Dear Parishioners,

"Give them some food yourselves." That was Jesus response to the apostles when they advised Jesus to dismiss the crowds so they could go to the surrounding villages and farms to find lodging and provision for they were in a deserted place. Not the response the apostles were expecting. They only had enough provisions for themselves, not nearly enough to feed such a large crowd of 5000 men not counting women and children.

In this passage we see Jesus providing for the people's spiritual as well as physical needs. Speaking to the crowds about the kingdom of God and healing those who needed to be cured satisfied their spiritual needs, keeping in mind that people then understood physical ailments in terms of spiritual afflictions. But Jesus understood that a person is both a body and a soul, so to care for the whole person you must care for their material needs as well. As Christians, Jesus is directing us to do likewise, "Give them some food yourselves." How then shall we respond to the needs of the poor?



Luke 9:11-17

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

Jesus spoke to the crowds about the kingdom of God, and he healed those who needed to be cured. As the day was drawing to a close, the Twelve approached him and said, "Dismiss the crowd so that they can go to the surrounding villages and farms and find lodging and provisions; for we are in a deserted place here." He said to them, "Give them some food yourselves." They replied, "Five loaves and two fish are all we have, unless we ourselves go and buy food for all these people." Now the men there numbered about five thousand. Then he said to his disciples, "Have them sit down in groups of about fifty." They did so and made them all sit down. Then taking the five loaves and the two fish, and looking up to heaven, he said the blessing over them, broke them, and gave them to the disciples to set before the crowd. They all ate and were satisfied. And when the leftover fragments were picked up, they filled twelve wicker baskets.
