
### Awards of Excellence


### New this Year: School Nurses

# Alumni Highlight: Katelyn Gendron Class of 2013

Katelyn is currently attending Northeastern University. She is in her 4th year of a 5-year combined bachelor's and master's program, including three 6-month internship experiences. She is working toward a BS/MS in Civil Engineering with a concentration in structures.

"My favorite St. Brigid memories were during Catholic Schools Week. We all looked forward to celebrating together as a community through the many events planned. The week showed how great our school spirit was and how invested everyone was not only in the St. Brigid community but the larger community as well. We volunteered in several community service projects during the week, and I enjoyed how we came together to share our talents and resources with those in need."

Katelyn reflects on how St. Brigid School prepared her for High School and College: "Being offered advanced Math and English classes at St. Brigid combined with the dedication of my teachers allowed me to take several AP classes in high school. These classes gave me college credits that put me ahead and allowed me to pursue a combined bachelor's and master's while being able to work three

6-month internships, all in 5 years. Mrs. Sargent, Science teacher (retired), also did an outstanding job preparing students for high school and college. She stressed the importance of outlining course content and other organizational skills, areas other people in high school and college struggled with."

Most of Katelyn's teachers are still part of our faculty. "My favorite memories of my teachers are Mrs. Newman's poet of the week and Mrs. Garrett helping me with math. Mrs. Newman read every student's poem each week, showing her dedication to the students and their learning. She wanted everyone to listen to each poem carefully and absorb how each student conveyed their thoughts.

Mrs. Garrett was another teacher who was extremely beneficial for my learning. Even after I was not taking math classes with her, I would often go to her for help, and she would always take the time to explain the material. These teachers and other teachers at St. Brigid dedicated their time encouraging other students and me to always aim for our highest potential while providing the assistance we needed along the way.

St. Brigid School helped me develop my faith by being able to go to church every week, taking part in the harmony group throughout middle school, and having religion class. These helped me to form a stronger sense of community and faith with my classmates and teachers. These things encouraged me to take on leadership roles during the Mass, as I regularly enjoyed reading the Prayer of the Faithful at Mass and sometimes came up with intentions for the prayer. The opportunities to take part in church as well as act out the Stations of the Cross in 8th grade strengthened my faith. Teachers and students were always encouraging each other to take part in these events, and we always did them as a community, so you never felt alone or out of place in expressing your faith. Katelyn is set to graduate in 2022."

### Home and School Association

Our parent group, the Home and School Association was faced with the challenge of presenting community building events and activities with respect to the Covid guidelines. It was a year to think creatively to preserve the events that were possible, while keeping our community safe.

Late in the summer, they hand delivered welcome bags to new students and parents, in a socially distant manner. They were able to adhere to gathering guidelines by hosting 2 sessions of a welcome pizza party outside in our parking lot so that new families could meet the teachers, staff, and other parents prior to the start of school. Favorite events such as Grandparent's Day and Santa's Workshop were successfully held in safe and meaningful ways.

The H.S.A. are working on the planning of a family event tentatively scheduled for the spring. In addition, the Care Committee assisted with a Food Drive and school wide service projects during Catholic Schools Week that benefited Sacred Heart/St. Dominic's Food Pantry, Maine Needs, and the Matthew 25 Project.

# A Message from Courtney Morgan, Director of Development

Just like most events in 2020, fundraising during the pandemic looked different! We had some challenges but we have been successful with the help of our generous parent community, parishioners, alumni, and supportive friends. Each year St. Brigid School relies on fundraisers and our Annual Appeal to generate revenue to fund financial aid, enhancements to the curriculum in the way of new text books and computers, and to offset the gap in the operating budget that isn't covered by tuition dollars.


In October, we had our first Jump-a-Thon which raised over \$20,000. Students completed 46,754 jumps during the Jump-A-Thon and as a result of surpassing the fundraising goal, received a snow cone from Snowology 207. "The Jump-A-Thon was an exciting way to bring the whole St. Brigid community together," said Melinda Bedard, a parent co-chair of the event. "Not only was it a successful fundraiser, but seeing the students having fun and reaching their goals was unbelievably rewarding."

For other events, the Wreath Sale generated \$1,500. Giving Tuesday brought in \$13,000 in one day and our Annual Appeal has raised \$30,000 to date. According to the Portland Diocese Catholic Annual Appeal Report, we also benefit from the Catholic Appeal which "goes to help cover the cost of lay teacher positions, provide grants to parishes and clusters with schools, and fund the Office of Catholic Schools."


