GOD'S MERCY

Today's reading from the second book of Chronicles contains a sort of "mini-history" of Israel. It highlights God's mercies in choosing Cyrus the Persian to be an instrument of deliverance when the people were in captivity in Babylon. Despite their sinfulness and the deserved punishment they were undergoing, God's mercy was lavished on the people in the form of a miraculous act of liberation. The Letter to the Ephesians, in much more theological terms, gives a similar account of a God "who brought us to life with Christ—by grace you have been saved." The author stresses that it was when we were "dead in our transgressions" that God saved us, an act of pure grace. He emphasizes that it is not our own efforts that freed us from sin ("this is not from you"); rather, "it is the gift of God." This, of course, is the heart of the entire Pauline corpus, that salvation comes to us by faith in God's mercy, revealed in the death of Jesus. Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.

LA MISERICORDIA DE DIOS

La lectura de hoy del libro de las Crónicas contiene una especie de "breve historia" de Israel, que pone de relieve la misericordia de Dios en la elección de Ciro el persa para ser instrumento de liberación cuando el pueblo estaba en cautiverio en Babilonia. A pesar de su pecado y el castigo merecido al que estaban siendo sometidos, la misericordia de Dios se prodigó en el pueblo en forma de un acto milagroso de liberación.

La Carta a los Efesios, en términos mucho más teológicos, da una versión similar de un Dios "que nos dio la vida con Cristo y en Cristo [y] por pura generosidad suya, hemos sido salvados". El autor hace hincapié en que era cuando estábamos "muertos por nuestros pecados" que Dios nos salvó, un acto de pura gracia. Hace hincapié en que no es nuestro propio esfuerzo que nos ha liberado del pecado ("esto no se debe a ustedes mismos"); sino que "es un don de Dios". Esto, por supuesto, es el corazón de todos los escritos paulinos, que la salvación nos llega por la fe en la misericordia de Dios, revelado en la muerte de Jesús. Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.

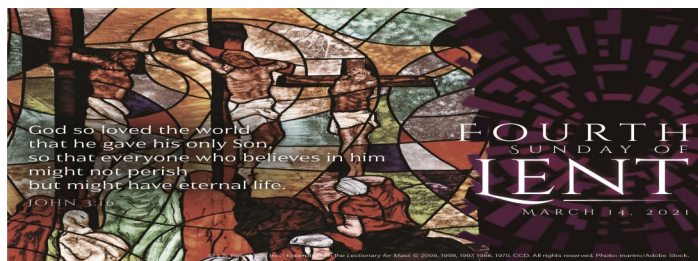

PARROQUIAL VICAR'S MESSAGE — FR. JOSEPH CARAWAY

Patron of the Universal Church

On December 8, 2020, Pope Francis released an Apostolic letter *Patris Corde* ("with a Father's Heart") to mark the 150th anniversary of St. Joseph being declared as the Patron of the Universal Church. Pope Pius IX recognized his intercessory power and in 1870 declared him our universal protector. It is important for us to always seek out the intercessory prayers of this powerful saint, but this year in particular, Mother Church ask us to give special attention to St. Joseph.

With the feast day quickly approaching this week, March 19, I encourage all families to take time to celebrate this Solemnity of St. Joseph. In a world where families are torn apart and the Church is heavily persecuted, we need, more than ever, the intercession of St. Joseph. God entrusted to his care the greatest gifts he has offered the world, Mary and Jesus. If God entrusted to him the responsibility of protecting the Holy Family, then he can certainly protect our families if we invite him.

One of the oldest traditions connected to celebrating this Solemnity comes from the Sicilians in the 1500s. The entire country was suffering from a severe famine and a drought was destroying their crops. The people prayed to Saint Joseph for help and when their prayers were answered, in gratitude, they held a banquet with tables of food for the poor and those who were in need. The tables of food became known as a St. Joseph Altar and the Church gives a particular prayer to bless these altars. Many families here in the diocese still celebrate the feast of St. Joseph in these traditional ways. I invite everyone to join in the Solemnity by attending Mass and make a small altar in their home. The past several months has had many challenges, it is time to pause and make an altar of gratitude for what we do have in our life.

It is custom for the altar to have candles, flowers, bread, wine, fava beans, cakes, cookies, etc., but the altar would not have meat due to the feast falling within Lent. However, the Church recognizes this as a Solemnity which is the highest of feast and means that it is a day for celebration. It is a time to take a break from the Lenten fast in honor of a saint that not only protected the Holy Family but watches over and intercedes for our protection.

