THE FOURTH OF JULY

This Fourth of July weekend feels so different than the ones that have preceded it. We are separated by social distancing for safety's sake. There are no firework displays or traditional celebrations due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Our schools closed early this spring and we are visiting our relatives and friends in personal care facilities by peering through outdoor windows. Parish events have been scaled back or canceled. The Mass is beginning to be celebrated in many churches with fewer people allowed to be present. It all seems crazy! But God is with us in the midst of all things.

Though there's much that makes us feel separated from one another, really, we are not. That's because we are always one in Jesus, and this is what needs to be our focus.

Living in the shadow of the cross, Jesus is the perfect source of unity. Separated by sin and division, Jesus came to reunite us with our heavenly Father and one another. Jesus continues to bring and restore life.

On the other hand, it is the evil one who divides and continues to bring disunity and suffering into the world. Nothing makes Satan happier than when the flock is scattered and pitted against one another and our good Lord. Very simply, this is the state of sin. For all humanity, the healing remedy is to turn from sin and to turn to God.

And Jesus, who has freed us from sin and death makes this kind of change possible.

Tensions are felt in every parish grouping and newly formed parish across the diocese. Admittedly few people like change. They grumbled and said that at least there they had food to eat and a sense of familiarity in Egypt. But through Moses, God wanted something more, something greater for His people—the Promised Land. Now, like then, we need to be united and move forward less we miss the blessings that God has intended for us. Friends, we have been charged with truly rebuilding God's Church.

Let this Fourth of July holiday serve as a reminder not just of the unifying of our nation, but of what we are to be about as a Church and citizens of the kingdom. We are called to be the salt of the earth and the light of the world. We can do this—together. Think before you speak, and pray before you think. Be intentional about building up the Church and not tearing it down by your attitudes, words, and actions. The present and future generations are counting on us to be resolute in transmitting the gospel and the sacramental life of the Church on to the end of time. Begin each day by putting on Christ. Appreciate that you—yes, you, really do make a difference, either for better or worse, but there is no standing still or sitting on the sidelines. Jesus is calling us to be all-in!

I look forward to being a part of that new Church—God's church, and moving forward *On Mission for The Church Alive!* as a member of Triumph of the Holy Cross Parish. We are not just a parish in the South Hills; we are literally a city set on a hill for all the world to see. Know that I already and will continue to grow in love with you.

So, this Fourth of July, let's celebrate our dependence

on God who never abandons His Church but leads it through the Holy Spirit. He invites us to accept a meaningful role in rebuilding the Church - one soul at a time. Even in these awkward times, let us gather physically, virtually, or spiritually around the altar Jesus made holy. Nourished in word and sacrament, be filled with confidence and be about God's work, not our own. Remain one in the love of Jesus both here on earth, and forever in heaven. These are exciting times though not without challenge. And we are called to make a difference for and with Jesus.

MASS SCHEDULE DURING COVID-19 RESTRICTIONS

Our public celebration of the Mass this weekend:

Saturday, July 4 at 4:00PM and Sunday, July 5 at 9:00AM

Both Masses are celebrated at St. Thomas à Becket in the Church.

The Saturday anticipated Mass is broadcast on **YouTube** at 6:00PM and available to view at any time afterwards.

Weekday Masses are at St. Thomas à Becket from Monday through Friday at 8:00AM in the Church and available for viewing at home at 9:00AM.

HOURS for Private Prayer at each Church: 11:00AM – 2:00PM, Monday thru Friday.

The areas open for private prayer will be clearly marked. In addition to daily cleaning and sanitizing, the <u>use of masks and social distancing</u> (maintaining a distance of at least 6 feet) is <u>required</u> for any use of the Church buildings. Restrooms remain locked.

Sign-in upon entering the Church.

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION, BAPTISMS, WEDDINGS and FUNERALS

- Sacrament of Reconciliation Saturday from 10:30 11:30am at St. Thomas á Becket parking lot, drive through.
- The celebration of **Baptisms** (one family at a time) can be scheduled with cleaning/sanitizing guidelines in place and are limited to only 25 people in attendance. The use of masks and social distancing is required.
- Limited **Weddings** with cleaning/sanitizing guidelines in place, expanding to groups of no more than 25% capacity of the Church building. The use of masks and social distancing is required.
- Limited **Funerals** with cleaning/sanitizing guidelines in place, expanding to groups of no more than 25% capacity of the Church building. The use of masks and social distancing is required.

