# A Message From Our Pastor...

Dear friends,

In these late days of October and early November, the weather is overcast and rainy. At times there is a thick fog. It seems as if death is in the air. Perhaps this is why



the Church saw it fitting to establish the celebration and commemoration of All Saints and All Souls in these first days of November.

In the creed, we profess "one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church". Such a Church can be understood in three ways. These ways are the Church Triumphant, Church Militant, and the Church Suffering. The Triumphant refers to the Saints in glory, who worship eternally the Lamb. The Church Militant refers to the Church here on earth. The militaristic imagery refers not to physical weapons, but spiritual ones. As Christians, we battle with the spiritual weapons of prayer, fasting, almsgiving, the spiritual works of mercy, and the corporal works of mercy. Finally, the Church Suffering refers to those souls who have died in God's friendship, but are preparing to see the Lord face to face. Traditionally we call this period of purification, "purgatory".

October 31st, November 1st and November 2nd are a three-day period of prayer in the life of the Catholic Church. November 1st is the feast of All Saints, also known as "All Hallows," which is a celebration of the Church Triumphant, that is, all of the saints who are in heavenly glory. The Vigil to All Saints, is also called "All Hallows Eve," now known as Halloween.

The day after All Saints, is a commemoration of All Souls, whereby we pray for the Church Suffering. Here we remember the faithful departed. A marvelous practice is to light a candle for the soul of the faithful departed.

As we prepare for these coming days, perhaps we could call to mind those saints which we have a particular devotion and ask their intercession, all the same, may we recall those souls of the faithful departed and pray that they would rest in peace and one day become a part of the Church Triumphant.

Relying upon the prayers of Mary, Mother of the Church, St. Peter, and indeed All the Saints, I am faithfully yours in Christ Jesus,
