A SURVEY OF THE BIBLE – FIRST LETTER OF JOHN

The purpose of the letter is to combat certain false ideas, especially about Jesus, and to deepen the spiritual and social awareness of the Christian community. Some former members of the community refused to acknowledge Jesus as the Christ and denied that he was a true man. This letter declares the humanity and divinity of Christ as an apostolic teaching, and the connection between Christian moral conduct and Christian doctrine

The principal divisions of the First Letter of John are: The Prologue (1:1-4); God as Light (1:5-3:10); Love for One Another (3:11-5:12); Epilogue (5:13-21).

NOTEABLE SAINTS OF THE WEEK

Norbert, Bishop. (d. 1134). St. Norbert was born in the duchy of Cleves around the year 1080. A canon of the church of Xanten, he was converted from a worldly life and, embracing the religious state, was ordained to the priesthood in 1115. Undertaking the apostolic life, he accepted the duty of preaching, particularly throughout France and Germany. Elected Archbishop of Magdeburg in 1126, he reformed the Christian life and spread the faith to nearby pagan nations. June 6

Ephrem, Deacon and Doctor (d. 373). St. Ephrem was born of a Christian family at Nisibis around the year 306. Ordained deacon, he exercised this office throughout the country and in Edessa, where he founded a theological school. Despite his ascetic life he did not relax his ministries of preaching and writing books to confute the errors of the time. June 9

Barnabas, Apostle. Born in Cyprus, Barnabas is numbered among the first of the faithful at Jerusalem. He preached the Gospel at Antioch and, as a companion of St. Paul, accompanied him on his first journey. He was also present at the Council of Jerusalem. Upon returning to his own country, he continue to spread the Gospel and eventually died there. June 11
