PERSISTENCE

Exodus recounts the journey of the Israelites out of slavery in Egypt to the land promised to their ancestors. It was not an easy journey. In today's reading, they are attacked by Amalek and his soldiers, members of one of the peoples who live in the land through which the Israelites are traveling. Moses was on the hilltop with his arms raised to invoke the LORD's assistance in the battle below, a powerful illustration of the LORD's favor upon Israel. If the soldiers were to lift up their eyes to that hill (see Psalm 121:1), they would be reassured by Moses's presence and posture. Paul urges the Thessalonians to persist in proclaiming the gospel, and Jesus likewise commends the widow for her persistence in pursuit of the justice due her. LA PERSISTENCIA

El libro del Éxodo narra el viaje de los israelitas desde la esclavitud en Egipto hasta la tierra prometida a sus antepasados. No fue un viaje fácil. En la lectura de hoy, son atacados por Amalec y sus soldados, integrantes de uno de los pueblos que habitaba por donde pasaron los israelitas. Moisés estaba en la cima de la montaña con los brazos levantados para invocar la ayuda del Señor en la batalla que estaba ocurriendo colina abajo, un ejemplo poderoso del favor del Señor sobre Israel. Si los soldados estuvieran con sus ojos hacia la colina (ver salmo 121:1), se sentirían tranquilos por la presencia y postura de Moisés. Pablo insta a los tesalonicenses a que perseveren en la proclamación del Evangelio, y Jesús elogia igualmente a la viuda por su persistencia en la búsqueda de la justicia que le corresponde. PASTOR'S MESSAGE — Matthew Cormier**A WALK-THROUGH THE HOLY MASS*****"Do this in remembrance of me" (Lk 22:19).***

For the past four Sundays, the Sacrament of the Most Holy Eucharist has been the subject of our weekly catechesis as part of our efforts for the National Eucharistic Revival. Today, we begin the second phase of this series with a step-by-step walk through the parts of the Holy Mass. Have you ever wondered why we do certain things in the Mass? Hopefully this series will answer some of those questions, but more importantly, help you to come to a more fruitful and active participation in the Mass. What do we mean by "fruitful and active participation"?

This phrase comes from the Church's Magisterium (supreme teaching authority). The term was first coined by Pope St. Pius X in 1903 when speaking about the importance of Sacred Music. In 1928, Pope Pius XI used the same term when instructing on the importance of the verbal responses by the congregation at Mass. The faithful should not be, he said, "merely detached and silent spectators, but filled with a deep sense of the beauty of the Liturgy" (*Divini Cultus*). Pope Pius XII in 1947 taught that the faithful, as members of the Mystical Body of Christ, are called to an "active and individual" participation in the Mass.

These previous teachings were taken up by the Second Vatican Council in its Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, "Mother Church earnestly desires that all the faithful should be led to that fully conscious, and active participation in liturgical celebrations which is demanded by the very nature of the liturgy. Such participation by the Christian people as 'a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a redeemed people' (1 Pet. 2:9; cf. 2:4-5), is their right and duty by reason of their baptism." (*Sacrosanctum Concilium* 14). What does it look like, however, to exercise that baptismal right? Does it mean constant movement and activity? Does it mean that the priesthood is not needed? Vatican II says that active participation is to be first and foremost—internal (in the heart and soul) and that this comes about through "pastors of souls" instructing the faithful with "zeal and patience" (SC 19). In order to fruitfully participate in something, one needs to have as much of an understanding of it as possible so that we can participate in the Eucharistic Sacrifice "not in an inert and negligent fashion, giving way to distractions and day-dreaming, but with such earnestness and concentration that they may be united as closely as possible with the High Priest" (Pius XII, *Mediator Dei* 80).

The ordained priest offers the Sacrifice of the Mass as the one who stands "in the person of Christ the High Priest". Without the ordained priest, no Eucharist is possible. This is how the Lord Jesus designed it when He instituted the Priesthood at the Last Supper. The laity, however, are not just silent spectators. They join in the offering of the Holy Sacrifice through the common priesthood of all the baptized. They worship Almighty God by praying the people's prayers and responses. After allowing their souls to be fed and instructed by God's Word and joining their hearts to the Holy Sacrifice of Calvary, the most perfect act of participation is the worthy reception of Holy Communion in the state of grace.

*"The Church, therefore, earnestly desires that Christ's faithful, when present at this mystery of faith, should not be there as strangers or silent spectators; on the contrary, through a good understanding of the rites and prayers they should take part in the sacred action conscious of what they are doing, with devotion and full collaboration. They should be instructed by God's word and be nourished at the table of the Lord's body; they should give thanks to God; by offering the Immaculate Victim, not only through the hands of the priest, but also with him, they should learn also to offer themselves; through Christ the Mediator, they should be drawn day by day into ever more perfect union with God and with each other, so that finally God may be all in all" (*Sacrosanctum Concilium* 48).* Tune in next week for Fr. Caraway's explanation of the entrance procession, the priest's reverencing of the altar, and the Penitential Act.

