

Sweets/Baked Items:	Pies, Muffins, Cupcakes, Scones, Quick breads, Brownies, Cakes, Cookies, Bread, Fudge, Candy, Jams/Jellies, etc.	Baked goods should be wrapped in clear wrap or put in baggies. Cookies should be grouped in sets of 4 in sandwich baggies. Please label if nuts are included or if the item is gluten free.
Freezer Meals:	Casseroles, soups, stews, pastas, etc.	Casseroles should be FROZEN in disposable containers and labeled if they contain nuts or dairy or if gluten free. Soups should be in disposable containers or in baggies (lay flat to freeze) and labeled the same way. Please also label with approximate servings (ex: serves 4).
Arts and crafts:	Handmade items, knit, crochet, sewn, painted, wood & paper crafts, etc.	Craft items should be marked with prices. All items must be under \$45.



Catechesis of the Good Shepherd

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS) will begin the first week of Advent here at St. Richard Parish! What is it?! "CGS is a Montessori-based religious formation program for children, ages 3-6, seeking to create and facilitate a sacred, "hands-on" space for children called an Atrium, in which both the children and catechist can hear, ponder, and celebrate the most essential mysteries of the Catholic faith as revealed in the Scriptures and the Liturgy."

If you are interested in enrolling your children in CGS, please attend one of these mandatory parent meeting with info about registration and the weekly schedule.

Meetings will be held in the new Atrium in the Pearce Center (previously the reading library):

- Sunday, October 27th or Sunday, November 24th after both Masses at St. Richard
- Sunday, November 10th after the Noon Mass at St. Charles Borromeo in Whitefish

<u>Material Making Session</u>: Join us after both masses on Sunday, November 17th - all parishioners are invited! We have a number of small works to be completed: small painting works, cut-out works, sewing works, and calligraphy of prayer cards. Join us for lunch, fellowship and crafting as we put the finishing touches on the materials that children will pray with, to grow closer to God.



Help to stop CI-128 Shareable Video Testimonial - Montana Doctor

As a practicing physician in Montana, Dr. Krach is an expert who understands the harmful implications of CI-128.

- The term "healthcare professional" is undefined. No one knows who will make Life-or-death medical decisions about abortions.
- Fetal viability is determined solely by an undefined "healthcare professional" - who makes the life-or-death determination.
- Parental Notification of abortion when girls are under 16 would become unconstitutional.

As an advocate for life and head of Abort Ignorance Montana, Tanaia clearly articulates the truth about CI-128.

- CI-128 would expand late-term abortion of babies who can feel pain and who can survive outside the womb.
- Late-term abortion is not a solution to medical emergencies as proponents of CI-128 often believe. Emergency C-Section procedures are available that give late-term babies a chance at life.
- CI-128 is advertised as freedom from government overreach, but it puts the government between parents and their minor children who seek abortion. The current parental notification law would be unconstitutional under CI-128 and place young girls at risk.
