THE DIOCESE OF PITTSBURGH PARTNERS WITH CATHOLIC LEADERSHIP INSTITUTE FOR EVANGELIZATION AND PASTORAL PLANNING

As the final mergers take place in the Diocese of Pittsburgh in July 2023, Bishop Zubik is focused on fortifying our parishes for the work of Evangelization, Hospitality and Mission so all people will come to Learn, Love and Live Jesus.

To help parishes prepare for this work, Bishop Zubik has partnered with Catholic Leadership Institute (CLI) to support our pastors and parishes in their pastoral planning efforts. CLI is a non-profit Catholic Apostolate specializing in leadership training and evangelization development. CLI will offer their planning tools and resources to all parishes at no cost to the Diocese due to a generous grant from the Lily Foundation.

Beginning in Lent of 2023, all parishes in the Diocese will participate in the Disciple Maker Index (DMI) Survey tool designed for parishioners to reflect upon their individual spiritual growth and engagement with the parish. The information gathered from the DMI will help parishes develop a pastoral plan to better equip parishioners to share the good news of Jesus Christ and to grow as Missionary Disciples.





Coming in 2023! Catechism in a Year

As we journey through Advent together, we can all take this opportunity to grow closer to Jesus so that we can be better prepared to greet Him when He comes again in glory. One way that we can do that is by immersing ourselves in Sacred Scripture so we can come to know Him better and arming ourselves with a better understanding of the teachings of the Church. Saint Jerome once said that ignorance of Scripture is ignorance of Christ. To help us on our way, we have provided some direction on how to access both "The Bible in a Year" and, starting January 1, 2023, "The Catechism in a Year" below for free.

Method 1

- 1) In the google search bar, type: ascension press.
- 2) Click on the ascension press link
- 3) place your mouse pointer over "free media"
- 4) bring your mouse straight down the drop-down menu and click on "bible in a year" or click on "podcasts" for the catechism in a year link.

Method 2

- 1) type: https://ascensionpress.com/ into your browser
- 2) Follow the directions above



Once the Catechism in a Year begins, we will have in person sessions every other week to review the material presented over the last two weeks. This way, people will have the opportunity to discuss the topics and ask questions. We will meet beginning in early January.

Faith FORMATION

his week in the elementary Faith Formation program, the children were paid a visit by Saint Nicholas, Our Lady of Guadalupe, and Saint Lucy.

The children prayed the St. Nicholas Prayer, which asks God to help them imitate St. Nicholas by giving us the courage, love and strength to serve Our Lord through loving and helping our brothers and sisters. An interesting fact taken from Catholic Online (www.catholic.org) is that the bones of St. Nicholas weep Manna. Since his death 17 centuries ago, a pure liquid known as the Manna of St. Nicholas, or St. Nicholas Manna, has flowed from his bones. Every May 9th, during the Feast of the Translation of the Relics of St. Nicholas, a Dominican priest collects the manna in a glass vial to be used to bless the Christian faithful.

Another saint discussed was Juan Diego and how Our Lady of Guadalupe appeared to him in a radiant apparition on December 9, 1531. Juan Diego shared these words from Our Lady:

"Let not your heart be disturbed... Am I not here, who is your Mother? Are you not under my protection? Am I not your health? Are you not happily within my fold? What else do you wish? Do not grieve nor be disturbed by anything."

The children also enjoyed a "tasty" visit from St. Lucy and learned about the tradition of planting wheat on St. Lucy's Day (December 13). This tradition comes from Hungary, Croatia, and other European nations. You can plant wheat grains (purchase wheat berries from health food stores) and put them in a round dish or plate of soil, then water the seeds. Place the container in a warm spot. If the planting medium is kept moist (not sopping wet), the seeds will germinate and the shoots will be several inches high by Christmas. The new green shoots remind us of the new life born in Bethlehem. They may be tied with a ribbon, if desired, and a candle may be placed near them as a symbol of the Light of Christ. Place the plate of sprouted wheat near your Nativity set where it will remind your family that Christ, the Bread of Life, was born in Bethlehem. The wheat also recalls that the Eucharist is made from wheat. Jesus referenced wheat in many parables. Research some and read them with your family.

The Story of Our Lady and Juan Diego

Our Lady of Guadalupe first introduced herself as the Mother of God and the mother of all humanity when she appeared on the hill of Tepeyac in Mexico in 1531. A peasant, Juan Diego, saw a glowing figure on the hill. After she had identified herself to him, Our Lady asked that Juan build her a shrine in that same spot, in order for her to share her love and compassion with all those who believe.

Afterwards, Juan Diego visited Juan de Zumárraga, who was Archbishop of what is now Mexico City. Zumárraga dismissed him in disbelief and asked that the future Saint provide proof of his story and proof of the Lady's identity. Juan Diego returned to the hill and encountered Our Lady again. The Virgin told him to climb to the top of the hill and pick some flowers to present to the Archbishop. Although it was winter and nothing should have been in bloom, Juan Diego found an abundance of flowers of a type he had never seen before. The Virgin bundled the flowers into Juan's cloak, known as a tilma. When Juan Diego presented the tilma of exotic flowers to Zumárraga, the flowers fell out and he recognized them as Castilian roses, which are not found in Mexico. What was even more significant, however, was that the tilma had been miraculously imprinted with a colorful image of the Virgin herself! This actual tilma, preserved since that date and showing the familiar image of the Virgin Mary with her head bowed and hands together in prayer, represents the Virgin of Guadalupe. It remains perhaps the most sacred object in all of Mexico.

I hope you have had a blessed Advent season so far. I can't believe Christmas is almost here! Youth Ministry projects and programs have been going well - we recently had 62 of our high school students receive the Sacrament of Confirmation. It was a beautiful celebration, and now we are working on transitioning them into some of our high school youth ministry programs.

We have two upcoming high school events: "Participate", the final night of our Lifeteen series on Miracles on Sunday, December 11th, and our "Ugly Sweater Christmas Party" on Wednesday, December 21st. We're asking all our students to bring a wrapped Christmas present in the \$5-10 range for a fun gift exchange at our party, but we'll have some extras if needed. It's going to be a really fun night!

This week, on Thursday, December 15th, we are having a FUEL Night of Worship for our middle school students and their families, but we invite all parishioners and visitors to attend this inspirational Advent program in St. Elizabeth Church.

Thank you all so much for your prayers and support. Believe it or not, I have now officially been here at the parish for a full year! It's been a great blessing being a part of this community. 




