

Word of God Sunday



Today's Solemnity is unique to the Polish National Catholic Church. Recognition of the Sacrament of the Preaching and Hearing of the Word of God was first announced during the 1909 Synod. The PNCC catechism denotes the seven sacraments as:

- Baptism & Confirmation
- The Word of God
- Penance/Reconciliation
- Holy Eucharist/Communion
- Holy Orders
- Matrimony
- Extreme Unction/Anointing of the Sick

combining Baptism and Confirmation into one sacrament, as one completes the other, and acknowledging the Word of God as its own sacrament. The Solemnity we celebrate today was instituted in 2023 to follow the Sunday in the Octave of Corpus Christi.

READINGS FOR THE SOLEMNITY OF THE WORD OF GOD

Isaiah 55: 6-11

First Reading

A Reading from the book of the prophet Isaiah:

Seek the Lord while he may be found, call upon him while he is near. Let the wicked forsake their way, and sinners their thoughts; Let them turn to the Lord to find mercy; to our God, who is generous in forgiving. For my thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways – oracle of the Lord. For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways, my thoughts higher than your thoughts.

Yet just as from the heavens the rain and snow come down and do not return there 'til they have watered the earth, making it fertile and fruitful, giving seed to the one who sows and bread to the one who eats. So shall my word be that goes forth from my mouth; It shall not return to me empty, but shall do what pleases me, achieving the end for which I sent it.

Yes, in joy you shall go forth, in peace you shall be brought home. Mountains and hills shall break out in song before you, all trees of the field shall clap their hands.

As you know, we treated each one of you as a father treats his children, exhorting and encouraging you and insisting that you conduct yourselves as worthy of the God who calls you into his kingdom and glory.

And for this reason we too give thanks to God unceasingly, that, in receiving the word of God from hearing us, you received not a human word but, as it truly is, the word of God, which is now at work in you who believe.

When a large crowd gathered, with people from one town after another journeying to him, he spoke in a parable. "A sower went out to sow his seed. And as he sowed, some seed fell on the path and was trampled, and the birds of the sky ate it up. Some seed fell on rocky ground, and when it grew, it withered for lack of

moisture. Some seed fell among thorns, and the thorns grew with it and choked it. And some seed fell on good soil, and when it grew, it produced fruit a hundredfold." After saying this, he called out, "Whoever has ears to hear ought to hear."

Then his disciples asked him what the meaning of this parable might be. He answered, "Knowledge of the mysteries of the kingdom of God has been granted to you; but to the rest, they are made known through parables so that 'they may look but not see, and hear, but not understand.'

"This is the meaning of the parable. The seed is the word of God. Those on the path are the ones who have heard, but the devil comes and takes away the word from their hearts that they may not believe and be saved. Those on the rocky ground are the ones who, when they hear, receive the word with joy, but they have no root; they believe only for a time and fall away in time of trial. As for the seed that fell among thorns, they are the ones who have heard, but as they go along, they are choked by the anxieties and riches and pleasures of life, and they fail to produce mature fruit. But as for the seed that fell on rich soil, they are the ones who, when they have heard the word, embrace it with a generous and good heart, and bear fruit through perseverance."



Reception of the Holy Eucharist

Baptized Christians who believe in the Real Presence of Christ in the Holy Eucharist and are in a state of grace, free from mortal sin, are invited to partake of this Holy Sacrament. It is the practice of the PNCC to distribute the Holy Eucharist through the method of intinction. The Body of Christ is dipped into the Precious Blood and is placed on the tongue and not in the hand of the communicant. If you are unable to receive the Precious Blood, please alert Father before Mass so that he is aware of the situation. If you would like to receive a blessing from Father instead of Communion, come to the altar rail with your arms crossed, palms on shoulders. Come and let us be one with our Lord.

Fireworks tailgating

The Town of Stratford will be holding their annual fireworks display **THIS** Wednesday, 2 July. Our parking lot will be open for the annual tailgating "party" for parishioners and their friends/families and closed to the general public during this time.

Due to the closure of the Burma Road (in front of the airport), traffic will be extremely heavy this year, so come early – gates open at 6:30 p.m. – and bring a picnic dinner to enjoy. Plenty of room for kids to play. Fireworks start at 8:45 p.m. if it's dark enough. View them from the lot or take the short walk down to the athletic fields at the beach and watch up close. Enjoy some down time afterwards while the traffic clears.
