Pastor's Perspective

THREE MONTHS IN

We are now three months into our new parish, and a lot is going on. Some is quite obvious and some is more “behind the scenes.”

The **pandemic has held us back** on some things, but for the most part we are forging ahead with multiple activities, projects, and other fun & games.

So far we have managed to **expand our Mass schedule**, not quite to where it was, but at least we're moving in the right direction. Although some still choose to watch Mass online, an increasing number are coming to the churches for Mass, and it is encouraging for us clergy to see more in the pews (well, at least from the eyes up).

Meanwhile, our online **Sunday Masses will now be live-streamed** each week from Saint Athanasius Church, beginning with the 5 pm Saturday Mass and will then be available to view through Sunday. We are also hoping to **live-stream the weekday Masses at 8:30 am** Monday through Friday from Saint Athanasius. Thanks to our Fr. Michael Zavage and his techno-wizardry for overseeing this project that will save us hundreds of dollars every month.

And speaking of dollars, we are somehow managing to pay our bills, but along with that comes the painful task of scaling down the payroll. Some of our employees are moving on to other prospects. More on that later.

We now have **two building projects** going on, one already underway and the other about to begin, and both are being **paid for by Church Alive! funds**. The renovation of the Saint Teresa school building into office and meeting space is currently in progress, and the elevator for the church will begin within the next few weeks.

And on we merrily go!

IN OTHER NEWS: This year's **Parish Share has been successful**, already surpassing our \$471,000 diocesan assessment by \$32,000. So **from here on, it's all gravy**, we get to keep the rest of whatever comes in, and it will not be assessed as income for next year's Parish Share! These excess funds will help us to **provide the needed repairs and maintenance** for all four of our campuses. To those of you who have given: Thank you for your generosity! And if you haven't yet given to this year's Parish Share: **Now is the time!**....stay tuned for more news....

Respect Life Sunday

October is Respect Life Month, and today is Respect Life Sunday. Our Lady of Mount Carmel Parish is blessed to have all of our previous groups combined into one Respect Life Committee. This dedicated group organizes the Life Chain (mentioned below), the 40 Days for Life prayer vigils, the diaper drive, and a resource table in the narthex at St. Sebastian Church. They also publish a monthly newsletter that is available on our parish website. From womb to tomb and everything in between....*life is a gift!*

Life Chain Today: Today from 2:00—3:00 PM the Pro-Life Committees of Our Lady of Mount Carmel will participate in this national event by meeting at the parking lot of the Great Hall, 1003 Perry Highway at 1:45 pm. The chain will line both sides of the highway and respond to passersby with silent prayer. Please join us as we plead for God's intervention into the horrible slaughter of our youngest brothers and sisters. Signs will be available.

Food Pantry Needs: Juice, peaches, pears, Knorr rice sides (rice only), Uncle Ben's rice, Rice a Roni, hamburger helper, jar pasta sauce, beef stew, Campbell's tomato soup, Progresso Soup, canned carrots, beets, and potatoes, boxed potatoes, applesauce, condiments, jelly, cereal, paper products, dishwashing soap and detergent. We have set out a food collection bin outside of Haber Hall at the St. Sebastian site. You can also drop off donations in the narthex at St. Athanasius Church when it is open, or leave in the bin outside of Athanasian Hall. *Please do not leave any perishable items.* Thank You!

Food Pantry Volunteers: As we have merged our churches, so we also have merged our St. Vincent de Paul groups. Becoming one large Vincentian group with a very large territory has brought many challenges! Our SVDP Food Pantry, located in Haber Hall on the St. Sebastian site, is in need of a few volunteers to help on food pantry distribution days. We are currently using a curb side pick up method. We have pre-bagged food the day before, and then carry out and place in the clients car. Volunteering requires being able to carry bags (which can be a little heavy), and also requires a special attitude of respect and confidentiality. Please contact the Social Ministry office for more information.



Twenty-seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

On the surface, today's readings speak of harvesting grapes in a vineyard. God calls us to work in the vineyard, each doing our part to ensure a good harvest. In the first reading from Isaiah, the vineyard is prepared diligently but ends up being overrun by wild grapes. In Matthew's Gospel, Jesus tells a parable about a vineyard that is commandeered by greedy tenants who abuse and kill the landowner's representatives. In the end, Jesus promises the kingdom of God to those who produce its fruit. Paul encourages the Philippians to do so by continuing to do what they have learned from him. Listen carefully to those wise words offered by St. Paul in the second reading. Even in these very challenging times, we must press on doing what God has called us to do. May we not lose sight of our heavenly goal.

The Twenty-seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time


Although it is the 27th Sunday in ordered time there are rows of people with their pets in arms prepared to celebrate the feast of St. Francis of Assisi on this October 4. I am going to deviate from custom and share a couple of thoughts about St. Francis.

Believers share a certain romance about St. Francis, his time, his life. It is a romance in the sense that Francis' life reads like an Arthurian romance moving from adventure to adventure with the chivalrous hero in the middle being present to all people and their needs. One only needs to search through the internet to find an abundance of resources, stories, poems, little songs and papal prayers to the Troubadour of the Great King.

Today he would have his arms full taking care of the sick and workers due to a powerful virus, help with the fires and flooding, healing the societal division and unrest. I believe he could solve these issues with nothing more than his presence and gospel conviction.

When Francis, toward the end of his life, went to Egypt during the Fifth Crusade seeking martyrdom and the possibility of baptizing the sultan, he experienced a series of encounters with the sultan that had a transformative effect on both men. Together they shared their holy books and stories of faith. They discovered they had more in common with each other than divided them. In history this served as a very rich interreligious dialogue. Malek al-Kamil, the sultan of Egypt, was not baptized, but emerged in friendship with St. Francis with a new awareness about God, faith and each other.

Francis returned to Assisi quite ill. Clare invited him to stay at her convent so that the Sisters could take care of him. Francis stayed outside the convent, sat on a hillside overlooking the beautiful Umbrian valley and completed the Canticle of the Creatures where all God's creation are realized as brother and sister. Francis GOT IT!

Present your needs to God. In the Letter to the Philippians, Paul gives advice for Christian living. Christians are to imitate Christ and to live according to what he has taught them. The harvest would come, not from their worry but from their prayer and trusting labor.

Listen to the Word: As you hear the word proclaimed today, what admonition of Saint Paul's catches your attention? Is there one line that your heart?

Look into Your Life:

Children: What makes you feel restless? What makes you feel peaceful?

Youth: Do you ever thank God for the gifts/talents that you have? Why? Why not? Are there specific ways that you show gratitude to God through the use of your talent?

Adults: What steps do you take to make sure you are doing as Paul directs: "Live according to what you have learned and accepted."

Incarnate the Message: Today's parables teach about God's justice. God's justice calls us to be caretakers of this world and all its gifts. Talk about the importance of stewardship of the earth's resources. Begin by taking a walk or drive to look for signs of good stewardship and signs of poor stewardship. Who is responsible for taking care of the earth's resources? What can we do as a family?... Imagine that your home is God's vineyard. What are you willing to do to help make God's vineyard special? How will you make sure everyone is welcome and treated with love and respect? Be specific!
