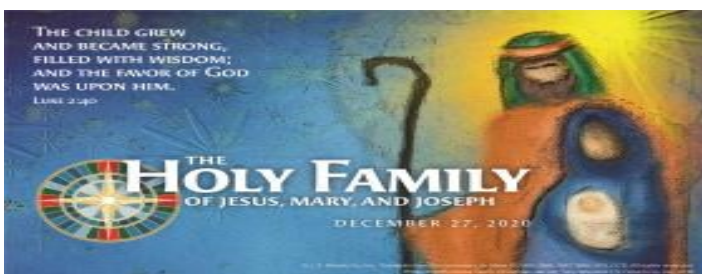
WE ARE GOD'S HOLY FAMILY

The scriptures of Israel are filled with many stories of barren couples who were miraculously granted the gift of children by God. Surely the best known among these is the first reading from today, from which Luke took inspiration when he recounted the miraculous birth of John the Baptist to Zechariah and Elizabeth, and the more miraculous birth of Jesus to Mary and Joseph. In each instance, we are given examples or role models of those who trusted in God. More than examples of those who trust, they are models of self-surrender. They abandoned their own presuppositions and prejudices about the workings of the world and turned their lives over to belief in a God who can make life grow where none ought to; a God who can turn death around into a new and unimagined life; a God who can, today, take a tiny child of humble parents in an insignificant town and make him into a light for all the world. This is what we, as God's holy family, are called to do each day: to trust not in ourselves and the way we think things should be, but to open ourselves and surrender ourselves in faith to a God of endless promise.

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SOMOS LA SAGRADA FAMILIA DE DIOS

Las lecturas de Israel están repletas de relatos de parejas estériles a quienes Dios les concedió el milagro de tener hijos. Sin duda el relato más conocido es el de la primera lectura de hoy: Lucas se inspiró en este relato para contar el milagroso nacimiento de Juan Bautista, hijo de Zacarías e Isabel, y el nacimiento aun más milagroso de Jesús, hijo de María y José. En ambos casos, vemos ejemplos o modelos a seguir de personas que confiaron en Dios. Más que ser ejemplos de personas que confiaron, son modelos de entrega incondicional de sí. Abandonaron sus propios preconceptos y prejuicios sobre el funcionamiento del mundo y entregaron sus vidas a creer en un Dios que puede hacer que haya vida en lugares en donde era inconcebible que la hubiera; un Dios que puede convertir la muerte en una vida nueva e inimaginable; un Dios que puede, hoy, tomar a un niño de padres humildes en un pueblo insignificante y convertirlo en una luz para el mundo entero. Esto es a lo que se nos llama a hacer cada día como Sagrada Familia de Dios: confiar no sólo en nosotros mismos y en la manera en que pensamos que deberían ser las cosas, sino a abrirnos y entregarnos en fe a un Dios de promesa infinita. PASTOR'S MESSAGE — Matthew Cormier

THE GRACE OF A HAPPY DEATH

"Now, Master, you may let your servant go in peace, according to your word, for my eyes have seen your salvation..."

These words of Blessed Simeon upon seeing the Christ-child in the Temple are prayed by everyone who prays the Prayer of the Church, the Liturgy of the Hours. They are part of the Gospel canticle in the final hour of the day, Night Prayer. Before praying this canticle, we pray "Into your hands, Lord, I commend my spirit". Night Prayer is concluded with the blessing, "May the all-powerful Lord grant us a restful night and a peaceful death". This is similar to the simple bedtime prayer that many of you probably learned as children: "Now I lay me down to sleep. I pray the Lord my soul to keep. If I should die before I wake, I pray to God my soul to take."

On this Sunday within the Octave of Christmas, the Church places before us the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph which is a good opportunity to reflect upon what the Church calls a "happy death". Can there be such a thing? Absolutely. Catholics have a rich tradition of prayers asking for the grace of a happy death. Many of these prayers invoke the Holy Family. One example: "Jesus, Mary, and Joseph, I give you my heart and my soul. Jesus, Mary, and Joseph, assist me in my last agony. Jesus, Mary, and Joseph, may I breathe forth my soul in peace with you."

