GOD CHOSE US

Who chose first, God or you? That is the question explored in today's three readings. The second reading, from Paul's Letter to the Ephesians, reads almost like a hymn. It praises God for choosing us, for calling us to serve, and for blessing us in our service. Paul makes it clear how honored we are and how special is the call to live as children of God. This is through no doing of our own.

The first reading and the Gospel use prose rather than poetry to describe the same truth: God did the choosing, not us. When the prophet Amos was berated for being a prophet, he retorted that the whole thing wasn't his idea in the first place. Neither did the twelve apostles in today's Gospel ask for their calling. Cuando el profeta Amós fue criticado por ser un profeta, respondió que, en primer lugar, el asunto no era su idea. Tampoco los doce apóstoles en el Evangelio de hoy pidieron su llamado. PASTOR'S MESSAGE — Matthew Cormier

Report from the USCCB Spring Meeting: June 2021

Bishop Glen John Provost, Diocese of Lake Charles

I would like to share with you, the faithful of the Diocese of Lake Charles, some reflections on the recent Spring General Assembly of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, conducted via remote means, and to clarify an issue that excited much discussion and media attention.

Teaching document on reception of Eucharist

One item involved approving the request of the USCCB Committee on Doctrine to proceed with the drafting of a formal statement on the meaning of the Eucharist in the life of the Church. The bishops of the Committee on Doctrine judged this document timely, because of the return of the faithful to regular church attendance following the pandemic lockdowns. As well, the Committee was concerned that various surveys indicate a substantial deficit in the faithful's understanding of the Eucharist. There was some opposition to drafting this document. It was, however, apparent to many of us that to argue over the contents of a document which had not yet been written, for which only a draft outline existed, was premature. The Committee assured us that the intention of the document was to instruct. I was very much in favor of the Committee continuing with its work. An issue surfaced, mainly fueled by the media and overreactive commentators, concerning the denial of Holy Communion to those "who obstinately persist in manifest grave sin" (Canon 915). The Canon Law of the Church which governs the behavior of Her members is clear in this matter. There is a procedure to be followed, in consistency with the Gospel mandates (cf. Matthew 18:15-18) and the apostolic teaching of St. Paul (cf. I Corinthians 11:27-29). All is done to assist with the conversion of heart which is necessary for the communicant in the Eucharist. The approach is truthful, honest, and forthcoming. For those of us from Louisiana old enough to remember, Archbishop Joseph Rummel of New Orleans in 1962 excommunicated a public official who had in a "manifest" way stood in opposition to the desegregation of Catholic Schools in the Archdiocese. The Archbishop's actions are still viewed as heroic.

Advancement of cause for canonization for Southwest La. Priest

The example of heroism also came to the USCCB with a request from Bishop Deshotel of Lafayette. I had the privilege of endorsing, along with Archbishop Timothy Broglio, an effort by the Bishop of Lafayette to advance the cause for canonization for the Servant of God, Father Joseph Verbis Lafleur. Bishop Deshotel initiated this request for the support of the Catholic bishops of the United States, a measure required by the canonical process. I joined my endorsement to Archbishop Broglio's because for eight years as a young priest, I was assigned to the parish where Father Lafleur served exemplarily in the late 1930's. When the bishop assigned me to the parish in the 1970's, there remained certain older parishioners who recalled with great affection Father Lafleur's service to the parish. Before the bombardment of Pearl Harbor and the entry of the United States into World War II, Father Lafleur entered the chaplaincy to the armed services. The Japanese incarcerated him as a prisoner of war, where this young priest from Southwest Louisiana endeared himself to the other prisoners, never abandoning them, caring for them, sharing his rations, and comforting them in prayer. In transfer on an unmarked Japanese ship, he died trying to rescue prisoners when the vessel was sunk by a torpedo. He posthumously received some of the highest decorations, including the Purple Heart and the Distinguished Service Medal. He was truly a heroic priest and an example of what it means to give up one's life for the sheep. Other items appeared before the Conference, but I thought these two would be of particular interest to you. Please keep the bishops in your prayers. These are challenging times which require great discernment. In remaining open to the authentic teaching of the Church and to the Holy Spirit which guides us still, I am confident that we will constructively address these challenges.

