



From the Desk of the Pastor

A couple of clean-up items to begin this week. They are as follows:

I had a wonderful, restful vacation. The travel by car went very well. I binge-watched some TV and did a few errands with my friends. It was great to get away. However, as I tease, for every day I was away, it will take two days to catch-up with everything. Therefore, business will return to normal in February!!!

As you saw in last week's bulletin, I would call our participation in "Millvale Days" quite a success. Thanks to all who made it happen. I did have fun helping each day. I bet we can make next year bigger and better with some more planning. Please join in the fun.

I also understand through the good grapevine that all of the events around St. Matthew Day were also successful. Those who came to the Bible Study with Fr. John Marcucci thoroughly enjoyed it. He shared that he had 100 copies of the first week's outline. By the end, he only had two! So, almost 100 people came to his presentations over the four weeks. Those who came to the Solemn Sung Evening Prayer were also blessed by the small choir that gathered and Fr. Adam Potter's reflection on St. Matthew. All praise to God and thanks to St. Matthew's intercession for a great first St. Matthew Day!

As required in Canon Law, Priests and Deacons are to do a spiritual retreat. Those are on the horizon for Fr. Mazurek and I. He will be off to St. Paul Monastery 25-28 October. I will be back to my spiritual roots at St. Meinrad from 18-22 October. Know our prayers during these times away.

Perhaps some continuing thoughts on Eucharistic Theology could conclude this week's column. I have mentioned concomitance, the presence of the Body and Blood of Christ in both the Consecrated Host and Precious Blood. I have mentioned it in terms of the Communion Line and in the physical building as well as in exposition and adoration. Perhaps there is yet another sense of it.

I believe there is Eucharistic concomitance in the Eucharist received and the Eucharist reserved. The late great televangelist Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen used to say that upon receiving Communion, one should spend an hour in silent prayer afterwards. He was suggesting spending time focused on the Christ now in your body. I've teased that he didn't have any real responsibilities and had the time to do so! Yet, it should cause us to reflect on what we have received and our focus on the Lord within us, not so much on the Particles reserved in the tabernacle for distribution to the sick and for adoration. The minister returning the Hosts to the tabernacle (whether clergy or lay person) is required to offer a genuflection before closing the tabernacle doors. I'm not so sure that genuflection is required by the other liturgical ministers or members of the congregation. I just throw that out there as some fodder for consideration.



White Cross Memorial



As we observe Respect Life and Holy Rosary month this October, we remember that we have allowed the killing of at least 62 million unborn babies since 1973. The white crosses on the St. Bonaventure Church lawn

represent the 3,000 children slaughtered each day in the United States of America. St. Mother Teresa told us "The greatest destroyer of peace today is abortion, because it is a war against the child, a direct killing of the innocent child."

Abortion supporters challenge the right to life, not only supporting the killing, but using the bodies of aborted children for medical research. Over the past years, vile fetal experiments have come to light, some at our own University of Pittsburgh. The PA Family Institute recently reported that an investigation will be taking place. This information can be found at Pitt.Exposed.com.

There is hope for our nation as pro-lifers continue the struggle to help desperate mothers through material and spiritual support. A recent hopeful development was the passage of the Texas "heartbeat" law, which bans abortion after 6 weeks of pregnancy.

For those suffering because of abortion, there is help, forgiveness, and healing. Some resources are AbortionForgiveness.com, RachelsVineyard.org, Women's Choice Network and Lifeline of SW PA.

Please pray especially during this month of the Most Holy Rosary, for an end to abortion and a renewed respect for human life.

One of our valuable lessons learned over the past few generations is that people with similar pain can be very good for each other. The expansive growth of AA is probably the largest example, but there are many others. Our discussion will be framed by the video, "Among the Many." We will strive to offer hope to anyone grieving such a tragic loss. Our weekly meetings will begin on Tuesday, November 2, at 7:00 pm and will be held at the Venerable Matthew Talbot Center for Healing and Hope located at 2599 Freeport Road in Harmar. 

 Shape our search for peace and justice through prophetic deed and word.






