's promise of eternal joy. Are you aware that God offers you the same encouragement through his word, the sacraments, prayer, and others?

Today's Gospel calls you to have hope in the resurrection of the dead! Through his discussion with the Sadducees Christ reassures you though earthly life will end, eternal life awaits. Have you reflected lately on this promise of the Savior?

In summary, the Church beckons you today to hold fast to the hope you have in the fulfillment of God's faithful promises.






