

#### From the desk of the Administrator

In the midst of the craziness of these days, the other week added an additional layer of crazy, the phone system! See, the conversion to our new system began two weeks ago. It was NOT as smooth as it was hoped to be. Main lines were "down" and the new system was trying to handle things that don't officially exist yet. I do apologize for this. I hope by the time you read this that we are back to "normal" with the phones. If not, please be patient. It is a work in progress.

And speaking of work in progress, I want to update you on the merger process. I recently submitted the petitions, signed by each Parish Pastoral and Finance Council member, for the merging of our parishes. A petition was required from each parish to merge with the other three. Through another letter, I petitioned Bishop Zubik for the new name of the PARISH entity from the Parish Assembly Feedback. After a summation of the process of naming, I wrote the following:

Therefore, on behalf of these parish communities, I submit the following names:

1. Most Holy Name of Mary. We do realize that this name may confuse people as we neighbor Most Holy Name of Jesus, Troy Hill, part of the Shrines of Pittsburgh.

#### 2. Saint Matthew.

3. Saint Vincent de Paul. We do realize that this name may also confuse people as they may think of the charitable St. Vincent de Paul Society.

#### 4. Saint Monica.

#### 5. Queenship of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

This was the rank order from the 534 responses received. The naming now lies in the Bishop's hands. My thought is that once we do have a name, we should think of participating in a novena or some prayer services seeking the intercession of our new patron leading up to January 4<sup>th</sup>, the date the merger is official. Stay tuned.

One last piece of information from the Feedback Form was the ranking of the adequacy of the Parish Assembly Video. It was at 2.24 on the scale of 1 (Very inadequate) to 3 (very adequate). Thanks for viewing! See you at the Eucharistic Table!! **Fr. Jim Gretz**

#### **Evangelization (in the) 101**

We need to allow the Word of God to create in us a fervent desire. A fire that burns so hot, we are compelled to share this news with those around us. At Pentecost when the Holy Spirit came down upon the Apostles, He was manifested as "tongues of fire". Like any good fire however, the furnace within us needs to be tended. Jesus understood that and He provided us the most valuable resource at the Last Supper, the Holy Eucharist. During the Liturgy, the bread and wine is transformed into the Body and Blood of our Lord. When this is happening, we should pay close attention to the Eucharist. By fixating on it, we allow the grace that pours forth from it to permeate our being. Remember, Jesus Christ is the Eucharist! At communion we receive the actual body and blood of our Lord.

In Grouping #101, we have the advantage of daily adoration. Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday, we can come into the chapel at St. Bonaventure for a little "one on one" with Jesus. Nothing needs said. He knows what we all need. We just need to be receptive to it. Just like the lyrics of the old sixties song, "We might just find, if we look inside, that we got just what we need.

The Blessed Virgin Mary is probably the best evangelizer the world has ever known, having brought to Christ and his Church far more people than anyone else. She has made a lot more than nine million converts over the centuries. The apparitions of Our Lady of Guadalupe brought practically all of Latin America out of paganism and into the Catholic faith.

St. Robert Bellarmine said the ultimate goal of evangelization, is entering into the joy of Our Lord, beginning now and lasting for all eternity. He writes: "It is not said, 'May the joy of the Lord enter you, but 'you enter into the joy of the Lord.' This is a proof that the joy will be greater than we can conceive. We shall enter

into a great sea of divine and eternal joy, which will fill us within and without, and surround us on all sides."

This is what is ours in Christ, and this is what we can offer to the world.

#### **2021 Regular Mass intentions**

Beginning 11/3, we will open THE Mass book for 2021 intentions, as we will be one Parish next year. Mass intentions for all four of our church buildings will need to be scheduled through Nancy Ackerman at St. Bonaventure, either in person or by phone. You MUST schedule an appointment to schedule Masses. This is for two reasons. The first is to enforce physical distancing if you plan to come in person. Masks will be required for your in-person appointment. The second is to assure that Nancy is not overwhelmed with people and callers simultaneously. M-F 7:30-3:30; Holy Spirit and St. Aloysius, Tuesday and Thursday, 10:00 AM to 2:00 PM;, . When it comes time for your actual appointment, you will be meeting in person or discussing it over the phone with Nancy Ackerman at St. Bonaventure. All Mass intention stipend payments should be made out to "St. Bonaventure Church" until December 31, 2020. After January 4, 2021, Mass request checks would be made payable to our new Parish name. A Mass intention request form is included in THIS bulletin as well as posted on our Grouping website. Please feel free to use that form to request an intention.


#### **White Cross Memorial**

The white cross display for the Month of October on the St. Bonaventure lawn is a stark and terrible reminder that Americans have allowed the killing of at least 3,000 unborn babies every day, adding up to over 61 million abortions since 1973.

#### **PARISH LIFE**

**BAPTISM**: Prior registration is necessary. A formation session for parents is also required. Call the appropriate parish office for details.

**RECONCILIATION**: See the front cover page for times in our grouping. Other times are available by appointment.

**FIRST COMMUNION**: First Holy Communion is usually celebrated in the Spring. Children candidates are expected to be enrolled in the parish faith formation program. Contact the particular parish's faith formation office for details and registration.

**HOME BOUND:** Upon request, Holy Communion can be brought to the home by the Priest, Deacon, or extraordinary minister of Holy Communion. Contact the parish's office for details.

**CONFIRMATION**: Children preparing for confirmation are expected to be enrolled in the parish faith formation program. Any adult (over 18) should contact the particular parish's faith formation office for details and registration.

MARRIAGE: Potential couples wishing to be married in the Catholic Church must contact the Priest or Deacon at least six months before the desired date. No date can be guaranteed until the couple has met with one of the parish priests. Please start with contacting the Priest or Deacon you wish to witness your marriage.

THE SACRAMENT OF THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK: This sacrament is administered by a Priest and is preferred when the recipient is aware of its healing power. Communal Anointing of the Sick Masses are offered during the year - in the fall and in the spring in one of our churches.

**RCIA**: The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is open to any adult interested in becoming a Roman Catholic Christian through a program of formation and prayer. Call the parish's faith formation office for details and registration.

**PARISH MEMBERSHIP**: New parishioners are always welcome! Call the parish's office for a census form.

#### CHILD PROTECTIVE SERVICES LAW

Any individuals, paid or volunteer, who come into contact with children in the course of his or her work are considered mandated reporters of child abuse. Mandated reporters having reasonable cause to believe that a child has been subjected to child abuse, or acts of child abuse, shall report immediately to the following agencies:

- If you suspect a child is in imminent danger from abuse, please call 911 immediately.

Anyone making a report is immune from civil or criminal liability provided a report is made in good faith.