Now we do not know the hour of our death. This is why we must always be prepared. This is why frequent confession can be a good thing. Oddly, this time of year, right around Christmas is when we seem to have the most funerals which makes it the time of year that priests are called upon to administer the Last Rites and prepare someone's soul for a happy death. These Last Rites are actually three sacraments: Penance, Anointing of the Sick, and Viaticum (Holy Communion as "Food for the Journey"). There is a common and dangerous misconception that the priest should not be summoned until the patient is about draw their last breath. **When a loved one is terminally ill, do NOT wait until the last possible moment to call for the priest!!!** Firstly, because he may not be able to get there in time and the sacraments are only for the living. Secondly, if possible, we should be able to make a good confession, receive the Anointing of the Sick, and receive Our Blessed Lord one last time in Holy Communion while still conscience. Viaticum is called "the last sacrament of the Christian". When death appears imminent, the priest gives the Apostolic Pardon for the Dying. This is a plenary indulgence that remits all punishment due for sin, in this life, and in the next.

In those moments, the soul can truly say with Simeon "Now, Master, you may let your servant go in peace...". In such moments, we can trust that Mary and Joseph are there waiting to bring the soul home to Jesus and intercede before Him for that soul in the hour of judgment. May the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph be with us in the hour of our death. May we, like Simeon, behold the face of Christ and say "Now, Master, you may let your servant go in peace, according to your word, for my eyes have seen your salvation".

MENSAJE DEL PARROCO— Matthew Cormier

LA GRACIA DE UNA MUERTE FELIZ

"Ahora, maestro, puedes dejar que tu siervo se vaya en paz, según su palabra, porque mis ojos han visto tu salvación..."

Estas palabras del Beato Simeón al ver al Cristo-niño en el Templo son rezadas por todos los que oran la Oración de la Iglesia, la Liturgia de las horas. Son parte del cántico del Evangelio en la última hora del día, la oración nocturna. Antes de orar este cántico, oramos "En tus manos, Señor, encomiendo mi espíritu". La oración nocturna concluye con la bendición, "Que el Señor todopoderoso nos conceda una noche tranquila y una muerte pacífica". Esto es similar a la simple oración a la hora de acostarse que seguramente muchos de ustedes aprendieron cuando eran niños: "Ahora me acuesto a dormir. Ruego al Señor que guarde mi alma. Si muero antes de despertar, ruego a Dios que tome mi alma".

En este domingo, en la Octava Navidad, la Iglesia nos sitúa ante la Sagrada Familia de Jesús, María y José, que es una buena oportunidad para reflexionar sobre lo que la Iglesia llama una "muerte feliz". ¿puede haber algo así? Absolutamente. Los católicos tienen una rica tradición de oraciones pidiendo la gracia de una muerte feliz. Muchas de estas oraciones invocan a la Sagrada Familia. Un ejemplo: "Jesús, María y José, te doy mi corazón y mi alma. Jesús, María y José, me ayudan en mi última agonía. Jesús, María y José, que yo exhale mi alma en paz contigo."

Ahora no sabemos la hora de nuestra muerte. Por eso siempre debemos estar preparados. Esta es la razón por la que la confesión frecuente puede ser algo bueno, curiosamente, en esta época del año, justo alrededor de Navidad es cuando parece que tenemos la mayoría de los funerales, lo que hace que sea la época del año en que los sacerdotes están llamados a administrar los últimos ritos y preparar el alma de alguien para una muerte feliz. Estos últimos ritos son en realidad tres sacramentos: Penitencia, Unción de los enfermos, y Viaticum (la Santa Comunión como "alimento para el viaje"). Hay una idea errónea común y peligrosa de que el sacerdote no debe ser convocado hasta que el paciente está a punto de dar su último aliento. **Cuando un ser querido está enfermo terminalmente, NO espere hasta el último posible momento para llamar al sacerdote!!** En primer lugar, porque no puede llegar allí a tiempo y los sacramentos son sólo para los vivos. En segundo lugar, si es posible debemos ser capaces de hacer una buena confesión, recibir la Unción de los Enfermos, y recibir a Nuestro Santísimo Señor una última vez en la Santa Comunión mientras aún tenemos conciencia. Viaticum es llamado "el último sacramento del Cristiano". Cuando la muerte parece inminente, el sacerdote da el perdón apostólico para los moribundos. Esta es una indulgencia plenaria que remite todo castigo debido por el pecado, en esta vida y en la siguiente.