MENSAJE DEL PARROCO— Matthew Cormier**UN PASEO POR LA SANTA MISA*****"Haced esto en memoria mía" (Lc. 22,19).***

Durante los últimos cuatro domingos, el Sacramento de la Santísima Eucaristía ha sido el tema de nuestra catequesis semanal como parte de nuestros esfuerzos por el Renacimiento Eucarístico Nacional. Hoy, comenzamos la segunda fase de esta serie con un paseo paso a paso por las partes de la Santa Misa. ¿Alguna vez te has preguntado por qué hacemos ciertas cosas en la Misa? Esperemos que esta serie responda algunas de esas preguntas, pero lo que es más importante, te ayude a llegar a una participación más fructífera y activa en la Misa. ¿Qué entendemos por "participación fructífera y activa"?

Esta frase proviene del Magisterio de la Iglesia (autoridad suprema de enseñanza). El término fue acuñado por primera vez por el Papa San Pío X en 1903 cuando hablaba de la importancia de la Música Sacra. En 1928, el Papa Pío XI usó el mismo término al instruir sobre la importancia de las respuestas verbales de la congregación en la Misa. Los fieles no deben ser, dijo, "meros espectadores desapegados y silenciosos, sino llenos de un profundo sentido de la belleza de la liturgia" (*Divini Cultus*). El Papa Pío XII en 1947 enseñó que los fieles, como miembros del Cuerpo Místico de Cristo, están llamados a una participación "activa e individual" en la Misa.

Estas enseñanzas anteriores fueron recogidas por el Concilio Vaticano II en su Constitución sobre la Sagrada Liturgia, "La santa madre Iglesia desea ardientemente que se lleve a todos los fieles a aquella participación plena, consciente y activa en las celebraciones litúrgicas que exige la naturaleza de la Liturgia misma y a la cual tiene derecho y obligación, en virtud del bautismo, el pueblo cristiano, "linaje escogido sacerdocio real, nación santa, pueblo adquirido." (*Sacrosanctum Concilium* 14). ¿Cómo se ve, sin embargo, ejercer ese derecho bautismal? ¿Significa movimiento y actividad constantes? ¿Significa esto que el sacerdocio no es necesario? El Vaticano II dice que la participación activa debe ser, ante todo, interna (en el corazón y en el alma) y que esto se produce a través de "pastores de almas" que instruyen a los fieles con "celo y paciencia" (SC 19). Para participar fructíferamente en algo, uno necesita tener la mayor comprensión posible de ello para que podamos participar en el Sacrificio Eucarístico "no de una manera inerte y negligente, dando paso a distracciones y sueños despiertos, sino con tal seriedad y concentración para que puedan estar unidos lo más estrechamente posible con el Sumo Sacerdote" (Pío XII, *Mediator Dei*).


El sacerdote ordenado ofrece el Sacrificio de la Misa como el que está "en la persona de Cristo Sumo Sacerdote". Sin el sacerdote ordenado, ninguna Eucaristía es posible. Así es como el Señor Jesús lo diseñó cuando instituyó el sacerdocio en la Última Cena. Los laicos, sin embargo, no son sólo espectadores silenciosos. Se unen a la ofrenda del Santo Sacrificio a través del sacerdocio común de todos los bautizados. Adoran a Dios Todopoderoso orando las oraciones y respuestas de la gente. Después de permitir que sus almas sean alimentadas e instruidas por la Palabra de Dios y unir sus corazones al Santo Sacrificio del Calvario, el acto más perfecto de participación es la digna recepción de la Sagrada Comunión en estado de gracia.

"Por tanto, la Iglesia, con solícito cuidado, procura que los cristianos no asistan a este misterio de fe como extraños y mudos espectadores, sino que comprendiéndolo bien a través de los ritos y oraciones, participen conscientes, piadosa y activamente en la acción sagrada, sean instruidos con la palabra de Dios, se fortalezcan en la mesa del Cuerpo del Señor, den gracias a Dios, aprendan a ofrecerse a sí mismos al ofrecer la hostia inmaculada no sólo por manos del sacerdote, sino juntamente con él, se perfeccionen día a día por Cristo mediador en la unión con Dios y entre sí, para que, finalmente, Dios sea todo en todos." (*Sacrosanctum Concilium* 48).

Sintonice la próxima semana la explicación del Padre Caraway sobre la procesión de entrada, la reverencia del sacerdote al altar y el Acto Penitencial.


VOCATION PRAYER






