

MEET FATHER MICHAEL ...

We extend a warm welcome to our new Parochial Vicar, Father Michael Faix. Father Michael was ordained to the priesthood on June 27, 2020.



Growing up, he was a parishioner at Saint Martin de Porres Parish (now Mary Mother of God Parish) and attended McKeesport High School. During his later years at Allegheny College in Meadville, where he studied physics and music performance, he committed himself to daily prayer. After college, he weighed a lot of options for his next step, including grad school and teaching. But through all the time that Father Michael had spent in prayer, the Lord made it clear that He was calling him to mission work.

After joining NET Ministries, a mission organization that encourages young Catholics to dedicate their lives to Christ and live by the Church's teachings, he worked for a year on a mission team at All Saints Parish in Lakeville, Minnesota, where he helped with parish outreach, development and youth programs. Father Michael then worked for two years as a NET supervisor at its headquarters in St. Paul.

"The call to the priesthood came about in the course of daily prayer, living in community and living out the mission of evangelization," he said. Even though hesitant to begin telling people that he felt this call, the Lord provided for him. "With every concrete step I took in faith, I was filled with peace."

Father Michael entered Saint Paul Seminary in the fall of 2013. During his time in seminary, St. Teresa of Avila's writing on prayer profoundly influenced his own prayer life. He also grew closer to St. Joseph, his Confirmation saint and he seeks to emulate him through his priestly ministry.

Father Michael studied at Saint Vincent Seminary in Latrobe. His favorite experience there was praying in the presence of the Eucharist each morning in the dorm's adoration chapel. He looks forward to encouraging the faithful to encounter Jesus in adoration through his priestly ministry.

"Priests put people in touch with God through their witness and their preaching. Christian life is about encountering and meeting the Lord face to face and being in the right relationship with God," he said.

Father Michael encourages any man discerning the priesthood to pray about it deeply. Then, to talk about it with others and seek conversations with priests who can serve as mentors through the discernment process.

We are blessed to have Father Michael at Triumph of the Holy Cross Parish and look forward to the many spiritual gifts and talents he will use to bring people to the healing love of God.

AT THE HEART OF WHO WE ARE AND WHAT WE DO

On March 14, 2020, our daily routines changed dramatically with the directives handed down to us by government and Church leaders alike. Turning to medical officials and those charged with disease control for our nation, restrictions were put in place. These decisions regarding the COVID-19 pandemic are driven by data that had been collected and analyzed. Though the restrictions called for by civil and Church leaders are not always well received, I do believe they are made out of an abundance of concern and true charity.

Be that what it may be, the number of Masses in our given parishes or groupings in the diocese have been restricted not because of the number of priests available, but the required sanitizing protocol that has been mandated for the safety of all. These requirements for a church building are costly, product is at times limited in availability and requires a significant investment of labor to do the actual work. For said reasons, the decision to use churches for worship is not as easy as you may think.

Here at Triumph of the Holy Cross Parish, Masses have been limited to two Sunday Masses and weekday Masses at Saint Thomas à Becket Church. This site was chosen due to it having the largest seating capacity of the four churches that serve us. With the requirement that only 25% of the seating capacity of any public building be utilized, Saint Thomas à Becket provides accommodations for the largest number of guests. Be clear, it is not an issue of favoritism.

Though these requirements have not changed, the clergy team have begun discussions to expand the number of Masses celebrated on Sundays. I will keep you informed as to any changes decided upon as soon as possible. I hear your concerns and will do my best to respond to your hunger for Jesus. Your want is a beautiful thing.

In the meantime, *let nothing separate you from the love of Jesus*. Not even COVID-19 can do that. Know His presence and love that are constant. I encourage all who have not been attending Mass as you normally would, to take advantage of making a spiritual communion by offering the following prayer and welcoming Jesus into your heart. Jesus can and will do that by our asking. Trust Him and continue to pray daily for a cure to the pandemic.

MASS SCHEDULE DURING **COVID-19 RESTRICTIONS**

Our public celebration of the Mass this weekend: Saturday, July 18 at 4:00PM and Sunday, July 19 at 9:00AM

Both Masses are celebrated at Saint Thomas à Becket in the Church.

The Saturday anticipated Mass is broadcast on YouTube at 6:00PM and available to view at any time afterwards.

Weekday Masses are at Saint Thomas à Becket from Monday through Friday at 8:00AM in the Church and available for viewing at home at 9:00AM.

SCHEDULING MASS INTENTIONS ...

All Mass intentions that were scheduled in our four churches through July 1, 2020 were fulfilled by our priests. Until the coronavirus allows us to get back to a regular schedule using all four churches, we will continue to follow the schedule we have with daily and weekend Masses at Saint Thomas à Becket.

We have opened the Mass Book of Triumph of the Holy Cross Parish for you to schedule Masses for a specific date, but NOT A SPECIFIC CHURCH, from now until Dec. 31, 2020. ALL MASSES MUST BE SCHEDULED BY CALLING **LYNETTE BALDWIN at 412-655-2885.**

You may schedule one weekend Mass and two daily masses per family. The Masses will be said on the day you request either at the scheduled Mass or by one of our priests who will concelebrate or say mass privately. The Mass Book for 2021 will be opened sometime around November. Please look for further notice.

On the listing of Masses being said by each of our priests, there will be an asterisk next to the one that is being said publicly each weekday. So if you requested that intention, you may want to be present for that Mass at Saint Thomas à Becket Church. All Saturday and Sunday Mass Intentions are said by the concelebrating priests in church.

PLEASE BE REMINDED THAT THIS WHOLE SCENARIO MAY CHANGE FROM WEEK TO WEEK AS WE MIGHT BE ABLE TO OPEN ANOTHER CHURCH(ES). Please pray that this may happen in the near future.

Since there are many dates open from now until December 31, 2020, there may be times when we have to fill in an intention from our book of reserve masses. This might mean seeing the same name appearing a number of times. Please be aware that that family has not been given more than the allotted number of masses that can be scheduled. Please be patient as we move forward!

He liked to say, "Do the drill." meaning just do what needs to be done.

We are all called to be mature disciples who answer the call of Jesus Christ regardless of the cost. We cannot choose when and where the call will come. We cannot schedule our stewardship in a way that is always most convenient for us. Even when the fruits of our faithful efforts seem hidden from us, we hold to the promise that we are never called to give of ourselves for nothing. God is working through us and in us.
