

PALM SUNDAY: THE BEGINNING OF HOLY WEEK

Today, Palm Sunday, marks our journey through five weeks of Lent and begins Holy Week. We recall Jesus' triumphant arrival in Jerusalem — greeted with cheers and palm branches, as the people shouted in hope: "Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest!" (Matthew 21:9)

The crowd longed for a king to liberate them from Roman rule. Yet within days, many of these same people would cry out for Jesus to be crucified. While they sought political freedom, God had a far greater plan — a plan of eternal salvation that went beyond anything they could have imagined.

In the same way, God's plan for our lives exceeds our own hopes and expectations. The palms we carry today are symbols of hope and reminders of our call to follow Jesus — our King — on the path of humility, surrender, trust, and obedience. As we begin Holy Week, may we do so with renewed hearts, open to conversion and repentance.

Holy Week Confession Schedule

Confessions will be offered on Monday evening, April 14, at the usual time of 6:30 –7:30 p.m. at Saint Elizabeth. After Monday, April 14, the next scheduled time for confessions will be the following Monday, April 21. Participating in the liturgies and sacraments during this sacred time is a powerful way to deepen your faith and make Holy Week a powerful encounter with Our Lord.

Holy Thursday – April 17

Join us at Saint Thomas à Becket for the Mass of the Lord's Supper at 7:00 p.m., during which we celebrate the institution of the **Eucharist** during the Last Supper and the **Priesthood**. Please pray especially for all priests during this time. Before Mass, those who participated in the Eucharistic Consecration, 33 Days to Eucharistic Glory, will gather at 6:30 p.m. for a **Prayer of Consecration to Jesus in the Holy Eucharist**. The institution of the Eucharist at the Last Supper changed everything. Yet, if you asked people to write down the ten most significant events of history, the Last Supper would not make the list of most. We often overlook the significance of the institution of the Holy Eucharist and the Priesthood. The event changed the world. Jesus in the Holy Eucharist transformed lives, as echoed by saints through the ages:

"The Eucharist is my highway to Heaven." – Blessed Carlo Acutis

"There is nothing so great as the Eucharist. If God had something more precious, He would have given it to us." – Saint John Vianney

"One thing alone sustains me and that is Holy Communion. From it I draw all my strength; in it is all my comfort." – Saint Faustina Kowalska

When you participate in the Mass, imagine being there with Jesus at the Last Supper. When the priest elevates the Host and says, "Take this, all of you, and eat of it, for this is my Body, which will be given up for you," reflect on the profound reality that Jesus is offering His whole self to you. Will you offer your whole self in return? Bring your spiritual needs to Him. Trust in His love. Surrender your heart. Believe in His promises. Receive His grace. He desires to give so much more than we can ever imagine!


From Our Seminarian ...

Gospel: Luke 22:14-23:56

- Why must Jesus suffer and die? Imagine that after the fall, humanity was tied and bound in a chain and perishing in the deep marsh of sin and death, from which we could never climb out ourselves. We were set for eternal death and damnation from one generation to the next. Seeing we were perishing and dying under the dominion of sin, death, hell, and Satan, Jesus, out of love, came down from heaven to rescue us. By His death and resurrection, Jesus destroyed the chain of sin and death from Satan as He shed the resurrected light into the darkness and conquered the power of Satan. That is how we are set free; we are no longer in slavery and domination by Satan, but children of God destined to inherit everlasting life with God in heaven. Thus, before Christ came, no one entered heaven since heaven's door was locked. After being resurrected from death, Jesus not only opened the door of heaven, but also reconciled us with the Father and thus restored our relationship with Him.
- Therefore, we are on our journey back to our true home in heaven, out of that deep marsh, following the path Jesus paved for us. The journey can be long and difficult because we are going up and out of darkness. That is why Jesus left us the Church to accompany and guide us on the way home. Consider Noah and his family in the Ark for 40 days, or the Israelites who journeyed through the wilderness for 40 years toward the Promised Land, which symbolizes heaven for us now. We need to have hope and consolation in God. Let us stay in the Ark, which is the Church, or in the crowd of the Israelites led by Moses and Joshua as we return to our true home.
- The short answer to why Jesus died is so that death can be destroyed, Satan can be defeated, and we can be reconciled with God and once again re-enter the kingdom of God. Let us live in unity and love with God in heaven. Remember, brothers and sisters, we have been set free, rescued, and redeemed by Jesus' death. Everyone is included in this redemptive work, for Christ died for all humanity. He died for me, for you, and for everyone. Knowing this truth, what are your thoughts? What are your responses? How does it change the way you treat others, especially the lowly, the poor, the sick, or your enemies, who, just like you, have been redeemed by Jesus?




What Do I Do With My Blessed Palms?

