### CUP OR NO CUP?

Several months back, as the effects of Covid began to lessen a bit, **Bishop David Zubik gave all parishes the option of returning to receiving Holy Communion from the cup.** This resulted in a lively discussion among our clergy here, so we decided to hold off for a while because we didn't feel this congregation was ready to make that move yet. We were also aware that no one, up to that time, had inquired about when we might return to receiving the Precious Blood, so there was **not enough of a groundswell to make any changes in our current procedure.**

More recently, however, there have been **exactly two inquiries** about this matter, so we have again discussed it among our clergy, and it seems that there are two different concerns being raised.

**First** is the issue of fear of contamination. People are still reluctant to receive from a common cup, and if you've been observant, you've noticed that at the altar, only the celebrant is receiving from the main chalice.

Our Communion ministers—formally referred to as **Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion**—are also faced with the responsibility of consuming whatever may be left over after they have finished distributing from their cup, and many of them understandably are not yet willing to do this.

**The other issue** is just as difficult: Not all of our Communion ministers have returned to their ministry, so as it is, we are **falling short of having sufficient ministers** just to distribute the Precious Body of the Lord. Distributing the Precious Blood takes many more ministers, in fact twice as many as those now willing to serve.

**IN OTHER NEWS:** Frequently we see people **walking dogs on our various properties**, which is not surprising because we have more than 50 acres, and some of our land makes for easy and relaxing walking, provided no parish event is causing lots of traffic. We like to be good neighbors, and we have no objection to dog-walking, but we need to insist on **two conditions**. First, please **clean up after your pet**. Second, **dogs must always be on a leash** while on our property. Thanks for your cooperation!....Stay tuned for more news....





### First Sunday of Lent

Temptation has been part of the world from the beginning. In the story of creation, humanity's first home is the garden in Eden, with the forbidden tree right in its center. We hear Adam and Eve succumb to the serpent's wiles in this garden of plenty. In its opposite—a barren desert—Jesus uses God's word to resist the temptations of the devil. Paul tells us that Adam and Eve's disobedience brought death into the world, but Jesus' obedience brought life. Let us listen to how the righteousness of truth can defeat the temptation of lies.

### Feast Days

We have an unusual opportunity when it comes to feast day celebrations at Our Lady of Mount Carmel Parish. First and foremost, we have our patronal feast as a *parish* (for which we are canonically established), with the **Feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel on July 16th**. But we also have four *churches*, or worship sites, with their own patron saints or events in the life of Christ. For example, we have the Memorial of Saint Sebastian the Martyr on January 20th, the Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord (our former church on the North Side) on March 25th, the Memorial of Saint Athanasius of Alexandria on May 2nd, the Memorial of Saint Teresa of Avila (also known as Saint Teresa of Jesus) on October 15th, and the Solemnity of the Nativity of the Lord (Incarnation of the Lord) on December 25th. If you look at our roots carefully, you should come up with the number seven. We may have four churches, but our current parish community is composed of seven parishes. Here is the chronological order of origin:



**Saint Teresa of Avila Parish, established in 1867.**

**Annunciation of the Lord Parish, established in 1893.**

**Saint Athanasius Parish, established in 1907.**

**Nativity of Our Lord Parish, established in 1916.**

**Saint Sebastian Parish, established in 1952.**

**Incarnation of the Lord Parish, established in 1993.**

**Our Lady of Mount Carmel Parish, established in 2020.**

It is important to know our roots and to celebrate them. In many ways, a new merger is a new beginning, yes, but it doesn't mean that we have to forget where we came from. In the saints we have heavenly friends, so we can continue to call upon all of our patron saints to help us build this new parish community. Remembering our past can help shape and strengthen our future, especially with our Blessed Mother, Our Lady of Mount Carmel, at the helm.

In addition to our annual celebration of the Feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel on July 16th, we will also celebrate each of our church patrons. ## Faith Formation

After beginning prayer with acknowledging the greatness of God and giving him due adoration, we then should acknowledge our failings. As we realize the perfection and glory of God, it's impossible not to see our own imperfections and weaknesses. So after adoration, it's helpful to move into a period of self-examination and confession: What have we done or failed to do that harms our relationship with God and others? Where have we sinned? Where have we struggled with temptation? How might we do better next time, with God's help?

To be clear, this *shouldn't* be a time to wallow in guilt over our sins. The point of confession is to repent (which means to turn away) from our sins, not to despair or to fall into self-loathing. But a great danger we face in our culture is to continually justify our sins by making excuses ("I was tired"), minimizing the offense ("lots of people do it"), or even recasting our sinful behavior as a righteous act ("he deserved it"). The moral relativism of our times enables us to justify ourselves whenever we wish, which is why it is so important to measure ourselves to an objective standard. Only by seeing as God sees can we love as God loves us, and has called us to love others. Only by acknowledging our failures honestly can we start on the path of communion with God.

Challenge: Think of the last time you did something wrong. Have you honestly apologized to the person you hurt, without excuses?