Del Reporte de la USCCB Reunión de Primavera: Junio 2021

Bishop Glen John Provost, Diócesis de Lake Charles

Quisiera compartir con ustedes, los fieles de la Diócesis de Lake Charles, algunas reflexiones sobre la reciente Asamblea General de Primavera de la Conferencia de Obispos Católicos de los Estados Unidos, realizada por medios remotos, y aclarar un tema que ha entusiasmado mucho la discusión y la atención de los medios de comunicación.

Documento didáctico sobre el recibir la Eucaristía

Un punto implicaba la aprobación de la solicitud del Comité de Doctrina de la USCCB de proceder a la redacción de una declaración formal sobre el significado de la Eucaristía en la vida de la Iglesia. Los obispos del Comité de Doctrina juzgaron oportuno este documento, debido al regreso de los fieles a la asistencia regular de la iglesia después de los cierres pandémicos. Asimismo, al Comité le preocupaba que diversos estudios indicaran un déficit sustancial en la comprensión de la Eucaristía por parte de los fieles. Hubo cierta oposición a la redacción de este documento. Sin embargo, a muchos de nosotros nos parecía evidente que era prematuro discutir sobre el contenido de un documento que aún no se había redactado, para el que sólo existía un proyecto de esbozo. El Comité nos aseguró que la intención del documento era instruir. Estoy muy a favor de que el Comité continúe con su labor.

Surgió un problema, impulsado principalmente por los medios de comunicación y comentaristas reactivos, sobre la negación de la Santa Comunión a quienes "persisten obstinadamente en un pecado grave manifiesto" (Canon 915). La Ley Canónica de la Iglesia que rige el comportamiento de sus miembros es clara en este asunto. Hay que seguir un procedimiento, en coherencia con los mandatos evangélicos (cf Mateo 18, 15-18) y la enseñanza apostólica de San Pablo (cf 1 Corintios 11:27-29). Todo está hecho para ayudar a la conversión del corazón que es necesaria para el comunicante en la Eucaristía. El enfoque es veraz, honesto y próximo. Para aquellos de Louisiana que tenemos la edad suficiente para recordar, el Arzobispo Joseph Rummel de Nueva Orleans excomulgó en 1962 a un funcionario público que de una manera "manifiesta" se oponía a la desegregación de las Escuelas Católicas en la Arquidiócesis. Las acciones del Arzobispo siguen siendo consideradas heroicas.

Avance de la causa de canonización para Southwest La. Sacerdote

El ejemplo de heroísmo también llegó a la USCCB con una petición del Obispo Deshotel de Lafayette. Tuve el privilegio de apoyar, junto con el Arzobispo Timothy Broglio, un esfuerzo del Obispo de Lafayette para promover la causa de canonización del Siervo de Dios, El Padre Joseph Verbis Lafleur. El Obispo Deshotel inició esta solicitud de apoyo a los obispos católicos de los Estados Unidos, medida requerida por el proceso canónico. Me uní a mi apoyando al arzobispo Broglio porque durante ocho años cuando era un sacerdote joven, fui asignado a la parroquia donde el padre Lafleur sirvió ejemplarmente a finales de los años 1930. Cuando el obispo me asignó a la parroquia en los años 70, quedaban algunos feligreses mayores que recordaban con gran afecto el servicio del Padre Lafleur a la parroquia. Antes del bombardeo de Pearl Harbor y la entrada de los Estados Unidos en la Segunda Guerra Mundial, el padre Lafleur entró en la capellanía de los servicios armados. Los japoneses lo encarcelaron como prisionero de guerra, donde este joven sacerdote del suroeste de Louisiana se dedicó a los otros prisioneros, nunca los abandonó, cuidando de ellos, compartiendo sus raciones, y reconfortándolos en oración. En el traslado en un barco japonés sin nombre, murió tratando de rescatar a otros prisioneros cuando el buque fue hundido por un torpedo. Recibió póstumamente algunas de las decoraciones más altas, incluyendo el Corazón Púrpura y la Medalla del Servicio Distinguido. Fue verdaderamente un sacerdote heroico y un ejemplo de lo que significa dar la vida por las ovejas.

Otros temas comparecieron ante la Conferencia, pero pensé que estos dos serían de particular interés para ustedes. Por favor, mantengan a los obispos en sus oraciones. Estos son tiempos desafiantes que requieren un gran discernimiento. Al permanecer abierto a la auténtica enseñanza de la Iglesia y al Espíritu Santo que todavía nos guía, estoy seguro de que abordaremos constructivamente estos desafíos.






