Taizé Prayer — This Friday, April 9

Christ is Risen! Alleluia! Today we begin the Great Fifty Days of Easter. After forty days of penitence and fasting, we celebrate the glorious resurrection of Jesus. Easter is too big to celebrate for only one day. The Church celebrates the Octave of Easter – eight days of celebration! Every day in Easter Week is a Solemnity which is the highest rank of liturgical feasts.

One way our community is celebrating the Octave of Easter is with a live stream Taizé Prayer of the Resurrection this Friday, April 9 at 7:30 p.m. Join us for a festive 30-minute service of joyful singing, prayer, and scripture. The link is on the website.

This year 16 amazing adults in the Apple Valley Catholic Community chose to invest their time and energy into the lives of our early adolescents. They committed to helping kids build an authentic and lasting faith in Jesus in a new and innovative way during the pandemic. Although the small groups have not yet even met in person, with the wonders of video technology, our kids in grades 5- 8, and their leaders, are experiencing evangelization and transformation in new and beautiful ways.

How did they do this? Together we have explored and trained as small group leaders in a relational ministry approach called EDGE. EDGE is part of the Lifeteen program for Catholic Youth Ministry. Relational ministry happens when you take a lot of people (we have 60) and put them into small groups (we have 8) that meet frequently and consistently.

Relational ministry is personal. Bonds are formed, Stories are shared. Life happens together in the context of God's love, the Church's teachings, and prayer. The kids have learned a lot of catechetical content this year based on Scripture and Tradition. They have done deep dives into prayer, sacrament, and the liturgical year. And we have even managed to have some fun with crazy Zoom games!

But more than that, during this time of social isolation, which for middle school kids is akin to purgatory, they have found a place to belong. They have connected with other kids and caring adults to share their experiences, their fears, their joys, and their faith in a safe, supportive, and non-judgmental community. This matters. At a time when their families may not feel comfortable coming to Church, these kids have found a way to be Church.