At the end of the Apostolic Letter *Patris Corde*, Pope Francis gives us a pray to St. Joseph that I would like to leave you all to pray:

*Hail, Guardian of the Redeemer,
Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary.
To you God entrusted his only Son;
in you Mary placed her trust;
with you Christ became man.*

*Blessed Joseph, to us too,
show yourself a father
and guide us in the path of life.
Obtain for us grace, mercy and courage,
and defend us from every evil. Amen.*

MENSAJE DEL VICARIO PARROQUIAL— P. JOSEPH CARAWAY

Patrón de la Iglesia Universal

El 8 de diciembre de 2020, el Papa Francisco publicó una carta apostólica *Patris Corde* ("con corazón de padre") para conmemorar el 150 aniversario de la declaración de San José como Patrón de la Iglesia Universal. El Papa Pío IX reconoció su poder de intercesión y en 1870 lo declaró nuestro protector universal. Es importante que busquemos siempre las oraciones de intercesión de este poderoso santo, pero este año en particular, la Madre Iglesia nos pide que prestemos especial atención a San José.

Ahora que la fiesta se acerca rápidamente esta semana, el 19 de marzo, animo a todas las familias a dedicar tiempo a celebrar esta solemnidad de San José. En un mundo en el que las familias están desgarradas y la Iglesia es fuertemente perseguida, necesitamos, más que nunca, la intercesión de San José. Dios confió a su cuidado los mayores dones que ofreció al mundo, María y Jesús. Si Dios le confió la responsabilidad de proteger a la Sagrada Familia, ciertamente puede proteger a nuestras familias si lo invitamos.

Una de las tradiciones más antiguas relacionadas con la celebración de esta solemnidad proviene de los sicilianos en el año 1500. Todo el país sufría una grave hambruna y una sequía que destruía sus cosechas. La gente rezó a San José para que les ayudara y, cuando sus oraciones fueron atendidas, en agradecimiento, celebraron un banquete con mesas de comida para los pobres y los necesitados. Las mesas de comida se conocieron como Altar de San José y la Iglesia da una oración particular para bendecir estos altares. Muchas familias aquí en la diócesis todavía celebran la fiesta de San José de estas maneras tradicionales. Invito a todos a unirse a la solemnidad asistiendo a la misa y a hacer un pequeño altar en su casa. Los meses pasados han tenido muchos retos, es tiempo de hacer una pausa y hacer un altar de gratitud por lo que tenemos en nuestra vida.

Es costumbre que el altar tenga velas, flores, pan, vino, habas, pasteles, galletas, etc., pero el altar no tendría carne debido a que la fiesta cae dentro de la Cuaresma. Sin embargo, la Iglesia la reconoce como una solemnidad, que es la más alta de las fiestas y significa que es un día de celebración. Es un momento para hacer una pausa en el ayuno cuaresmal en honor a un santo que no sólo protegió a la Sagrada Familia sino que vela e intercede por nuestra protección.

Al final de la Carta Apostólica *Patris Corde*, el Papa Francisco nos regala una oración a San José que me gustaría dejaros a todos rezando:

Salve, Guardián del Redentor,
Esposo de la Santísima Virgen María.
A ti Dios confió a su único Hijo;
en ti puso María su confianza;
contigo Cristo se hizo hombre.

Bendito José, también para nosotros
muéstrate como padre
y guíanos en el camino de la vida.
Obtén para nosotros gracia, misericordia y valor
y defiéndenos de todo mal. Amén.

LENTEN REGULATIONS

Since this coming Friday, March 19th, is the Solemnity of St. Joseph, the Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Catholics are not obligated to abstain from meat. Canon 1251 of the Code of Canon Law states; "Abstinence from eating meat or some other food according to the prescripts of the conference of bishops is to be observed on every Friday of the year unless a Friday occurs on a day listed as a solemnity."

Bishop Provost's Guidance on COVID Vaccines:

It is morally evil that the cells of aborted children are used in the production of vaccines. It is unfortunate that all publicly available vaccines for COVID-19 have some connection to abortion-derived cell lines. The vaccines from Pfizer and Moderna are not produced using materials connected to abortion-derived cell lines, although they did make use of them in ancillary testing. The vaccine from Johnson and Johnson is produced using material connected to abortion-derived cell lines, and thus it is more morally problematic than the alternatives. When given the choice, a Catholic that makes an informed decision to be inoculated should choose from vaccines with the least connection to abortion.

