PASTOR'S MESSAGE — Matthew Cormier**SPIRITUAL PREPARING THE ELECT FOR BAPTISM****The Celebration of the Scrutinies**

Lent is the final period of preparation for the Elect (those adults who are preparing to become Christians at Easter through baptism, confirmation, and the Holy Eucharist.) Over the past year, they have received instruction in the Catholic Faith and gradually grown closer to the Lord. Now, in these final weeks, they enter into the desert, so to speak, to more intensely prepare their souls to be freed from sin and evil. This is called the "Period of Purification and Enlightenment" and is intended to purify the minds and hearts of the elect as they search their own consciences and do penance. This period is intended as well to enlighten the minds and hearts of the elect with a deeper knowledge of Christ the Savior. As part of this spiritual preparation, on the Third, Fourth, and Fifth Sundays of Lent are celebrated what are called the "Scrutinies". They will be celebrated at a different Mass on each weekend to give the parish community a chance to participate.

The scrutinies, which are solemnly celebrated on Sundays and are reinforced by an exorcism, are rites for self-searching and repentance and have above all a spiritual purpose. The scrutinies are meant to uncover, and then heal all that is weak, defective, or sinful in the hearts of the elect; to bring out, then strengthen all that is upright, strong, and good. For the scrutinies are celebrated in order to deliver the elect from the power of sin and Satan, to protect them against temptation, and to give them strength in Christ, who is the way, the truth, and the life. These rites, therefore, should complete the conversion of the elect and deepen their resolve to hold fast to Christ and to carry out their decision to love God above all.

Because they are asking for the three sacraments of initiation, the elect must have the intention of achieving an intimate knowledge of Christ and his Church, and they are expected particularly to progress in genuine self-knowledge through serious examination of their lives and true repentance.

In order to inspire in the elect a desire for purification and redemption by Christ, three scrutinies are celebrated. By this means, first of all, the elect are instructed gradually about the mystery of sin, from which the whole world and every person longs to be delivered and thus saved from its present and future consequences. Second, their spirit is filled with Christ the Redeemer, who is the living water (gospel of the Samaritan woman in the first scrutiny), the light of the world (gospel of the man born blind in the second scrutiny), the resurrection and the life (gospel of Lazarus in the third scrutiny). From the first to the final scrutiny the elect should progress in their perception of sin and their desire for salvation.

In the rite of exorcism, the elect, who have already learned from the Church as their mother the mystery of deliverance from sin by Christ, are free from the effects of sin and from the influence of the devil. They receive new strength in the midst of their spiritual journey and they open their hearts to receive the gifts of the Savior.

Invitation to Silent Prayer

One of the most powerful moments of the Scrutinies is how they begin. After the homily, the Elect are invited to come forward with their sponsors and to kneel down. Then, the whole assembly is invited to pray for them in silence. It is a very solemn moment. This community has cared for these elect for some months now on their journey. We have sent them to reflect more and more deeply on the Word of God and expressed to them our longing for the day on which they would join us at the table of the Lord. Now we pray for them in this sacred silence, deeply asking God to protect them and heal them in the weeks ahead.

Intercessions for the Elect. We then pray out loud together for the Elect.

Prayer of Exorcism. Then, we pray that they might be freed from the power of the Evil One and protected on their journey.

The Laying On of Hands. In a silent ritual deliberately reminiscent of the rite used for ordination in the Sacrament of Holy Orders, the priest lays his hands for a brief moment on the head of each of the Elect. It is a solemn act of calling down the Spirit of Jesus to be with them and protect them.

MENSAJE DEL PARROCO—Matthew Cormier**PREPARACIÓN ESPIRITUAL DE LOS ELEGIDOS PARA EL BAUTISMO****La Celebración de los Escrutinios**

