4. What are the strengths of our Parish?

Summary of responses*:

- Describe St. Es as a welcoming, inclusive, vibrant community (n = 64)
- Specific mention of the quality of the music and/or liturgy (n = 35)
- Happiness with faith formation programs and activities offered, including youth ministry, mission trips, children's liturgy, LIFT, GIFT, alpha, volunteer service activities (n = 31)
- Praise for Fr. Jeff, staff, and volunteers at St Es (n = 26)
- Other mentions: multigenerational/opportunities for all ages, family oriented, church facilities maintained, church location, willingness to try new approaches/think outside the box, communication, new children's room, social justice activities, appreciation that this survey was conducted

5. What is missing from or unsatisfactory at our Parish that you need or want?

Summary of responses*:

- More opportunities for social events, connection, community, and activities (bible study, book discussion, small groups, service activities, in-person Alpha) (n = 20)
- Different preference for homily/liturgy duration/content/style (n = 14)
- Better Mass times (n = 12)
- More comprehensive faith formation (adults, young children) (n = 10)
- Involvement of more parishioners, welcoming newcomers, outreach to homebound, online networking, community outreach (n = 10)
- Different music preference (n = 9)
- Concerns about less attendance/less energy in community after Covid (n = 6)

- More engaging experience, better marketing of what we have to offer
- More electronic, less printed materials, more online giving

Summary of Comments for Question 8* (reasons for not increasing giving)

- Financial situation doesn't allow increase in giving (n = 19)
- Concern about fewer people having to give more and more and/or already feel they are giving their share (n = 8)
- Lack of understanding about EFT, online giving, or parish financial information (n = 6)
- Unhappiness with or concern about something at AVCC such as parish center use for Boy Scouts, loss of sense of energy/community, decreased Mass attendance (n = 5)
- Unhappiness with positions or actions of the Catholic Church or Boston Archdiocese (n = 4)
- Other (concern about ability to maintain 2 parishes, conflicted about giving to only 1 of the 2 parishes, forgot but will initiate and increase)

- Talk about stewardship in homilies
- Have parishioners share stories at Mass

- Change Mass times (n = 4)
- Find other ways of bringing money (parking, rent out church hall for events)
- More help from volunteers among the parish
- More assistance from Archdiocese from Cardinal Appeal
- Question about returning to old rectory and selling current one

Summary and Insights

- Most Parishioners perceive St. E's to be a welcoming, vibrant community and value the music, liturgy, programs, pastor and staff among many items mentioned, although there is a widespread concern about reduced Mass attendance and loss of some "energy" in the parish since Covid.
- More opportunities for connection with others in the community through small group meetings, activities and social events was the most common suggestion for improvement.
- Differences in preference for style and content of homily, liturgy, music were expressed by some parishioners, and included some suggestions to enhance experience including bringing missals back, re-evaluating Mass times/locations, varying music styles
- Some misconceptions about budget and finances and need for more information were identified in survey responses
- Suggestions to increase income by reopening/repurposing use of parish hall

Recommendations

- 1. Focus on efforts to bring people back to Mass and provide opportunities for connection and community
- 2. Explore potential for offering variety of Music, Missals in pews, different Mass times/locations for Liturgy
- 3. Consider offering use of Parish Center/Church Hall for income or parishioner meetings
- 4. PFC to focus on providing regular, more detailed information to parishioners both in written reports and meetings to better inform everyone about financial situation and decisions, and to clear up misconceptions.
