As we enter Holy Week, the holiness week of our Liturgical year we find ourselves in a much different place than in year's past. We are not able to gather as a community of faithful to celebrate Holy Thursday, Good Friday, the Easter Vigil and of course Easter Sunday Mass. For me this brings elements of sadness and disappointment. Emotions that many of you may be feeling as well. And yet at the same time I am reminded of an article that I read. That article talked about that first Easter Sunday nearly 2,000 years ago where the disciples were locked in their house in the upper room for it was too dangerous for them to come out. Together, as a family united in Jesus Christ for the last 3-years, they were full of fear, uncertainty, despair and anxiety. If they left their home their lives and the lives of their loved ones might be at risk.

And then it happened. The resurrected Jesus comes to the mentoring the upper room through locked doors and windows. At first the disciples did not understand as they gazed upon Jesus. Their fear heightened not believing what their eyes were telling them. And then the comforting words of Jesus to them, "**Peace be with you**." He comes bringing peace, hope and love. Yes, the Son of God, God himself comes to them in their fear, uncertainty, despair and anxiety with the gift of LOVE. At that moment everything changes. All their fears, uncertainty, despair and anxiety are dispelled replaced with hope, joy and love.

We all know the rest of the story. The disciples leave the house, that secured upper room to bring that hope, joy and love throughout the world. They bring the resurrected Christ to the world and the world is transformed never to be the same again.

This year as we celebrate Holy Week and Easter Sunday in our homes, let us be mindful that what we are faced with at this time will pass. Let us be mindful, especially during this Hole Week that Jesus, the Son of God, God himself remains with each and everyone of us. His words to His disciple's echo to us as well "**Peace be with You**." Let these words, words of hope, comfort and love help to dispel our fears, uncertainties, despair and anxiety and fill us with love.

I want to share with you part of the lyrics of a favorite song of mine "Hold onto Love" composed by Jesse Manibusam. The words are as such: "There is a place for the sadness, **Hold onto Love**. There is a season for gladness, **Hold onto Love**. When pain and confusion seem endless, **Hold onto Love**. We cultivate healing through kindness, **Hold onto LOVE**.

Hold onto love, where hope is found.

Hold onto love, where joy abounds

Hold onto love where grace and mercy's overflowing, HOLD ONTO LOVE.

When terror and fear overwhelm us, **Hold onto LOVE**. Courage and faith will sustain us, **Hold onto Love**. Acts of compassion restore us, **Hold onto LOVE**. Wisdom and truth reunite us, **Hold onto LOVE**.

Hold onto love, where hope is found. Hold onto love, where joy abounds Hold onto love where grace and Mercy's overflowing, HOLD ONTO LOVE.

Although we are not able to gather as a community to celebrate Holy Week and Easter Sunday please know that we remain united during this time in **Hope**, **Faith** and **Love**. We remain united in that we are one family with God as our Father, Jesus our brother and the Holy Spirit our counselor. We remain united through the great Trinity of our faith – God the Father, God the Son, God the Holy Spirit.


