Confirmation Sponsor: Due September 15 google form

The Church encourages that the Confirmation Sponsor be a Godparent from Baptism. This choice symbolically strengthens the connection between Baptism and Confirmation. However, it is not mandatory to choose a Godparent, as there are many reasons why this may not be possible or even desirable.

There are a few requirements, however. Your Confirmation sponsor must be

- A confirmed and practicing Catholic who is at least 16 years old
- May not be one of your parents (though a parent may stand in as a "proxy" if your sponsor is unable to attend the day of Confirmation.)

When choosing your Confirmation Sponsor, particularly if it is not one of your Godparents, please consider your values, your goals, your strengths and weaknesses. As with the saint you chose, try to ask someone who complements these qualities in you and someone who is an inspirational example of what it means to be a Catholic Christian in today's world.