GUIDELINES FOR MASS ATTENDANCE

- At present we will be using only the St. Thomas á Becket Church because it offers the highest seating capacity and largest parking lot.
- The obligation to attend Sunday Mass remains suspended until further notice because of the pandemic. No one is obligated to attend Mass. Anyone who is feeling sick should stay at home and pray.
- People who are at risk because of underlying health issues, or who are elderly or sick, are **strongly encouraged to stay home** for their own health and to avoid the risk of contracting the virus. This includes anyone over 65 or anyone who has a fever or cough, diabetes, other chronic illness of has a compromised immune system.
- All who attend Mass must wear a mask and practice social distancing (except for families who live together). The Church has marked pews to best practice social distancing.
- Hand sanitizers have been placed at the entrance of the Church and all must use them as you enter.
- Please follow the direction of the ushers and greeters who will show you to your pew. Please do not sit at the end of the pew but move in so no one has to climb over you.
- Things you'll notice: fewer people in the sanctuary, no Offertory procession and no Sign of Peace, no Holy Water, no Hymnals, Choirs are not permitted, distribution of Holy Communion is only the Sacred Host and will not be distributed until after the final blessing and dismissal. Collection boxes will be available as you exit the Church.
- Please allow the ushers to invite you from your pew to approach the priest for communion while practicing social distancing of six feet between persons. Please exit the Church as soon as you have received (please don't return to the pew). Also note ... the Bishop has strongly urged that everyone receive Communion in the hand to protect you and the priest and those coming after you. Please remember again the distribution of Holy Communion is only after the Mass ends with the dismissal.
- Please be patient with yourselves and others. We are still learning and making adjustments to ensure everyone's safety.

ABOUT MASS INTENTIONS ...

Since the closure of all churches in March due to the coronavirus, the Mass intentions that were scheduled in our four churches continued to be said at private daily Masses celebrated by Fr. Cain, Fr. Ken and Fr. Bill.

All Masses scheduled until July 1, 2020 were said on or near the day they were requested. No Mass intentions were accepted after July 1, 2020 because of us becoming one parish and the possibility of a Mass schedule change when that took place. Then the coronavirus complicated things.

As we began to reopen on the weekend of June 6/7, we had a limited schedule because of sanitizing and coronavirus restrictions. Also, our new Pastor, Fr. Paul Zywan, will begin his ministry on July 1, 2020 as we become Triumph of the Holy Cross Parish, maintaining our four churches. We will continue our present schedule until he has had the opportunity to determine how we should proceed in the immediate future. Because of this, our Mass schedule may change from week to week as we may be able to open more buildings. Please be patient as we move through this process.

However, since NO MASSES were scheduled in any of the four churches after July I, 2020, we are now opening up your ability to schedule dates in July and August, **beginning with July 13**. Only a specific date can be requested and not a particular church until we are back to the original schedule at all four churches. WE DO NOT KNOW WHEN THAT WILL BE.

Until then, we will continue to have a weekday Mass (MONDAY - FRIDAY) at 8:00AM at St. Thomas à Becket which will be available on line at 9:00AM for those who cannot attend. One priest will say that Mass and the other two priests will continue to say private Masses. On Saturday, there will be a concelebrated 4:00PM Vigil Mass and a Sunday 9:00AM Mass, both at St. Thomas à Becket. The Saturday Vigil will be available online at 6:00PM and thereafter. THREE Mass Intentions can be scheduled for each day. There will NOT BE a Saturday morning Mass after June 27, because of weddings, funerals and memorial Masses that must be satisfied.

ALL MASSES MUST BE SCHEDULED BY CALLING LYNETTE BALDWIN at 412-655-2885. There will now be one Mass Book for all Masses scheduled for TRIUMPH OF THE HOLY CROSS PARISH. When, and if we are able, we will schedule them at the individual churches. PLEASE BE PATIENT until the future allows us to expand this procedure. Each person can only schedule ONE MASS.
