

Administrator's Perspective

WHAT HAPPENED TO MARY'S FEAST DAY?

We have an unusual situation this weekend that pops up periodically. This Sunday is December 8, and normally this date is celebrated as the **Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception**, honoring that most holy event when our Blessed Mother was conceived without Original Sin, a doctrine of our faith.

The Church recognizes the significance of this date by placing it exactly nine months before the feast of the Birth of Mary on September 8. Since this year the Immaculate Conception falls on a Sunday in Advent, the Second Sunday of Advent takes precedence over any other memorial, feast, or solemnity because the Sundays of Advent must be taken in their Scriptural order of importance.

So what happens to our beloved celebration of the Immaculate Conception? The Church has **transferred this solemnity to the next day**, Monday, December 9. Because of the unusual circumstances, it is not a holy day of obligation this year.

However, this does not in the least lessen the importance of our Blessed Mother in the history of salvation. Without her faith-filled and joyful response to the message of the Archangel Gabriel, where would we be today?

So with all of this in mind, today we pray that, whatever the cost or consequences, like Mary, we may also respond with faith and joy to whatever God calls us to do.

IN OTHER NEWS: There will be **numerous opportunities for confessions** during this Advent season as we prepare ourselves for Christmas. In addition to our regularly scheduled confessions on Saturday mornings, Monday afternoons, and Tuesday mornings, we will also have "The Light Is On For You" at all four churches on Wednesday, December 11 from 6-9 pm, and then on Wednesday, December 18 we will have **several confessors available at St. Athanasius Church** from 7-8:30 pm....stay tuned for more news....

To our Neighbors North Catholic Community Parishioners:

Since our inception in 2006 the St. Teresa of Avila Knights of Columbus Council 13959 made a commitment to be responsible for all the grass cutting and trimming of our parish grounds. We started with "Hand-me-down" equipment and during the last 13 years, have purchased what was necessary and made all the repairs to keep them in working condition.

We estimate we have saved the parish between \$150,000 and \$200,000 based on what a contractor would have charged for the same services. We had three riding mowers that were essential to our efforts and as of last week only one mower worked. One is in need of major repairs and the other one is beyond repair and is no longer useable.

At this time, the Knights Council is unable to financially replace these two riding mowers. Council members are quite willing to continue our service to the parish. We are asking if anyone from the Neighbors North Catholic Community would be able to assist us financially. The time to purchase is now, since most lawn equipment retailers are offering discounts to sell before the year end.

SUGGEST A NAME FOR THE NEW PARISH

By January 6, 2020, Father Rushofsky must submit up to 15 possible names for the proposed new parish that will result from the merger of our four parishes. To assist in this effort, Father is inviting parishioners to suggest names by using the form found at https://neighborsnorth.org/parish-merger and in the narthexes of each church. Names submitted will be reviewed by the parish staff and the interim pastoral council to aid Father Rushofsky in selecting which 15 to submit. The Diocese will review the names submitted by Father Rushofsky and indicate which are acceptable. Father will then consult with all parishioners on the list of acceptable names to identify which three will be presented to Bishop Zubik when our parishes submit the petition to merge in April of 2020.

Suggested names must be taken from:

- 1. The Most Holy Trinity.
- 2. Our Lord Jesus Christ, invoked under a mystery of his life or under his name as used in the liturgy or Scripture.
- 3. The Holy Spirit.
- 4. The Blessed Virgin Mary under a given title already found in the liturgy;
- 5. The holy angels.
- 6. A saint from the list found in the Church's calendar of memorials and feasts. (There are over 200! A list can be found on the Neighbors North website.)
- 7. All names of those who are beatified or named "blessed."
- * A name that is already used by a parish in the diocese cannot be proposed.
- * Hyphenated names of current parishes are not permitted.

SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT

Peace and harmony. Last Sunday, Isaiah inspired us with a vision of peace, when swords are beaten into plowshares. Today, Isaiah speaks of a state of harmony, when a lamb can lie down with a wolf. Paul encourages the Romans to think in harmony with one another. John the Baptist calls for repentance, so that all may bear good fruit. As we listen to the scriptures today, let us imagine the harmony we can create when all of us ready ourselves for Jesus' coming while living in peace and harmony with our neighbor.

SOLEMNITY OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION

Because December 8th falls on a Sunday this year, the Solemnity is transferred to Monday, December 9th. Therefore, **the obligation to attend Mass is abrogated**. You do <u>not</u> have to attend weekday Mass on Monday for the Immaculate Conception unless you choose to do so.

Second Sunday of Advent

If you are looking for the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, you will have to wait until tomorrow. The feast fell on an Advent Sunday this year which takes precedence. St. Matthew wastes no time introducing John the Baptist to his readers with his fiery preaching. John takes on the Pharisees and the Sadducees name-calling them a "brood of vipers." The message is simple, we are to repent, for God's kingdom is at hand. John's role was to prepare the way for Jesus and to proclaim a theme of repentance for those who would follow Jesus. Like a Roman corps of engineers filling in gullies and leveling mountains to make roads, John's job was to make the pathway smooth for those coming to Jesus. The most interesting lesson glean from this gospel is that nothing is guaranteed.

For the First Century Jew, calling yourself a Son of Abraham, guarantees nothing here. As a 21st Century Christian, we are not to grow complacent in the face of our baptism. If you feel shaken up a bit, that's ok, John's words still stir our innermost being as we are reminded to repent. Locusts anyone?

As parents, we are the most influential messengers in the lives of our children. Like

John, without letting up, parents must keep sending the message and pointing to the way of Jesus. When we see that our children are creating wrinkles in the carpet we are obligated to show them a way to smooth the path. Children look to their parents as models and they often imitate their behavior. Our actions should reflect the things we tell our children. This Gospel reminds us that seeking forgiveness from God and one another is most certainly an important step in making a straight path.


On this Second Sunday of Advent let's consider this: If I could give one message about God to everyone I know, my message would be . . .

Listen to the Word: Is there an image in the Isaiah reading which lingers in your memory? What touches your heart?


Look into Your Life:

Youth: What are the greatest challenges you face as a young person today in terms of allowing Christ to be your teacher and following him?


Adults: Name the one thing in your life which you must "move out of the way" in order to make more room for Christ – a grudge, a possession, a memory, hurt, or feeling.