En esos momentos, el alma puede decir con Simeón: "Ahora, Maestro, puedes dejar que tu siervo se vaya en paz...". En esos momentos, podemos confiar en que María y José están allí esperando para traer el alma a casa de Jesús e interceder ante él por esa alma en la hora del juicio. Que la Sagrada Familia de Jesús, María y José estén con nosotros en la hora de nuestra muerte. Que nosotros, como Simeón, contemplemos el rostro de Cristo y digamos: "Ahora, Maestro, deja que tu siervo se vaya en paz, según tu palabra, porque mis ojos han visto tu salvación".

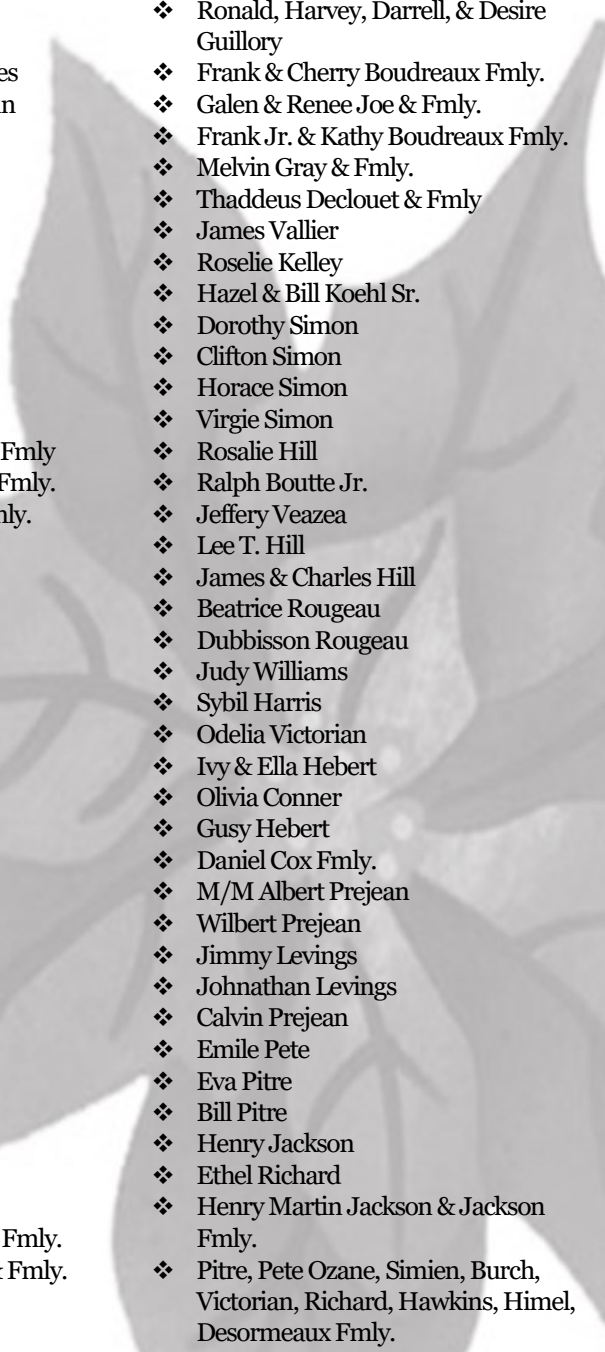

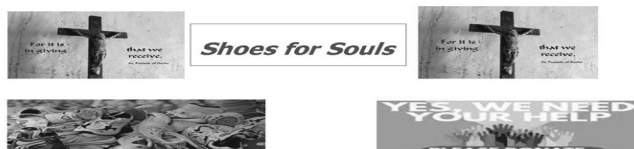
