#### A SURVEY OF THE BIBLE

Before moving on to the prophetic books we consider the Books of Tobit, Judith, First and Second Maccabees. These biblical novellas are considered to be part of the deuterocanonical books of the Catholic bible. These books and others are not found in Protestant bibles.

At the time of the Reformation these books were considered to be apocryphal by Protestants, meaning of doubtful authenticity, and not included in their version of the bible. This is an unfortunate choice of terms considering that these books are found in the Greek translation of the Hebrew Scriptures, an early version of the Old Testament, that existed before the time of Christ and were quoted extensively by the Apostolic and Early Church Fathers. When purchasing a bible be sure it is a Catholic bible to ensure that it contains all of these sacred books.

Next week we turn our attention to the Book of Tobit. Here we meet the angel Raphael!
