IT'S ALL ABOUT CONTROL

From toddlerhood to old age, we grow in mastery of our own lives, our bodies, and our destiny. This mastery is hard won, and we don't let go of autonomy easily. Much of this self-mastery involves the avoidance of pain or discomfort, so when we hear things like "take up your cross" and "lose your life," we tend to resist the message.

James says that faith without works is dead. Ouch! That is really a direct message! One way to look at this, as well as the part about losing our life to find it, is that faith is a process of more and more openness to God's direction of our lives. It is very hard for us to give up control, but perhaps what we are being asked to do is not to become passive and babyish, but to allow God to direct where our self-mastery will lead and what it will accomplish. We are asked to relinquish the need to control the results of our efforts; to risk, as Jesus did, the loss of everything we are working to achieve. PASTOR'S MESSAGE — Matthew Cormier**SOLEMNITY OF ST. PETER CLAVER,
Patron of Diocese of Lake Charles**

September 9 is the Memorial of St. Peter Claver. Since he is the principal patron of the Diocese of Lake Charles, his memorial is observed throughout the Diocese on Sunday as a Solemnity. St. Peter Claver was not able to change the world, but did what one man could—with God's grace.

Born in Spain in 1580, he later joined the Society of Jesus and traveled as a missionary to the "New World" where he spent the rest of his days as a "slave of slaves". He devoted his ministry to saving the souls of African slaves. He worked for the abolition of the slave trade and although he was unsuccessful in that regard, this did not stop him from ministering to their physical and spiritual needs. He would board the slave ships as they entered the harbor at Cartagena (which is in modern day Columbia) and offer what refreshments he could afford; he would care for the sick and dying, give religious instruction before administering the Sacraments.

It is estimated that he baptized approximately 300,000 souls. Even though much of the world considered these human beings to be only property, St. Peter Claver recognized the image of God in them. He was harassed and persecuted constantly because of his service. We have much to learn from his example. Even in our time, racism and different forms of slavery exist. Many are not treated as worthy of life and salvation, from the poor immigrant to the unborn and unwanted child. St. Peter Claver's tireless efforts to bring souls to Christ through baptism is a reminder of the necessity of this sacrament. That baptism is necessary is taught by Christ and the apostles and reaffirmed by the Church in paragraphs 1257-1261 of the Catechism of the Catholic Church. Nevertheless, we are seeing more and more parents delaying baptism for their children or not baptizing them at all. This is sad indeed.

We must pray for the powerful intercession of St. Peter Claver.

MENSAJE DEL PARROCO— Matthew Cormier**SOLEMNIDAD DE SAN PEDRO CLAVER,
Patrón de la Diócesis de Lake Charles**

El 9 de septiembre es el Memorial de San Pedro Claver. Dado que es el patrón principal de la Diócesis del Lake Charles, su memorial se observa en toda la Diócesis como solemnidad el domingo. San Pedro Claver no pudo cambiar el mundo, pero hizo lo que un hombre pudo, con la gracia de Dios.

Nació en España en 1580, más tarde se unió a la Sociedad de Jesús y viajó como misionero al "Nuevo Mundo" donde pasó el resto de sus días como un "esclavo de esclavos". Dedicó su ministerio a salvar las almas de los esclavos africanos. Trabajó por la abolición de la trata de esclavos y aunque no tuvo éxito en ese sentido, esto no le impidió ministrar las necesidades físicas y espirituales. Abordaba los barcos de esclavos al entrar en el puerto de Cartagena (que es en la actualidad Colombia) y ofrecía los refrigerios que podía pagar; él cuidaba de los enfermos y los moribundos, daba instrucción religiosa antes de administrar los Sacramentos.

Se estima que bautizó aproximadamente a unas 300.000 almas. A pesar de que gran parte del mundo consideraba que estos seres humanos eran sólo una propiedad, San Pedro Claver reconoció la imagen de Dios en ellos. Fue acosado y perseguido constantemente debido a su servicio. Tenemos mucho que aprender de su ejemplo. Incluso en nuestro tiempo, el racismo y las diferentes formas de esclavitud existen. Muchos no son tratados como dignos de vida y salvación, desde el pobre inmigrante hasta el niño por nacer y no deseado. Los incansables esfuerzos de San Pedro Claver por llevar almas a Cristo a través del bautismo son un recordatorio de la necesidad de este sacramento. Ese bautismo es necesario, es enseñado por Cristo y los apóstoles y reafirmado por la Iglesia en los párrafos 1257-1261 del Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica. Sin embargo, estamos viendo cada vez más padres retrasando el bautismo de sus hijos o no bautizándolos en absoluto. Esto es realmente triste.

Debemos orar por la poderosa intercesión de San Pedro Claver.







UPDATED COVID DIRECTIVES FOR ST. HENRY CATHOLIC CHURCH

The following measures are in compliance with the Bishop's updated COVID-19 directives for the churches of the Diocese of Lake Charles issued May 14, 2020 which were compiled in consultation with the Presbyteral Council and a board of advising physicians.

1. Those who are sick should not attend Mass.
 2. For information regarding facemasks, consult CDC and State of Louisiana guidelines.
 3. The exchanging of the Sign of Peace is still not permitted.
 4. Hand holding during the Our Father is not permitted and is not in keeping with Catholic liturgical tradition.
 5. The use of Holy Water and missals is now at the discretion of the Pastor. At St. Henry's,
 - a Missalete are now available in the pews for those who wish to use them.
 - b. Holy Water is now available in the holy water fonts near the entrances for those who wish to use it.
 6. For the distribution of Holy Communion, the clergy and Extraordinary Ministers will continue to sanitize their hands and wear a facemask to distribute Holy Communion.
 7. For the reception of Holy Communion, if you are wearing a facemask, please lower it before receiving Holy Communion.
- ALWAYS consume the Sacred Host in front of the communion minister.**
8. Regarding physical distancing, every other pew along the walls of the church remain roped off for the elderly and at-risk who wish to remain at a safe distance from others. Those who are healthy and comfortable sitting close to others, please sit in the middle sections.

DIRECTIVAS COVID ACTUALIZADAS PARA LA IGLESIA CATÓLICA DE SAN HENRY

5. El uso del Agua Bendita y los misales están ahora a la discreción del Párroco en San Henry,
 - a. Los Misales están ahora disponibles en las bancas para aquellos que desean usarlos.
 - b. El Agua Bendita está ahora disponible en las fuentes de agua bendita cerca de las entradas para aquellos que desean usarla.
6. Para la distribución de la Santa Comunión, el clero y los Ministros Extraordinarios continuarán sanitizando sus manos y llevando una máscara para distribuir la Santa Comunión.
7. Para la recepción de la Santa Comunión, si usted está usando una máscara, por favor quítela antes de recibir la Santa Comunión. **SIEMPRE consuma la Sagrada Hostia delante del ministro de comunión.**
8. Con respecto al distanciamiento físico, cada otra banca a lo largo de las paredes de la iglesia sigue estando cerradas para las personas mayores y en riesgo que desean permanecer a una distancia segura de otros. Aquellos que están sanos y cómodos sentados cerca de otros, por favor, siéntense en las secciones intermedias.