After Palm Sunday Mass you will likely come home with some palm branches and may ask yourself, "what do I do with these?" Whatever you do, don't throw them away! According to the Code of Canon Law, blessed items are to be treated with respect and reverence and not discarded in the trash. At Mass, these palm branches were blessed by the priest and became a "sacramental," which is an object that is meant to draw us closer to God. These sacred signs bear a resemblance to the sacraments (cf. #1171). Throwing them in the trash overlooks their sacred purpose and treats them like any other object we no longer need. Should you wish to dispose of them, you may bury or burn them and spread the ashes outside. Many of the faithful have used palm branches to decorate their homes as a constant reminder of Holy Week throughout the year. You could tuck them behind a religious picture or crucifix, or be a little more creative by making them into a Palm Rose (directions are below).



1. Choose Your Palm Fronds
For one rose, choose a pair of
palm fronds that are still attached
along the spine. The size of the
fronds (both the length and the
width) will decide the size of your
rose. You want to choose one that
tapers toward the end.



Separate the two fronds along the spine, leaving them attached at the base—just a few inches where it is too stiff to fold. If you remove the spine, the fronds will be easier to manipulate.






3. Fold One Frond Behind the Other at a 90° Angle

Holding the base of the fronds in one hand, use your other hand to fold one of the fronds—let's call this frond A—behind the other one (frond B) at a 90° angle. This is the first fold and won't be visible in the end product, so just make it work—

it doesn't have to look perfect.



Next, fold frond B behind frond A, this time at about 120°. You are looking to get the same angle as the corners of a hexagon. It's okay if it's not perfect—you'll get the swing of it. This is the angle you'll use on all subsequent folds.





5. Fold Frond A Behind Frond B at a 120° Angle

Continue making the same folds—folding the top behind the one below it. As you work, it will form a hexagonal shape, and you will cross over the stem. Tip: If you find it too difficult to hold the folds together, once

you complete the first rotation, you can staple them together. You will likely only need this for that first circle. The staple will not be visible when you are done.

6. Continue Folding One Frond Behind the Other

Continue the same fold—top one behind the one below—until it is too difficult to go further because your circle has closed up. You will now have a coil of sorts. It's okay if the rose is not centered. This is caused by one frond being a little wider than the other, or by your angles being a little bit off. It still looks great a little off-center, but you can also correct this when you're done.





You should now have a rose form with the ends sticking out from the middle. Fold them over each other a couple more times, even if you are just twisting them together. Push the two ends down through the center of the rose—through the fold that goes down the middle of the coil. If you can only get it through two layers or so, that's okay. Just pull the ends around the coil like you are turning the hands of a clock. This will wrap it under the layers of the stem. They can really be anywhere, as long as they are tucked away.

7. Put On the Finishing Touches

This step isn't necessary—you could call yourself done right now. However, if your flower is a bit too off-center for your liking, you can staple through the bottom few (two to three) layers. This is usually enough to correct the problem. Just make sure to staple where it can't be seen. Marvel at your finished product!



Why We Do What We Do During Mass: The Gloria



Did you notice that throughout Lent, the **Gloria** has been absent from our Sunday worship? This sacred hymn of praise is omitted on the Sundays of Lent, as this season is a penitential time of the year. But this week, we will sing the Gloria at the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday triumphantly. This great hymn of praise symbolically takes us out of darkness and reminds us of the Incarnation during the Easter Vigil.

The Gloria is a historic hymn dedicated to Christ, drawing from John 1:1-17, Philippians 2:6-11, and Colossians 1:15-20. This hymn originated in the fourth century A.D. Initially it was sung during Morning Prayer and specific masses led by the Bishop. Over time, by the eighth century, the Gloria became integrated into our regular worship celebrations. It may be sung or spoken after the Penitential Rite, where we acknowledge and express remorse for our sins.

"Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to people of good will." Many of us may recognize these words from St. Luke's Gospel as the song the angels sang in praise announcing the birth of Jesus in Bethlehem (Luke 2:14). The Gloria has two parts. The first praises God the Father, and the second praises Jesus as God the Son. Although it may go unnoticed, as the sacred hymn progresses, we sing praises to two different persons of the Blessed Trinity. As we sing "We praise You" we are addressing God the Father. Next, we praise Jesus as the Son of God, the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity as the "Only Begotten Son, Lamb of God, Son of the Father, Holy One, and the Most High". We ask Jesus to have mercy on us, extending the prayers for the forgiveness of our sins that we made in the Penitential Act. This hymn of praise should not be taken lightly, nor sung or spoken in a rote manner. It is a hymn of worship.

Notice how the whole mission of Jesus is summed up in this prayer. We move from the Son's Incarnation, to His Paschal Mystery, to His enthronement in heaven. We move from praising Jesus as the "Only Begotten Son" of the Father who became flesh and dwelt among us, to worshiping Him as the "Lamb of God" who by His sacrifice "takes away the sin of the world", to praising Him in His triumph over sin and death as He is "seated at the right hand of the Father". Indeed, the very climax of salvation history can be summed up in the Gloria. Finally, the hymn ends with a praise of the Trinity, naming Jesus, the Holy Spirit, and the Father.

The Gloria can truly be a great model of prayer for us and strengthen our readiness for the many fruits that will continue to come in the Mass. As we sing the Gloria together, it is a great lead into what comes next — the Collect, which gathers our prayers and presents our focus for the celebration of each Mass.