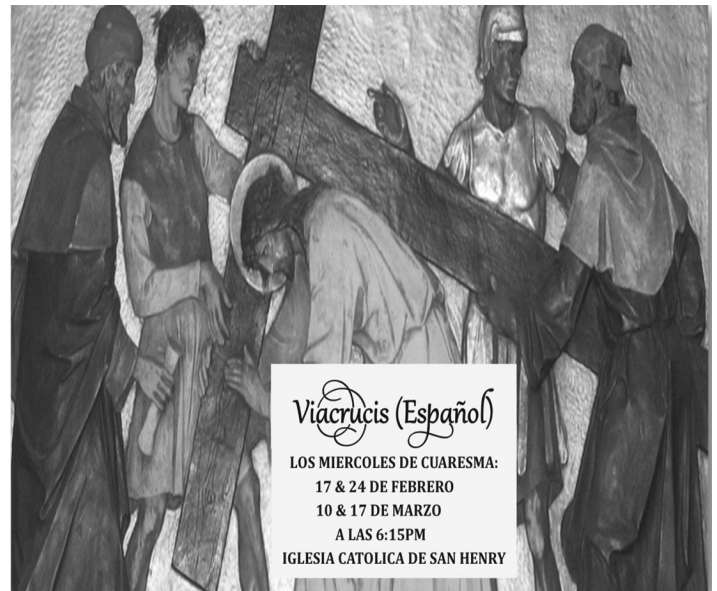
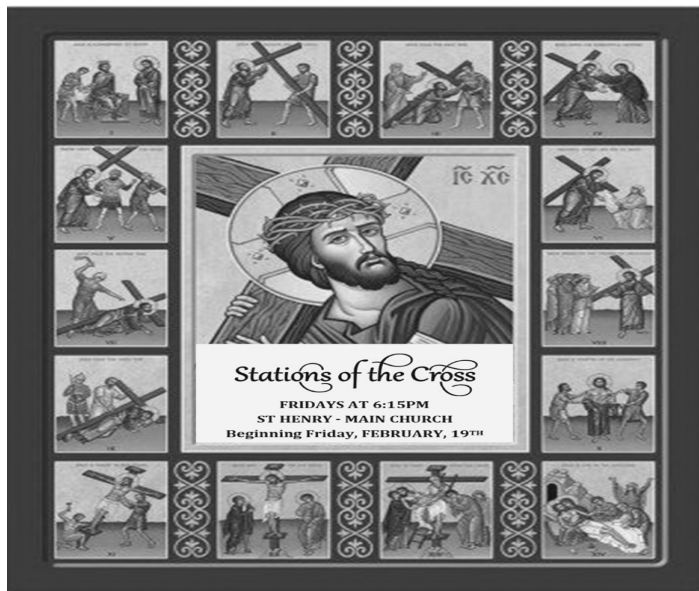

- ♦ The exchanging of the Sign of Peace is temporarily suspended.
- ♦ No hand holding during the Our Father. This is not a part of Catholic Liturgical tradition and should be avoided regardless.
- ♦ Holy Communion may be brought by deacons/priests to the **homebound upon request**.
- ♦ **Gloves cannot** be worn while receiving Holy Communion *in the hand*. The ministers will **not** place Our Lord on gloves. Particles of the Sacred Host can too easily stick to gloves.

RECORDATORIOS SOBRE LA PANDEMIA

- ♦ Si usted o alguien de su hogar está enfermo, no asista a Misa.
- ♦ Las fuentes de agua bendita fueron vaciadas. El Agua Bendita es dada en pequeñas botellas que están en cada entrada. Por favor, limiten una por familia.
- ♦ Para mantener el distanciamiento social, por favor no se sienten en las bancas cerradas con cintas. Por favor, no retire ni manipule las cintas.
- ♦ Mantengan el barbijo, especialmente cuando estén cerca de otras personas.
- ♦ Por favor evite tocar superficies innecesariamente. Todos los agarradores de las puertas se desinfectan después de cada Misa.
- ♦ No comparta misales en las bancas. Si desea que su propio misal traiga el suyo consigo a misa, puede recoger uno del Salón Comunitario durante horarios de oficina. Limítense a uno por familia.
- ♦ El intercambio del Saludo de Paz se suspende temporalmente.
- ♦ No agarrarse de las manos durante la oración del Padre Nuestro. Esto no forma parte de la tradición litúrgica católica y debe evitarse de todas maneras.
- ♦ La Santa Comunión puede ser llevada por diáconos/sacerdotes **a las personas confinadas en sus casas, según previa solicitud**.
- ♦ **No** deben usarse **guantes** cuando se recibe la Santa Comunión *en la mano*. Los ministros **no** pondrán a Nuestro Señor sobre guantes. Partículas de la Sagrada Hostia pueden pegarse fácilmente en los guantes.