La Cuaresma es el periodo de preparación para los Elegidos (aquellos adultos que se están preparando para ser Cristianos en la pascua por el bautismo, la confirmación y la Santa Eucaristía.) Durante el año pasado, han recibido instrucción en la fe católica y gradualmente se han acercado más al Señor. Ahora, en estas últimas semanas, entran en el desierto, por así decirlo, para preparar más intensamente sus almas para ser liberadas del pecado y el mal. Esto se llama el "Período de Purificación e Iluminación" y tiene la intención de purificar las mentes y los corazones de los elegidos mientras buscan sus propias conciencias y hacen penitencia. Este período también tiene la intención de iluminar las mentes y los corazones de los elegidos con un conocimiento más profundo de Cristo el Salvador. Como parte de esta preparación espiritual, en el Tercer, Cuarto y Quinto Domingo de Cuaresma se celebran lo que se llaman los "Escrutinios". Se celebrarán en una misa diferente cada fin de semana para dar a la comunidad parroquial la oportunidad de participar. Los escrutinios, que se celebran solemnemente los domingos y se refuerzan con un exorcismo, son ritos de auto-búsqueda y arrepentimiento y tienen sobre todo un propósito espiritual. Los escrutinios están destinados a descubrir, y luego sanar todo lo que es débil, defectuoso o pecaminoso en los corazones de los elegidos; para sacar, luego fortalecer todo lo que es recto, fuerte y bueno. Porque los escrutinios se celebran para liberar a los elegidos del poder del pecado y de Satanás, para protegerlos contra la tentación, y para darles fortaleza en Cristo, que es el camino, la verdad y la vida. Estos ritos, sin embargo, deben de completar la conversión del elegido y profundizar su determinación de aferrarse a Cristo y llevar a cabo su decisión de amar a Dios por encima de todo. Debido a que están pidiendo los tres sacramentos de la iniciación, los elegidos deben tener la intención de alcanzar un conocimiento íntimo de Cristo y su Iglesia, y se espera que progresen particularmente en el autoconocimiento genuino a través de un examen serio de sus vidas y el verdadero arrepentimiento. Con el fin de inspirar en los elegidos un deseo de purificación y redención por Cristo, se celebran tres escrutinios. Por este medio, en primer lugar, los elegidos son instruidos gradualmente sobre el misterio del pecado, del cual el mundo entero y cada persona anhela ser liberados y así salvos de sus consecuencias presentes y futuras. Segundo, su espíritu está lleno de Cristo redentor, que es el agua viva (evangelio de la mujer samaritana en el primer escrutinio), la luz del mundo (evangelio del hombre nacido ciego en el segundo escrutinio), la resurrección y la vida (evangelio de Lázaro en el tercer escrutinio). Desde el primer hasta el escrutinio final, los elegidos deben progresar en su percepción del pecado y su deseo de salvación.

En el rito del exorcismo, los elegidos, que ya han aprendido de la Iglesia como su madre el misterio de la liberación del pecado por Cristo, están libres de los efectos del pecado y de la influencia del diablo. Reciben nuevas fortalezas en medio de su viaje espiritual y abren sus corazones para recibir los dones del Salvador.

Invitación a la Oración Silenciosa

Uno de los momentos más poderosos de los Scrutinios es cómo comienzan. Después de la homilía, los elegidos son invitados a pasar adelante con sus padrinos y a arrodillarse. Entonces, toda la asamblea es invitada a orar por ellos en silencio. Es un momento muy solemne. Esta comunidad ha cuidado de estos elegidos por algunos meses hasta ahora en su caminar. Los hemos enviado a reflexionar más y más profundamente sobre la Palabra de Dios, y les hemos expresado nuestro anhelo por el día en que nos acompañaran en la mesa del Señor. Ahora oramos por ellos en este silencio sacro, pidiendo a Dios profundamente que los proteja y sane en las semanas que vienen.

Intercesiones por los Elegidos. Luego oramos en voz alta juntos por los Elegidos.

Oración de Exorcismo. Luego, oramos para que puedan ser liberados del poder del Maligno y protegidos en su viaje.

La imposición de manos. En un ritual silencioso que recuerda deliberadamente el rito utilizado para la ordenación en el sacramento de la Orden Sacerdotal, el sacerdote pone sus manos durante un breve momento sobre la cabeza de cada uno de los elegidos. Es un acto solemne de llamar al Espíritu de Jesús para estar con ellos y protegerlos.

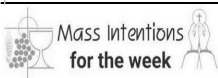

Catholic Charities**

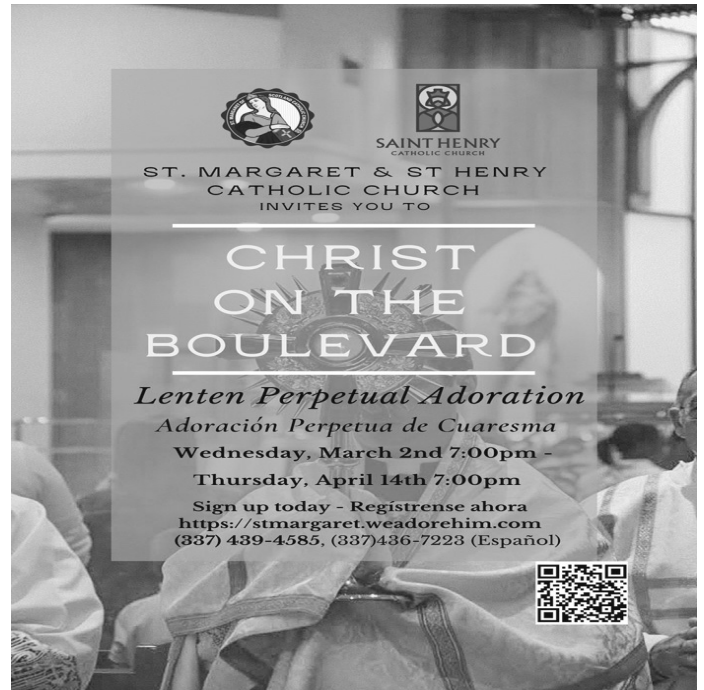
