<u>Sacrament of Baptism</u>: Expectant parents must attend our Baptism Preparation Program which is offered monthly. Baptism is the first and most important Sacrament as it introduces us to the Faith. Baptisms are offered on the **First Sunday** of the month at the **11:30am Mass** and immediately following. Call the Parish Office to schedule a baptism and to make arrangements to attend our Baptism Program.

<u>Sacrament of Marriage</u>: Arrangements should be made well in advance of an intended marriage, at least six months and even up to a year prior. Please call the Parish Office to arrange an appointment with the Pastor. Attendance at the Marriage Preparation Program is required.

<u>Sick and Hospital Visits:</u> Please let the Parish Office know if you have a family member who is ill at home or in the hospital so we may add them to our prayer list and arrange, if appropriate, for visits from our Homebound Ministry and the Pastor.

#### The Perils of Wisdom

We live in peril. We know some day we will die. Between now and then we will enjoy life, but we also face its dangers. Disease and violence threaten us. Friends could turn against us. Possessions can be taken away. Natural disasters can change our fortunes. We live in constant peril. Yet in this state of unrest we come to know God best. Paul tells the Corinthians, "you are the temple of God." The Spirit of God dwells within them. They are holy. But if they consider themselves wise in this age, they should become fools. "For the wisdom of this world is foolishness in the eyes of God." When we acknowledge our shortcomings, we speak the truth. In the truth we begin to learn the wisdom of God.

Harm may threaten us, but God keeps us holy. We may not understand why bad things happen, but we trust that God does. God loves us, created us, and placed the Spirit within us. God will not leave us alone. The peril that surrounds us is not just about physical or mental harm. We are also subject to the perils of wisdom, the danger of thinking we know it all, that we can solve it all, or that we deserve it all.

Wisdom belongs to God. Christ belongs to God. We belong to Christ. And all things—all blessings and dangers—take their place within God's plan of love and redemption.

#### **LENTEN REGULATIONS 2020**

## Ash Wednesday and Good Friday:

These are days of Fast and Abstinence from meat. There is a limit of one full meal on these days for all between the ages of 18 and 59 inclusive.

## Days of Abstinence: (All Fridays in Lent)

All who have reached their 14<sup>th</sup> year are bound to abstain totally from meat.

## **Easter Duty Obligations:**

After they have received their First Holy Communion, Catholics are bound by the obligation of receiving Holy Communion at least once a year. This precept should be fulfilled during the Easter Season. Catholics are also bound to confess serious (mortal) sins at least once a year, but this is not limited to the Lenten/ Easter Season.

## In Honor of Black History Month

Annually, the civic society in the U.S. honors the historical accomplishments of African-Americans in the areas of Science, Math, Medicine, Technology, Education, Music, Dance, Inventions, Sports, as well as other fields. We Catholics also can honor the experiences and accomplishments of African and African-Americans in the history of Christianity/Catholic Faith beginning with the baptism of the Ethiopian Official (Acts 8:36, 38-19) to the first publicly recognized African-American Priest, Father Augusta Tolton, in 1854 and throughout U.S. history down to the first African-American Bishop of the Archdiocese of Washington, DC, Archbishop Wilton Gregory; and among the other three million African-American members of the U.S. Catholic Church including the recently deceased Kobe Bryant and his daughter Gianna.
