Pastor's Perspective

DIFFERENT EVERY YEAR

A couple weeks ago in this column I mentioned the **Church's liturgical calendar**, which begins in Advent, then runs through Christmas, Ordinary Time, then Lent and Easter, back into Ordinary Time, and finally we return to Advent. All in one year! In this way we encounter the **complete mystery of our salvation** every year.

A few days after that article appeared, someone asked me: "Why do we do the same thing over and over again? We know the story; it's not going to change." And of course, they're right. **The story itself doesn't change.** But did you ever read a good book more than once, or watch a favorite movie several times? Did you notice something the second or third time that you hadn't noticed before?

And so it is with the story of our salvation as we hear it over and over again. Every liturgical year we journey through the life, death and resurrection of Christ. **We hear it differently each time** because we are not the same person we were last year, or the year before. Our various experiences, our level of maturity, our prayer life, our physical and emotional health—all these things are constantly changing, one way or another.

Every time we hear the redemption story, **it inspires us in a different way**, not because God's truth changes, but because we are different each time we encounter the biblical stories that we are so familiar with. God's word is always there for us, meeting us where we are and continually transforming each of us into a new and better disciple.

IN OTHER NEWS: Next Sunday begins **Catholic Schools Week**, and there will be various observances taking place all week at **Holy Cross Academy** (on our Saint Sebastian campus), which this year will be tempered by whatever COVID restrictions are in place at the time. Because so many of us—myself included—were educated in Catholic schools for 8 or even 12 years, this is a fitting way to **acknowledge the importance of Catholic Education**. Those who attended Catholic schools are known to do better in high school and in college....Stay tuned for more news....

New Parish Center Now Open



Mass in Car Option Now Available at Three Parish Churches

All Masses now being broadcast at 89.1 FM

Although we at Our Lady of Mount Carmel Parish have been diligent in our efforts to clean and sanitize our church buildings on a continual basis in accordance with COVID-19 guidelines provided by the State of Pennsylvania, Allegheny County and the Diocese of Pittsburgh, we also realize that many of you might still be hesitant to attend Mass during this time. To accommodate you, we're now offering a third option in addition to attending Mass or viewing it online.

Now, most Masses celebrated at St. Athanasius, St. Sebastian and St. Teresa of Avila churches are broadcast via FM transmitter to cars in the parking lots at those churches. Just drive into the lot, find a parking space and tune your radio to 89.1 FM. Please remain in your car during the Mass.

If you plan to receive Holy Communion, please follow these instructions:

1. When the singing of the Lamb of God begins, and *with your mask in place*, enter the church through the main doors. The Ministers of Hospitality will direct you to Communion.
2. After receiving Communion, please return to your vehicle and remain there for the remainder of Mass.



with the Lord.*



FRATELLI TUTTI

What is it? This is the third encyclical written by Pope Francis, signed on October 3, 2020 in Assisi, Italy

What does it propose? It is a social encyclical dedicated to fraternity and social friendship. It treats the universal dimension of the doctrine of fraternal love. Its aim is to put forth a new vision of fraternity and social friendship. It encourages us to dream as a single human family and as fellow travelers sharing the same flesh.

To whom is it addressed? To all persons who will accept this reflection an invitation to dialogue.

How is the encyclical organized? Fratelli Tutti consists of a general introduction and 8 chapters.

Where does the title come from? Fratelli tutti is an expression of Saint Francis of Assisi. The saint used the expression to propose a way of life marked by the flavor of the Gospel. Saint Francis invites all men and women to a love that transcends the barriers of geography and distance.



Lasting love is like taking a lifelong road trip. Many of us get lost during our journey.
